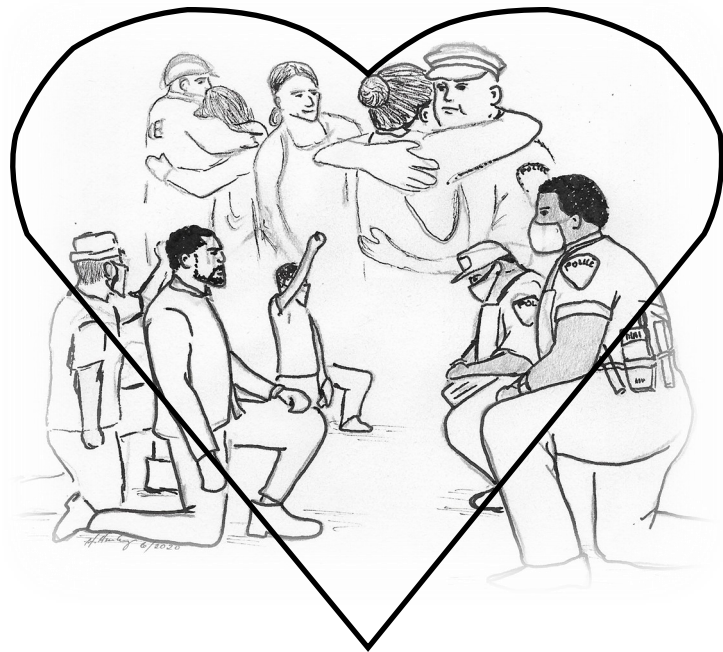

S.E.A.S. IS NOT YET OPEN FOR MASS

Our parish church is being continuously sanitized and prepared for your return. Plans to reopen the parish for Mass will be released once they have been approved by the Diocesan Office. We thank you for your patience and prayers.

IMPORTANT PARISH REMINDERS

- 1) The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation issued on March 12, 2020, is still in effect until further notice.
- 2) Even with the resumption of public liturgies, parishioners who are particularly vulnerable should be urged to remain home (e.g. over the age of sixty, have an existing heart or lung conditions, diabetes, or are otherwise immuno-compromised). Such individuals should not volunteer or be asked to volunteer to fulfill liturgical ministries. Likewise, parishioners who feel sick in any way, those with a fever or cough, and those who live with a person found to be positive for COVID-19, should be urged to refrain from public gatherings, including liturgical celebrations, until a doctor determines it is safe for them to do so.
- 3) Attending Mass in the future will be different. Plans for the return to Mass will be released as soon as we have approval from the Diocesan Office.
- 4) Even with the return to Mass, we know that many of our parishioners will continue to join with us virtually through continued Mass on our parish YouTube Channel, parish website, and Facebook.

Statement regarding the death of Mr. George Floyd

June 3, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The horrendous death that you and I witnessed on television last week of Mr. George Floyd has evoked anger and pain in so many of us, regardless of our race. These experiences of mistreatment do occur all too often to people of color. They stir a disgust in so many of us asking, "Why?" Given their frequency we rightfully ask, "When will this kind of thing end?"

We can be better than this as a nation! This horrific event casts a spotlight on the reality of racial, criminal and economic injustice that is alive in our country. It reaffirms for me that we need to be willing to engage in a serious conversation about race relations. Before we heal the wound of racism in our country and before we start telling people what we believe, we need to hear the pain that is real and palpable for so many people today.

It is my hope that our civil leaders will help us to engage in a conversation that is real and allows us to engage in honest dialogue, with the hope that substantive changes in our society can occur from our local neighborhoods to the economic and judicial system of this country.

Although profound anger has been expressed in the streets this week, we must be reminded that we have many wonderful police officers who are here for you and me to protect us and are willing to assist us when we are vulnerable or in danger of any kind of hurt or pain. I am grateful for their service as 'first responders.' They put their lives on the line and we should have profound respect for them.

Lastly I wish to address the protest, violence and destruction that we have seen in our American cities. Peaceful protest is an expression of our anger and desire to change, but the destruction of people's property and violence against anyone is NOT a means to justice. One of my great heroes has always been the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He inspired me as a child of color in the community I was raised and greatly influenced me in my priestly ministry. He believed strongly in calling out all injustice and to speak the truth, because at the end of the day, the truth will set us free! Let us pray for each other and for our country. May we all be instruments of healing!

Declaración sobre la muerte de Sr. George Floyd Junio 3, 2020

Estimados hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

La horrible muerte que ustedes y yo presenciamos en la televisión la semana pasada del Sr. George Floyd ha provocado ira y dolor en muchos de nosotros, independientemente de nuestra raza. Estas experiencias de maltrato ocurren con demasiada frecuencia a las personas de color. Suscitan disgusto en tantos de nosotros y nos preguntamos: "¿Por qué?" Dada su frecuencia, con razón preguntamos: "¿Cuándo terminará este tipo de cosas?"

¡Podemos ser mejores que esto como nación! Este horrible evento pone de relieve la realidad de la injusticia racial, criminal y económica que existe en nuestro país. Me reafirma que debemos estar dispuestos a entablar una conversación seria sobre las relaciones raciales. Antes de sanar la herida del racismo en nuestro país y antes de comenzar a decirle a la gente lo que creemos, necesitamos escuchar el dolor real y palpable de tanta gente el día de hoy.

Espero que nuestros líderes cívicos nos ayuden a entablar una conversación que sea real y nos permita entablar un diálogo honesto, con la esperanza de que puedan ocurrir cambios sustanciales en nuestra sociedad desde nuestros vecindarios locales hasta el sistema económico y judicial de este país.

Aunque se ha expresado una profunda ira en las calles esta semana, debemos recordar que tenemos muchos policías maravillosos que están aquí para dar apoyo, y nos protegen y están dispuestos a ayudarnos cuando estamos vulnerables o estamos en peligro de cualquier tipo o sufriendo dolor. Estoy agradecido por el servicio de ellos como "socorristas". Ellos arriesgan sus vidas y debemos tener un profundo respeto por ellos.

Por último, deseo abordar la protesta, la violencia y la destrucción que hemos visto en nuestras ciudades estadounidenses. La protesta pacífica es una expresión de nuestra ira y nuestro deseo de cambio, pero la destrucción de la propiedad y la violencia de las personas contra cualquiera NO es un medio para lograr justicia. Uno de mis grandes héroes siempre ha sido el reverendo Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. El me inspiró como un niño de color en la comunidad en la que me crié y me influyó mucho en mi ministerio sacerdotal. ¡Creía firmemente en denunciar toda injusticia y decir la verdad, porque al final del día, la verdad nos hará libres! Oremos unos por otros y por nuestro país. ¡Que todos seamos instrumentos de sanación!
