

SUBJECT: **New Movie Concerning the Church Sex Abuse Scandal**

“Spotlight” is a major motion picture opening in select markets on November 6, 2015 that tells the story of how the Boston Globe newspaper’s Spotlight Investigative Unit uncovered the child sex abuse scandal in the Archdiocese of Boston in 2002. It will go into limited release on November 6, 2015 and national release on November 20, 2015.

Vatican Radio has praised the film as “honest” and “compelling,” saying that the Globe’s coverage of the scandal – for which it won a Pulitzer Prize – helped the Church in the United States “to accept fully the sin, to admit it publicly and to pay the consequences.” After premiering at the Venice Film Festival, “Spotlight” received excellent reviews and is being considered a leading Oscar candidate.

If anything, the film reminds us that the sex abuse scandal is not something to “put behind us,” but instead is something we need to keep in front of us at all times so we can stay vigilant and make sure never happens again.

It is possible the film may open up old wounds. If anyone approaches you and says they were abused by clergy or anyone else, encourage them to go directly to the police and invite them to seek pastoral counseling through the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Anne McGuire: 1-800-321-5220.

If you are approached by parishioners with questions about how the Church, and specifically this diocese, have responded to the abuse crisis, let them know that the protection of children and young people is our highest priority and share with them a copy of the policies and procedures (attached) that we carry out to keep children protected. These policies have been in place for more than a decade and include:

- **A zero tolerance policy.** No one with a credible allegation of child abuse may function in ministry in the Diocese of Monterey.
- **Fingerprinting and background checks.** Anyone who works with children and young people in the diocese has to be fingerprinted and receive a background check. This includes clergy, religious, staff and volunteers. Nearly 20,000 staff and volunteers have received a criminal background check.
- **Safe Environment Programs.** All children and teens in Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs annually participate in a safe environment program to help promote awareness and teach them about safe adults, safe contact and who to turn to for help when needed.
- **Shield the Vulnerable.** In addition to fingerprinting, all diocesan staff and volunteers who work with children are required to receive training on how to identify and protect children from abuse as well as how to fulfill their responsibilities as Mandated Reporters who are required to inform authorities about suspected child abuse.

I would appreciate it if you could make this available to your parishioners in the church or school office.

Sacristan Ministry



Simply put and from “ancient times”, sacristans are charged with care of the sacristy, the church and its contents. Here at Elizabeth Ann Seton, the sacristans set up the mass for the priest. That involves placing items on the credence table such as the Chalice, patens, cups, purifiers and other things needed for the mass.


Sacristans make sure the Missals and other books used in the mass are in their proper place. Sacristans take care of the candles, lights and batteries for the sound system. They make sure that altar servers, Eucharistic ministers and others are in place for the mass.

After mass, sacristans purify and wash vessels as needed and may lock up the church if so required. Some sacristans serve for funerals as well. In short, Sacristans are charged with making the mass “work”. Being a sacristan is a very rewarding ministry. Personally, I experience closeness to our Lord in preparing the altar for mass and I enjoy doing this ministry for our parish. Please consider being a sacristan. We especially need sacristans for the 5:30 Saturday mass. You don’t need to step in “cold”, we will train you.

LA PÁGINA DE CATECISMO PARA ADULTOS

De vez en cuando, Capítulos del Compendio del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica se presentarán aquí como parte de catequesis para adultos. Como referencia, los números en cursiva se refieren a los números en el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica.

EL CAMINO DE LA ORACIÓN

559. ¿Hay en la Iglesia diversos caminos de oración?

2663 En la Iglesia hay diversos caminos de oración, según los diversos contextos históricos, sociales y culturales. Corresponde al Magisterio discernir la fidelidad de estos caminos a la tradición de la fe apostólica, y compete a los pastores y catequistas explicar su sentido, que se refiere siempre a Jesucristo.

560. ¿Cuál es el camino de nuestra oración?

2664
2680-2681 El camino de nuestra oración es Cristo, porque ésta se dirige a Dios nuestro Padre pero llega a Él sólo si, al menos implícitamente, oramos en el Nombre de Jesús. Su humanidad es, pues, la única vía por la que el Espíritu Santo nos enseña a orar a Dios nuestro Padre. Por esto las oraciones litúrgicas concluyen con la fórmula: «Por Jesucristo nuestro Señor».

