Humbled and Exalted

*Today's Readings: Matthew 21:1–11; Isaiah 50:4–7; Psalm 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Philippians 2:6–11; Matthew 26:14–27:66.*

In the beautiful canticle from Philippians that comprises today's Second Reading, the dichotomy of humility and exaltation is highlighted. This is the tension of Palm Sunday: we welcome Christ as a king entering the grand city of Jerusalem, and then we proclaim the Passion account where our voices say, *Crucify him*. Christ Jesus, God and man, is exalted as both a human king and the Messiah, Savior of us all. We clutch our palms tightly and remind ourselves that he is indeed our king.

*Hosanna* is not just a welcome to the city. *Hosanna* is our Eucharistic proclamation in which we verbally wave our palms. Palm Sunday is the opportunity to raise our palm branches as we process into church, as we stand in awe and horror through the Passion account, and as we sing once again "Hosanna in the highest."

Throughout the world, whatever branches are in season are gathered and waved today: olive branches, palm branches, pussy willows, flowering bushes. Palm Sunday begins our last few days of Lent. As we approach the Sacred Paschal Triduum, today is our prelude to the glory that is Death-Resurrection. Palm and Passion weave a tension that highlights Christ Jesus, who humbled himself in obedience to the Father, to death on the Cross, and who, because of his Death is greatly exalted.

## Easter Triduum



Holy Thursday

A triduum is a three-day period of prayer, usually in preparation for an important feast or in celebration of that feast. When capitalized, **Triduum** most often refers to the Paschal Triduum (also known as the Holy Triduum or **Easter Triduum**), the final three days of **Lent** and **Holy Week**. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are: 1) Mass of the Lord's Supper 2) Good Friday of the Lord's Passion 3) Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord. **Holy Thursday** is the oldest of the celebrations of **Holy Week**. It is the day on which Catholics commemorate the institution of

three pillars of the Catholic Faith: the **Sacrament of Holy Communion**, the **priesthood**, and the **Mass**. During the Last Supper, Christ blessed the bread and wine with the very words that Catholic priests use today to consecrate the Body and Blood of Christ during the Mass and the Divine Liturgy. In telling His disciples to "Do this in remembrance of Me," **He instituted the Mass and made them the first priests**. On Holy Thursday, Chrism Mass is usually celebrated by the bishop who will consecrate the holy oils which are used throughout the year for the sacraments of **Baptism**, **Confirmation**, **Holy Orders**, and the **Anointing of the Sick**. It stresses the role of the **bishop** as a successor to the apostles. Except in very rare circumstances, there is only one Mass other than the Chrism Mass celebrated on Holy Thursday in each church: the Mass of the Lord's Supper, celebrated after sundown. 


