

ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME LAUDATO SI'

"Praise be to you, my Lord."

"LAUDATO SI", mi" Signore" - "Praise be to you, my Lord." These are the words that open Pope Francis' encyclical on ecology and care for God's creation. These words, quoting St. Francis of Assisi's beautiful canticle, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

Pope Francis' encyclical letter Laudato Si' was released in June 2015. Five years later, in 2020, Pope Francis invited all Catholics and people of good will to celebrate its fifth anniversary by protecting families and future generations through action to care for our common home. Here are themes that Pope Francis highlighted in Laudato Si' which require our urgent response today.

- · A Moral and Spiritual Challenge. The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion—to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.
- . Care for God's Creation. God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.
- . We are All Connected. We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.
- . Impact on the Poor. People in poverty have contributed least to climate change, yet they are disproportionately impacted by it. As a result of excessive use of natural resource by wealthy nations, those who are poor experience pollution, lack of access to clean water, hunger, and
- . Called to Solidarity. We are one human family and have a shared responsibility for others and for creation. Wealthy countries have a responsibility to reduce consumption of non-renewal resources and should help poorer nations develop in sustainable ways.
- . Technological and economic development must serve human beings and enhance human dignity, instead of creating an economy of exclusion, so that all people have access to what is needed for authentic human development.
- . Supporting Life, Protecting Creation. Concern for nature is incompatible with failure to protect vulnerable human beings, such as unborn children, people with disabilities, or victims of human trafficking.
- . A Time to Act. Pope Francis calls for a change in lifestyle and consumption. We can make important changes as individuals, families, and communities, and as civil and political leaders.
- . Hope and Joy. "Injustice is not invincible" (no. 74) and we act knowing that we seek to live out God's vision of renewed relationships with God, ourselves, one another, and creation.

How You Can Respond

Each of us are called to take concrete steps - from reducing consumption to working for political change - to better care for creation. Here are some ideas.

- 1. Become more aware of our connectedness. Care for one another and creation includes understanding that "everything is connected" (no. 91) and that the economy, politics, community involvement, and technology all affect the future of the planet and humankind. How can we become more aware of our connectedness?
- 2. Changes to lifestyle and consumption habits can make a big difference. For example, get a re-usable water bottle, take shorter showers, walk, bike or take public transportation instead of driving, recycle, compost food waste, and buy energy efficient appliances.
- 3. Make changes institutionally at your parish, school, or workplace. For example, start recycling and composting, use washable dinnerware in cafeterias, share electronically instead of printing, do an energy audit, and install solar panels.
- 4. Support local efforts to solve environmental problems. Community groups around the country are working to make city, county, and state-wide changes that can make a big difference. Find out what is going on locally and get involved.
- 5. Contact your members of Congress to share Pope Francis' message and urge action to address climate change.

SOBRE EL CUIDADO DE LA CASA COMÚN LAUDATO SI'

"Alabado seas, mi Señor."

"Laudato sí", mi" Signore" – "Alabado seas, mi Señor". Estas son las palabras que abren la encíclica del papa Francisco sobre la ecología y el cuidado de la creación de Dios. Estas palabras, que citan el hermoso cántico de san Francisco de Asís, nos recuerdan que nuestra casa común es como una hermana con quien compartimos nuestra vida y una hermosa madre que abre sus brazos para acogernos.

La carta encíclica <u>Loudato Si</u> del papa Francisco se publicó en junio de 2015. Cinco años después, en 2020, el papa Francisco invitó a todos los católicos y personas de buena voluntad a celebrar su quinto aniversario protegiendo a las familias y las generaciones futuras a través de la acción para cuidar nuestra casa común. He aquí los temas que el papa Francisco destacó en *Laudato Si* que requieren nuestra respuesta urgente hoy.

