

Sunday, April 10, 2016 Pilgrims Bearing Witness

Today's Readings: Acts 5:27–32, 40b–41; Psalm 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12, 13; Revelation 5:11–14; John 21:1–19. Where have you seen the Risen Christ? The disciples encountered him again in Galilee while they were fishing. This story seems to have two parts. First, Jesus calls the disciples “children” and invites them to recast their nets to catch some fish. It seems that Jesus is reminding them that, though they are “fishers of people,” they still have a lot to learn.

Isn't this true for us too? Each year we cycle through the Scriptures as pilgrims on a journey to share at the feast of life. During this pilgrimage, we encounter Christ and are confronted with sin. This deepens our communion with the living God and opens our hearts to know the path of disci-

pliship. This, in turn, propels us to share the Good News.

The second scene recalls Peter's denial of Jesus. Three times Peter denied Jesus, and here, three times Peter confesses his love for Christ. This powerful image teaches us that no matter how badly we turn from Jesus, we are still loved. What does your love of the Lord look like? Sharing the Good News of the Resurrection isn't easy for any of us. Like the early disciples, we too will be faced with ridicule and persecution, and yet, we must bear witness to the truth. That's one reason we gather at Eucharist. There, we are strengthened in our faith so that we can go forth and witness the Paschal Mystery. Draw a timeline that shows your journey of faith and witness.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 11, 2016

St. Stanislaus

What do Sts. Stephen and Stanislaus have in common with Jesus? Each condemned corruption by political and religious leaders. Stephen and Stanislaus followed Jesus' example. When you encounter the living God, you must authentically proclaim God's justice and mercy. We need to pray for those who "work for the food that perishes" and we need to be mindful of our actions so that we follow Jesus, the Bread of Life. Take time to read a bit more about Stephen and Stanislaus. *Today's Readings: Acts 6:8–15; Psalm 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; John 6:22–29.*

Tuesday, April 12, 2016

Source of Life

Stephen did not waver in sharing the Good News, and such steadfastness led to his death. We learn in the Gospel that Jesus is the source of life. When we are obedient to his will, we will have life and never thirst. Too often, we find ourselves unsatisfied and seeking fulfillment when all we need to do is turn to the Lord. Who is the Stephen in your life? In the coming weeks, consider setting aside time to bake some bread, bless it at dinner, and discuss Jesus, our sustenance. *Today's Readings: Acts 7:51–8:1a; Psalm 31:3cd–4, 6 and 7 and 8a, 17 and 21ab; John 6:30–35.*

Wednesday, April 13, 2016

Persecution

Even in the midst of persecution, Jesus' disciples continue sharing the Gospel. Our world is filled with religious persecution from all directions. Much violence and war has been suffered because of the egos of individuals who hold differing creeds. Today pray for all those who suffer because of their religious beliefs and practices; let each of us remain faithful to the proclamation of the Gospel, even when it's difficult. *Today's Readings: Acts 8:1b–8; Psalm 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; John 6:35–40.*

Thursday, April 14, 2016

Catechesis

How did you come to know Christ? Was it through a parent, friend, or teacher? Jesus, the Bread of Heaven, says whoever believes will have eternal life. Today's story of Philip and the eunuch depicts how an encounter with the Risen Lord shapes belief. As Philip breaks open the Word, the eunuch is moved by the Spirit and requests to be baptized. We should follow Philip's example and share the Good News so that others may be nourished by Jesus. As part of sharing Easter joy, perhaps you would like to write a thank-you note to your parish catechists. *Today's Readings: Acts:8:26–40; Psalm 66:8–9, 16–17, 20; John 6:44–51.*

Friday, April 15, 2016

Eucharist

We have been reading through chapter 6 of John's account of the Gospel for several days. We have learned Jesus is the one who gives us bread; he is the Bread of Revelation. John portrays a Eucharistic Jesus. Every time we gather at Mass, we receive the Flesh and Blood of Christ in the sacrament. The Eucharist not only confirms our faith but challenges us to ongoing conversion. At the end of the liturgy, we are sent out to "tell the Good News." How have you become Eucharist for the world? *Today's Readings: Acts 9:1–20; Psalm 117:1bc, 2; John 6:52–59.*

Saturday, April 16, 2016

Go Out


In the Gospel, Peter asks Jesus, "To whom can we go?" Not all the disciples believed that Jesus was God's chosen one, but those who were convinced knew that Jesus brought life. After the Resurrection, we find Peter doing the Lord's works and proclaiming God's healing so that others may come to believe. He and the others went out sharing the Good News. What works does the Church do today to help others believe in Christ? Spend time praying for all those who do not believe in Christ. *Today's Readings: Acts 9:31–42; Psalm 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; John 6:60–69.*

Domingo, 10 de abril de 2016

Peregrinos y testigos

Lecturas del día: Hechos 5:27–32, 40b–41; Salmo 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12, 13; Apocalipsis 5:11–14; Juan 21:1–19. ¿Dónde ha visto usted a Cristo resucitado? Los discípulos lo vuelven a encontrar en Galilea, mientras pescaban. El relato tiene dos partes. En la primera, Jesús llama a los discípulos “hijos” y los invita a tirar sus redes para pescar. Es como si les recordara que, aunque son “pescadores de hombres”, necesitan aprender. ¿Vale eso para nosotros? Cada año peregrinamos por las Escrituras para compartir en el banquete de la vida. Al peregrinar encontramos a Cristo y confrontamos el pecado. Esto ahonda nuestra comunión con el Dios vivo y aprendemos el sendero del discipulado. Esto, a su vez, nos impulsa a propagar la Buena Nueva.

