

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


Sunday, May 1, 2016
Keep My Word

Today's Readings: Acts 15:1–2, 22–29; Psalm 67:2–3, 5, 6, 8; Revelation 21:10–14, 22–23; John 14:23–29. The message this Sunday continues the theme from last week and begins to prepare us for the celebration of the Ascension. Again, this story appears before the Passion, but we see it now in light of the Resurrection and the promises of Christ.

This Gospel can be looked at in three sections. In the first section, Jesus asserts that those who love him will keep his Word. What is his Word? If we have fallen in love with Christ, how can we not love like him? We must heed his actions and his teaching. In the second part of the passage, Jesus foretells the coming of the Holy Spirit who will teach us and guide us on the path to remain faithful to the Word.

We received the Holy Spirit in Baptism and, lovingly, the Spirit continues to draw us into the heart of Christ. The third section promises us Christ's peace, which will remove all fear so that we can go forth into the world and witness to the love of Christ.

The love that enveloped us in Baptism is a radical love that transforms our hearts to see the world through a new lens. We are called to attend to the poor, the sick, the outcasts. Who are these children of God in your community? Are you aware that God dwells within you? How does God's Word call you to live? Spend some time with the word *love* this week and create a piece of art that depicts its meaning and your relationship with Christ.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 2, 2016

Memorial of St. Athanasius

Today, the Church remembers St. Athanasius, who fought against the Arian heresy to uphold the teaching that Christ was fully human and fully divine. He suffered many hardships in his ministry, but he persevered and remained faithful to Christ. You might want to reflect today on the teachings in the Nicene Creed. *Today's Readings: Acts 16:11–15; Psalm 149:1b–2, 3–4, 5–6a and 9b; John 15:26–16:4a.*

Tuesday, May 3, 2016

Feast of Sts. Philip and James

The Scriptures do not tell us much about James the Lesser except that he was called by Jesus to be among the Twelve. Philip is mentioned a few times, and we know from today's Gospel that it took him a while to realize who Jesus was. Do you continue to strive to realize who Jesus is? What does Jesus mean to you? *Today's Readings: I Corinthians 15:1–8; Psalm 19:2–3, 4–5; John 14:6–14.*

Wednesday, May 4, 2016

Our Guide

As we approach the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, the Gospel reminds us that the Holy Spirit will guide our steps until Jesus returns in glory. Allow the Spirit to breathe life into you. In the coming days, find a prayer or hymn to the Holy Spirit, and pray it. *Today's Readings: Acts 17:15, 22–18:1; Psalm 148:1–2, 11–12, 13, 14; John 16:12–15.*

Thursday, May 5, 2016

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

We are witnesses to the Paschal Mystery. Like the Apostles, Jesus has blessed us and sent us on mission to share the Gospel to the ends of the earth. He promises to send his Spirit upon us to guide us in this great mission. Jesus remains with his Church in the power of the Holy Spirit. Read over

today's Gospel, pausing and meditating on the phrase, "And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy." *Today's Readings: Acts 1:1–11; Psalm 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Ephesians 1:17–23 or Hebrews 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Luke 24:46–53.*

Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter

The Gospel reveals that Jesus is going away but will return. We know that Jesus ascends into heaven and will return on that final day to reign in glory. That final day seems far off, but even now, we should be living in a manner that prepares us for Jesus' Second Coming. Since Aquila and Priscilla are mentioned in the First Reading, take some time to research their story. *Today's Readings: Acts 18:1–8; Psalm 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; John 16:16–20.*

Friday, May 6, 2016

Squabble

Though the Jewish community rose up against Paul, we see in the First Reading that the political leader saw this as a squabble over titles and doctrines. We still squabble over titles and doctrines. Let us pray for peace within the Church and that the Holy Spirit remain our guide. *Today's Readings: Acts 18:9–18; Psalm 47:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 16:20–23.*


Saturday, May 7, 2016

Study

By study and knowledge of Scripture, Apollos attests that Jesus is the Christ. The Word of God transformed his heart and inspired him to share the news that Jesus is Lord. Our psalm today invites us to give praise for this truth. Consider how the study of Scripture has helped you develop a deeper love for Christ. Does the proclamation of the Word at Mass rouse your heart and lead you, like Apollos, to share the Word? Today begins the Novena to the Holy Spirit as we approach Pentecost. Find this prayer and share it with friends and family as the Church calls upon the Spirit. *Today's Readings: Acts 18:23–28; Psalm 47:2–3, 8–9, 10; John 16:23b–28.*

Por Cristo nuestro Señor. Amén.


Domingo, 1 de mayo de 2016
Guarden mi palabra

Lecturas del día: Hechos 15:1–2, 22–29; Salmo 67:2–3, 5, 6, 8; Apocalipsis 21:10–14, 22–23; Juan 14:23–29. El mensaje dominical continúa el tema de la semana pasada, pues nos vamos preparando a celebrar la Ascensión. De nuevo, el relato se ubica antes de la pasión, pero lo leemos ya a la luz de la resurrección y de las promesas de Cristo.