- Un desafío moral y espiritual. La crisis ecológica, escribe el papa Francisco, es una invocación a una profunda conversión interior: a renovar nuestras relaciones con Dios, entre nosotros y con el mundo creado.
- Cuidado de la creación de Dios. Dios creó el mundo y lo confió a nosotros como un don. Ahora tenemos la responsabilidad de cuidar y proteger a él y a todas las personas, que son parte de la creación. Proteger la dignidad humana está fuertemente ligado a cuidar de la creación.
- Todos estamos conectados. Estamos conectados con el resto de la familia humana, con el mundo creado, y con los que vendrán después de nosotros en las generaciones futuras.
- Impacto en los pobres. Las personas en situación de pobreza son las que menos han contribuido al
 cambio climático, y sin embargo se ven desproporcionadamente impactadas por este. Como
 resultado del uso excesivo de los recursos naturales por los países ricos, los pobres sufren
 contaminación, falta de acceso al agua potable, hambre y otros padecimientos.
- Llamados a la solidaridad. Somos una sola familia humana y tenemos una responsabilidad compartida por los demás y por la creación. Los países ricos tienen la responsabilidad de reducir el consumo de recursos no renovables y deben ayudar a las naciones más pobres a desarrollarse de manera sostenible.
- El desarrollo tecnológico y económico debe servir a los seres humanos y acrecentar la dignidad humana, en lugar de crear una economía de la exclusión, de modo que todas las personas tengan acceso a lo que se necesita para un auténtico desarrollo humano.
- Apoyar la vida, proteger la creación. La preocupación por la naturaleza es incompatible con la falta de protección a los seres humanos vulnerables, como los niños no nacidos, las personas discapacitadas o las víctimas de la trata de personas.
- Es hora de actuar. El papa Francisco insta a un cambio en el estilo de vida y el consumo. Podemos hacer cambios importantes como individuos, familias y comunidades, y como líderes civiles y políticos
- Esperanza y alegría. "La injusticia no es invencible" (no. 74), y actuamos sabiendo que buscamos vivir la visión de Dios de relaciones renovadas con él, con nosotros mismos, entre nosotros y con la creación.

Cómo puedes responder

Cada uno de nosotros está llamado a dar pasos concretos —desde reducir el consumo hasta trabajar por el cambio político— para cuidar mejor de la creación. He aquí algunas ideas.

- 1. Cobra mayor conciencia de nuestra conexión. El cuidado mutuo y de la creación incluye la comprensión de que "todo está conectado" (no. 91) y que la economía, la política, la participación de la comunidad y la tecnología afectan, en conjunto, el futuro del planeta y de la humanidad. ¿Cómo podemos hacernos más conscientes de nuestra conexión?
- Los cambios en el estilo de vida y los hábitos de consumo pueden constituir una gran diferencia. Por
 ejemplo, conseguir una botella de agua reutilizable; tomar duchas más cortas; caminar, desplazarse
 en bicicleta o tomar el transporte público en lugar de conducir, reciclar, compostar restos de
 alimentos, y comprar electrodomésticos eficientes.
- Haz cambios a nivel institucional en tu parroquia, escuela o lugar de trabajo. Por ejemplo, implementar reciclaje y compostaje, utilizar vajilla lavable en las cafeterías, compartir electrónicamente en lugar de imprimir, hacer una auditoría energética, e instalar paneles solares.
- 4. Apoya esfuerzos locales para resolver problemas ambientales. En todo el país, grupos comunitarios están trabajando para hacer cambios en su ciudad, condado y estado que pueden constituir una gran diferencia. Averigua lo que está pasando a nivel local y participa.
- Ponte en contacto con tus congresistas para compartir el mensaje del papa Francisco y urgir a la acción para abordar el cambio climático.

Señor Uno y Trino, comunidad preciosa de amor infinito, enséñanos a contemplarte en la belleza del universo, donde todo nos habla de ti. Despierta nuestra alabanza y nuestra gratitud por cada ser que has creado. Danos la gracia de sentimos íntimamente unidos con todo lo que existe.

Dios de amor, muéstranos nuestro lugar en este mundo como instrumentos de tu cariño por todos los seres de esta tierra, porque ninguno de ellos está olvidado ante ti. Los pobres y la tierra están clamando: Señor, tómanos a nosotros con tu poder y tu luz, para proteger toda vida, para preparar un futuro mejor, para que venga tu Reino de justicia, de paz, de amor y de hermosura. Alabado seas. Amén.