La segunda parte recuerda las negaciones de Pedro. Tres veces negó Pedro a Jesús y aquí Pedro confiesa su amor a Cristo tres veces. Esta poderosa imagen nos enseña que si nos alejamos de Jesús, él todavía nos ama. ¿Cómo es el amor que usted le tiene al Señor?

A ninguno de nosotros le resulta fácil compartir la Buena Nueva de la resurrección. Igual que a los discípulos primeros, nos aterran el ridículo y la persecución, pero debemos dar testimonio de la verdad. Por esto nos reunimos en la Eucaristía. Nuestra fe se fortalece para seguir adelante y ser testigos del misterio pascual. Le sugiero que dibuje una gráfica de su vida donde aparezca su camino de fe y de testigo.



LA SEMANA EN CASA

Lunes, 11 de abril de 2016

San Estanislao

¿Qué tienen en común san Esteban y san Estanislao con Jesús? Cada uno condenó la corrupción de los líderes políticos y religiosos. Esteban y Estanislao siguieron el ejemplo de Jesús. Al encontrarse usted con el Dios vivo, debe proclamar auténticamente la justicia y la misericordia. Necesitamos orar por los que “trabajan por el alimento que perece” y ponderar nuestros actos para poder seguir a Jesús, el Pan de Vida. Tómese tiempo para leer un poco sobre Esteban y Estanislao. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 6:8–15; Salmo 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; Juan 6:22–29.*

Martes, 12 de abril de 2016

Fuente de vida

Esteban nunca pospuso el anuncio de la Buena Nueva, y su diligencia lo llevó al martirio. En el evangelio, aprendemos que Jesús es la fuente de la vida. Cuando lo obedecemos nos alcanza la vida y nunca sufrimos de sed. Con frecuencia, nos sentimos insatisfechos y faltos de plenitud, cuando lo que necesitamos en realidad es volvernos al Señor. ¿Quién ha sido Esteban en la vida de usted? En las semanas que vienen, reserve tiempo para hornear algún pan, bendecirlo a la hora de la comida y conversar sobre Jesús, sustento nuestro. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 7:51–8:1a; Salmo 31:3cd–4, 6 y 7 y 8a, 17 y 21ab; Juan 6:30–35.*

Miércoles, 13 de abril de 2016

Persecución

Incluso perseguidos, los discípulos de Jesús proclaman el Evangelio. En nuestro mundo, hay persecuciones religiosas por todas partes. Padecemos violencia y guerra por los egos de individuos que tienen credos diferentes. Este día, ore por los que son perseguidos debido a sus prácticas y creencias religiosas; pida que cada uno de nosotros sea fiel a proclamar el Evangelio, incluso en las dificultades. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 8:1b–8; Salmo 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; Juan 6:35–40.*



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Jueves, 14 de abril de 2016

Catequesis

El relato de Felipe y el eunuco describe cómo un encuentro con el Señor resucitado forma la fe. Conforme Felipe explica la Palabra, el eunuco es motivado por el Espíritu hasta pedir ser bautizado. Podemos seguir su ejemplo y compartir la Buena Nueva para que llegue a otros el alimento de Jesús. Al compartir la alegría pascual, usted puede escribir una nota de agradecimiento a los catequistas de su parroquia. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 8:26–40; Salmo 66:8–9, 16–17, 20; Juan 6:44–51.*

Viernes, 15 de abril de 2016

Eucaristía

Por varios días, hemos estado leyendo el capítulo sexto del Evangelio según san Juan. Hemos escuchado que Jesús es el que nos da pan; él es el Pan revelado. Juan describe un Jesús eucarístico. Cada vez que nos reunimos para la misa, recibimos sacramentalmente la Carne y la Sangre de Cristo. La Eucaristía no sólo confirma nuestra fe, sino que nos reta a una continua conversión. Al final de la liturgia, somos enviados a “anunciar la Buena Nueva”. ¿Cómo se puede transformar usted, en alimento para el mundo? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 9:1–20; Salmo 117:1bc, 2; Juan 6:52–59.*

Sábado, 16 de abril de 2016

Salgan

“¿Señor, ¿a quién iremos?”. No todos los discípulos creían que Jesús era el Elegido de Dios, pero los que sí, sabían que Jesús aporta vida. Después de la resurrección, encontramos a Pedro haciendo las obras del Señor y proclamando la salud de Dios para que todos pudieran creer. Él y los demás salieron a compartir la Buena Nueva. ¿Qué es lo que hace la Iglesia de hoy para ayudar a que otros crean en Cristo? Dedique algún tiempo a orar por los que no creen en Cristo. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 9:31–42; Salmo 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; Juan 6:60–69.*


