RE: Our Lady of Guadalupe Celebration 2020

Dear Hispanic Parishioners, Parents and Friends:

God's Love and Peace be with you all!

We love our Lady of Guadalupe very much, and every year we celebrate it with great festivity! Unfortunately, due to the pandemic this year and our county's revert to the "purple level" last November 16," we will celebrate her fiesta in a much simpler way. This does not mean that we love her less. It does not also mean that we believe in God less. Our Blessed Mother Mary would agree that for this year all her children must celebrate her feast in the safest manner possible. No mother would allow her children to be in danger and get sick with the deadly combination of flu and COVID-19. Because of this, as your pastor and president of the Guadalupanas, with the safety directives of Bishop Garcia as a guide, and following the county and the State rules, our parish celebration will be done as follows:

1. The novena will start on Wednesday evening of December 2 and end on Thursday evening of December 10.
2. We will celebrate the Feast Day Mass in the afternoon (before dark) of December 11 and not December 12 (see number 4 below and number 10 on the next page).
3. All novenas will be done in the safety of your own home and not inside the church building. Your family will prepare your home altar for our Lady of Guadalupe. Using any prayer guide you have, the father and the mother (or head of the household, or elder) will lead the novena. The children should join this prayer. Your family may offer flowers. After the novena, your family concludes with your usual dinner, but this time the meal is in honor of our Lady of Guadalupe. If you like, you may post a photo of your family celebration on FaceBook.
4. There will be only one (1) Feast Day Mass, and it will be on December 11, Friday, at 4:30 pm. It will be a Drive-In Mass in the big parking area. Due to the expected high number of in-person attendees, I strictly require a confirmed reservation for the 44 parking spaces. Please call Heather at 1 (805) 235-8803 or email her at seaschurchlo@gmail.com. If you fail to reserve, and you arrive with no parking space available, you have to park on Palisades Avenue.
5. At this Feast Day Mass, please bring your roses. During the Offertory, you will offer roses as a family, walk to the altar, one vehicle at a time,



RE: Celebración de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe 2020




Estimados feligreses, padres y amigos hispanos:

¡El Amor y la Paz de Dios sean con todos ustedes!


¡Amamos mucho a nuestra Señora de Guadalupe y cada año la celebramos con gran festividad! Desafortunadamente, debido a la pandemia de este año y nuestro condado volvió al "nivel púrpura" el pasado 16 de Noviembre," celebraremos su fiesta de una manera mucho más sencilla. Esto no significa que la amemos menos. Tampoco significa que creemos menos en Dios. Nuestra Santísima Madre María estaría de acuerdo en que para este año todos sus hijos deben celebrar su fiesta de la manera más segura posible. Ninguna madre permitiría que sus hijos estuvieran en peligro y se enfermaran de la mortal combinación de gripe y COVID-19. Por eso, como su párroco y presidente de las Guadalupanas, con las directivas de seguridad del Obispo García como guía, y siguiendo las reglas del condado y del Estado, nuestra celebración parroquial se realizará de la siguiente manera:

1. La novena comenzará el Miércoles 2 de Diciembre por la noche y terminará el Jueves 10 de Diciembre por la noche.
2. Celebraremos su Misa de Fiesta por la tarde (antes del anochecer) el 11 de Diciembre y no el 12 de Diciembre (ver los números 4 y 9 a continuación).
3. Todas las novenas se realizarán en la seguridad de su hogar y no dentro del edificio de la iglesia. Su familia preparará el altar de su casa para Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Usando cualquier guía de oración que tenga, el padre y la madre (o el jefe de familia o el anciano) dirigirán la novena. Los niños deben unirse a esta oración. Su familia puede ofrecer flores. Después de la novena, su familia concluye con su cena habitual, pero esta vez la comida es en honor a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Si lo desea, puede publicar una foto de su celebración familiar en FaceBook.
4. Habrà solo una, (1) Misa de Fiesta, y será el Viernes 11 de Diciembre a las 4:30 pm. Será una Misa en el estacionamiento. Debido al alto número esperado de asistentes en persona, requiero estrictamente una reservación confirmada para los 44 espacios. Llame a Heather al 1 (805) 235-8803 o envíe un correo electrónico a seaschurchlo@gmail.com. Si no hace la reservación y llega sin espacio disponible, debe estacionarse en Palisades Avenue.
5. En esta Misa de Fiesta, por favor traiga sus rosas. Durante el Ofertorio, puede ofrecer sus rosas en familia, caminar

<p>starting from the passengers of the vehicle nearest the entrance.</p> <p>6. On early Saturday morning of December 12, parents and children will sing your <u>Mañanita to our Lady of Guadalupe at your home altar</u>, concluding it with your family breakfast.</p> <p>7. <u>On December 12, 6 pm, parents will lead the Holy Rosary at your own home.</u> Your children should pray with you. The prayer intentions are:</p> <p>(1) For the good health and protection from the deadly flu and COVID-19 of your family & parish community. (2) For the intentions of Pope Francis. (3) For the conversion of sinners and peace in the world.</p> <p>After the praying of the Holy Rosary, your family may celebrate a festive dinner in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe.</p> <p>8. For your health and safety, please avoid placing your family at high risk of getting sick by combining several family celebrations in one home. The decision is yours.</p> <p>9. Because of safety reasons, health issues of ministers and volunteers, logistics, and financial difficulties, we will NOT be able to do our following traditional activities: early morning Mañanita, procession with Rosary before Mass, community reception after Mass, and all activities within the church building.</p> <p>10. We cannot celebrate the Feast Day Mass on the Saturday morning of December 12 because most of you are at work. We cannot celebrate it on late afternoon of December 12 because Church Liturgy after 3:00 pm allows us to celebrate only the Third Sunday of Advent. The Feast Day Mass on the late afternoon of December 11 is called "Vigil." As the Sunday Mass can be celebrated on a Saturday Vigil, so does our Guadalupe Fiesta Mass can be celebrated on the late afternoon of the preceeding day.</p> <p>Though our celebration this year is externally simpler, Jesus our Divine Mercy and His mother, our Lady of Guadalupe, gives more importance not to the externalities and tradition but to what is in our hearts. May God and our Blessed Mother find Love in our hearts. They definitely appreciate more Love of family and of one another.</p> <p>Thank you all for your understanding. 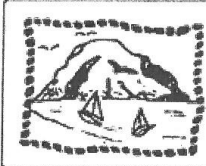
