He then invites every faithful to action for the benefit of the whole Mystical Body of Christ, the Church.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are all saints-in-the-making. Conversion is a lifetime process. Every day God gives us opportunities to choose the good. Today I present to you two requests. Please choose one.

Last week I received two letters from two of our brothers in Christ who are in prison. They are asking for help.

1. Robert Raymond from Soledad Prison

Robert chose to write our parish because his Mom's name was the same as our patroness', Elizabeth Anne. Just seeing her name brought him tons of old, great childhood memories. He is working on his "9th Narcotics Anonymous Step," making amends to those he has wronged. He does not seek money. He only needs postage stamps so that he can write and send 30 to 40 letters of amends. The prison gives indigent inmates only five stamped envelopes every month. At that rate, it will take him eight months to complete his "9th step." While he is not in a hurry, he likes to finish it sooner. If you wish to help Robert, please give to the parish office your sealed envelope and we'll mail it for you.

2. Richard Hibbard from California Men's Colony (CMC) in San Luis Obispo

Richard is a Catholic prisoner in the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) at CMC, SLO. They have a beautiful Catholic chapel at prison but is often closed because there are very little religious programs and volunteers available to run any programs. Because of this, Catholic prisoners go to the Protestant chapel to seek spiritual refuge and religious education. Richard intends to open a line of communication with our parish hoping to spark interest among potential volunteers to facilitate Catholic Bible Studies, Restorative Justice, Catholic Catechism Studies and the like. Catholic chaplain Fr. Farao asked Catholic inmates like Richard to pray for volunteers. Fr. Farao is willing to guide any volunteers through CDCR's application process. 

Eucharistic Minister



It is a privilege and a blessing to serve as a Eucharistic Minister. You don't have to thank me.

I hear some form of this complement from these dedicated servers of the Eucharist. Some of us have served for many years; others are just starting to serve. Some are 18 years old, while others are in their 80's.

One checks in at the sacristy with the head of the ministry about five minutes before Mass to say a prayer with Father Joey. Then we process in to Mass with Father and behind the lectors. We gather in a horseshoe in front of the altar and bow. We go back to our seats and wait until the Kiss of Peace when we then proceed to the credence table to wash hands. Father will distribute the wine cups and hosts to each minister. That is when the ministers go to their stations; one Host and one wine will deliver the Eucharist to those who cannot walk. After this each minister presents the wine and host to the rest of the parishioners. The wine cups are to be put onto the credence table. We then bow at the front of the altar and go back to our seats.


One will be trained before you become a Eucharistic Minister. Once a year, Father Joey will lead us in prayer and reflection. Also we will have a question and answer session.

DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS




Originally an Aztec holiday, Día de Muertos is celebrated throughout Mexico and acknowledged by cultures around the world. It is a day where families pray for and remember their friends and family members who have died, and to help support their spiritual journey.

When the Spaniards colonized Mexico in the 16th century, the celebration of El Día de Muertos was moved from its celebration in August to coincide with the Roman Catholic calendar's Allhallowtide triduum between October 31 and November 2. Thus there are many Christian overtones in the celebrations of the Day of the Dead.

Generally on the first day of Día de Muertos, October 31, children made a children's altar to invite the angelitos, spirits of the dead children, to come back for a visit. November 1, All Saints Day, the adult spirits come to visit. On November 2, All Soul's Day, families go to the cemeteries to decorate the graves and tombs of their relatives. Families erect altars to honor their loved ones and include photos of their loved ones, angels, and sometimes crucifixes.

Cempasuchil known as marigolds, the flowers of the dead, seem to glow in the dark and light the path and remind us of the impermanence of life; pan de muertos, bread for the dead, and other foods like mole, tamales, or hot chocolate, whatever the deceased enjoyed is left on the altar for the essence and scent to be enjoyed by the dead; sugar skulls and cardboard skeletons are reminders of death and La Catrina; tissue paper decorations; fruits and nuts; incense and other traditional foods and decorations are also used in this three day fiesta. Altars may be lit with candles representing light, faith, and hope are used to light the way. Water is the last important element of the altar quenching the thirst of our loved ones, but also representing life and purity.

Gloria Gomez and Claudia Castorena, American immigrants from Mexico, had each witnessed and experienced an early life of poverty and struggle. Despite these hardships, they found ways to reach out to others and to consecrate their lives to God.

After living in the United States for 20 years, a spiritual friendship began to bloom when they met while working with their respective youth groups. Both sensed the Lord beckoning them to feed the hungry and care for the poor. On Christmas Day 1989, they served their first meal and founded *Martha's Village and Kitchen*.

Many years later, Gloria and Claudia felt called by the Lord to minister to the needy in the eastern Coachella Valley. They opened *Galilee Center* in July 2010, which presently provides for the needs of more than 700 families.