561. ¿Cuál es el papel del Espíritu Santo en la oración?

2670-2672
2680-2681 Puesto que el Espíritu Santo es el Maestro interior de la oración cristiana y «nosotros no sabemos pedir como conviene» (*Rm* 8, 26), la Iglesia nos exhorta a invocarlo e implorarlo en toda ocasión: «¡Ven, Espíritu Santo!».

562. ¿En qué sentido es mariana la oración cristiana?

2673-2679
2682 En virtud de la singular cooperación de María con la acción del Espíritu Santo, la Iglesia ama rezar a María y orar con María, la orante perfecta, para alabar e invocar con Ella al Señor. Pues María, en efecto, nos «muestra el camino» que es su Hijo, el único Mediador.

563. ¿Cómo reza la Iglesia a María?

2676-2678
2682 La Iglesia reza a María, ante todo, con el *Ave María*, oración con la que la Iglesia pide la intercesión de la Virgen. Otras oraciones marianas son el *Rosario*, el himno *Acáthistos*, la *Paraclisis*, los himnos y cánticos de las diversas tradiciones cristianas.

EL COMBATE DE LA ORACIÓN

572. ¿Por qué la oración es un combate?

2725 La oración es un don de la gracia, pero presupone siempre una respuesta decidida por nuestra parte, pues el que ora combate contra sí mismo, contra el ambiente y, sobre todo, contra el Tentador, que hace todo lo posible para apartarlo de la oración. El combate de la oración es inseparable del progreso en la vida espiritual: se ora como se vive, porque se vive como se ora.

573. ¿Cuáles son las objeciones a la oración?

2726-2728
2752-2753 Además de los conceptos erróneos sobre la

oración, muchos piensan que no tienen tiempo para orar o que es inútil orar. Quienes oran pueden desalentarse frente a las dificultades o los aparentes fracasos. Para vencer estos obstáculos son necesarias la humildad, la confianza y la perseverancia.

574. ¿Cuáles son las dificultades para la oración?

2729-2733
2754-2755 La dificultad habitual para la oración es la *distracción*, que separa de la atención a Dios, y puede incluso descubrir aquello a lo que realmente estamos apegados. Nuestro corazón debe entonces volverse a Dios con humildad. A menudo la oración se ve dificultada por la *sequedad*, cuya superación permite adherirse en la fe al Señor incluso sin consuelo sensible. La *acedía* es una forma de pereza espiritual, debida al relajamiento de la vigilancia y al descuido de la custodia del corazón.

575. ¿Cómo fortalecer nuestra confianza filial?


2734-2741
2756 La confianza filial se pone a prueba cuando pensamos que no somos escuchados. Debemos preguntarnos, entonces, si Dios es para nosotros un Padre cuya voluntad deseamos cumplir, o más bien un simple medio para obtener lo que queremos. Si nuestra oración se une a la de Jesús, sabemos que Él nos concede mucho más que este o aquel don, pues recibimos al Espíritu Santo, que transforma nuestro corazón.

576. ¿Es posible orar en todo momento?

2742-2745
2757 Orar es siempre posible, pues el tiempo del cristiano es el tiempo de Cristo resucitado, que está con nosotros «todos los días» (*Mt* 28, 20). Oración y vida cristiana son, por ello, inseparables.
«Es posible, incluso en el mercado o en un paseo solitario, hacer una frecuente y fervorosa oración. Sentados en vuestra tienda, comprando o vendiendo, o incluso haciendo la cocina» (San Juan Crisóstomo).

577. ¿Cuál es la oración de la Hora de Jesús?

2604
2746-2751
2758 Se llama la oración de la *Hora de Jesús* a la oración sacerdotal de Éste en la Última Cena. Jesús, Sumo Sacerdote de la Nueva Alianza, dirige su oración al Padre cuando llega la *Hora* de su «paso» a Dios, la *Hora* de su sacrificio.

Restorative Partners "Healing all those impacted by crime."