El evangelio tiene tres secciones. En la primera, Jesús asegura que los que lo aman guardarán su palabra. ¿Qué es esto? Si estamos enamorados de Cristo, ¿cómo no vamos a amarlo? Debemos obedecer sus acciones y sus enseñanzas. En la segunda parte del pasaje, Jesús anticipa la venida del Espíritu Santo, quien nos enseñará y nos guiará en el camino para mantenernos fieles a la palabra. En el bautismo, recibi-

mos al Espíritu Santo, y, amorosamente, nos sigue conduciendo hasta el corazón de Cristo. En la tercera sección, Cristo nos promete su paz, paz que quitará todo miedo, para caminar en el mundo y testificar el amor de Cristo.

El amor que nos envolvió en el bautismo es un amor radical que transforma nuestro corazón para ver el mundo con ojos nuevos. ¿Acaso no sentimos esa llamada urgente a cuidar del pobre, los enfermos y los excluidos? ¿No es verdad que usted vive muy consciente de que Dios habita en usted? ¿Qué transformación lo invita a hacer la palabra de Dios, hoy? En la semana, medite en la palabra amor y cree algo artístico que exprese su significado y su relación con Cristo.

Lunes, 2 de mayo de 2016

San Atanasio

La Iglesia recuerda a san Atanasio, obispo de Alejandría. Peleó contra la herejía arriana, sosteniendo que Cristo era plenamente humano y plenamente divino. Sufrió muchas dificultades en su ministerio, pero perseveró y se mantuvo fiel a Cristo. Hoy, usted puede reflexionar en las enseñanzas del Credo Niceno. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 16:11–15; Salmo 149:1b–2, 3–4, 5–6a y 9b; Juan 15:26—16:4a.*

Martes, 3 de mayo de 2016

Felipe y Santiago, Apóstoles

Las Escrituras no cuentan mucho de Santiago el Menor, excepto que fue llamado por Jesús para formar parte de los Doce. Felipe es mencionado unas cuantas veces, y conocemos por el evangelio de hoy, que le tomó tiempo darse cuenta de quién era Jesús. ¿Tiene usted las mismas dificultades? ¿Quién es Jesús para usted? *Lecturas del día: 1 Corintios 15:1–8; Salmo 19:2–3, 4–5; Juan 14:6–14.*

Miércoles, 4 de mayo de 2016

Nuestro Guía

Al acercarnos a celebrar la Ascensión del Señor, el evangelio nos recuerda que el Espíritu Santo guiará nuestros pasos hasta que Jesús regrese en gloria. Permita que sea el Espíritu quien aliente la vida en usted. En los próximos días, localice una oración o un himno al Espíritu Santo y ore con ello. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 17:15, 22—18:1; Salmo 148:1–2, 11–12, 13, 14; Juan 16:12–15.*

Jueves, 5 de mayo de 2016

La Ascensión del Señor

Somos testigos del misterio pascual. Igual que a los apóstoles, Jesús nos bendice y nos envía en misión a compartir el Evangelio hasta los confines de la tierra. Promete enviarnos su Espíritu sobre nosotros para guiarnos en esta gran misión.

Jesús permanece con su Iglesia con la fuerza del Espíritu Santo. Vuelva a leer el evangelio del día, pausada y meditativamente. Deténgase en la frase “ellos se postraron ante Él y se volvieron a Jerusalén muy contentos”. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:1–11; Salmo 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Efesios 1:17–23 o Hebreos 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Lucas 24:46–53.*

Jueves, 5 de mayo de 2016

El evangelio cuenta que Jesús se aleja pero que retornará. Sabemos que Jesús asciende al cielo y que retornará el día final para reinar en gloria. El día final parece muy, muy lejano, pero ahora mismo, debemos vivir preparándonos a la segunda venida de Jesús. Aquila y Priscila son mencionados en los Hechos, investigue algo más sobre ellos. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 18:1–8; Salmo 98:1, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; Juan 16:16–20.*

Viernes, 6 de mayo de 2016

Disputas

Cuando la comunidad judía se levantó contra Pablo, podemos ver en los Hechos que el líder político miró aquello como una disputa sobre títulos y doctrinas, no un asunto legal. Hoy seguimos disputando sobre títulos y doctrinas. Oremos por la paz en la Iglesia y porque el Espíritu Santo nos siga guiando. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 18:9–18; Salmo 47:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; Juan 16:20–23.*

Sábado, 7 de mayo de 2016

Estudio

Por sus estudios y conocimientos de las Escrituras, Apolo podía testificar que Jesús es el Cristo. La palabra de Dios transformó su corazón y lo inspiró para compartir la novedad de que Jesús es Señor. ¿La proclamación de la palabra en la misa, le eleva el corazón y lo guía, como a Apolo, a compartir la palabra? Hoy inicia la novena al Espíritu Santo que culmina en Pentecostés. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 18:23–28; Salmo 47:2–3, 8–9, 10; Juan 16:23b–28.*
