## ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

This quilt was made for our parish by founding parishioner, Barbara Mischel and friends, depicting of our patroness, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton with the children.



As a parish we celebrate St. Elizabeth Ann Seton this weekend as our patroness and servant of God's Word. We have celebrated her on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time for many years given permission by † Bishop Richard Garcia.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is the first native born American Saint in the Catholic Church. Raised with the Christian faith, she loved Jesus and learned to help others in his name. Born in New York in 1774 to a prominent family, she was married and had kids. She and her husband lost everything they owned when the shipping industry tanked. When he became ill, they travelled to Italy for his health, but he died on the way.

It was in Italy that Elizabeth was first introduced to Catholicism and fell in love with Christ in the Eucharist. She converted to Catholicism on her return to the U.S. Persecuted by former friends and relatives for her faith, she found solace in Christ and charity work. Soon other widows flocked around her to share in her love for the Lord with their own children, and they created a Catholic school and small community.

Later Elizabeth and others began an order known today as the Daughters of Charity taking solemn vows under the direction of the Bishop. They took on Christ's missionary work to serve in his name, prayed often, and read Scripture: She was known to enjoy the Psalms.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton knew wealth, poverty, joy, sorrow, hardship, fear, aloneness, what it feels like to lose a child and husband, what it is like to find Jesus. She is a woman for all time and peoples who love God and desire to do God's will; giving us and our parish an example of trust in God and love for Him.

## ST. BLAISE & ASH WEDNESDAY

### Blessing of Throats on the memorial of St. Blaise (February 3)

Note that the Book of Blessings contains the following provision for this rite:

1628. If, for pastoral reasons, each individual cannot be blessed in the manner described in no. 1627, for example when great numbers are gathered for the blessing or when the memorial of Saint Blaise occurs on a Sunday, a priest or deacon may give the blessing to all assembled by extending hands, without the crossed candles, over the people while saying the prayer of blessing. A lay minister says the prayer proper to lay ministers without making the sign of the cross.

The current circumstances would certainly be considered a sufficient pastoral reason to avoid administration of the blessing to individuals in the usual manner, should there be any concern of danger due to the ongoing pandemic.

### Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday (February 17)

While Ash Wednesday is not a holyday of obligation and while there is no requirement for the clergy and faithful to receive the imposition of ashes, it is rightly observed as a celebration of high importance, and many will surely wish to participate even amid the current difficulties.

During this time of pandemic, the **Holy See** has modified the method of distributing the ashes, as outlined in the following "Note":

#### Prot. N. 17/21 NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic

*The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".*

*The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.*

*From the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, 12 January 2021.*

## MASS REMINDERS

- 1) The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation issued on March 12, 2020, is still in effect until further notice.
- 2) Even with the resumption of public liturgies, parishioners who are particularly vulnerable should be urged to remain home (e.g. over the age of sixty, have an existing heart or lung conditions, diabetes, or are otherwise immuno-compromised). Such individuals should not volunteer or be asked to volunteer to fulfill liturgical ministries. Likewise, parishioners who feel sick in any way, those with a fever or cough, and those who live with a person found to be positive for COVID-19, should be urged to refrain from public gatherings, including liturgical celebrations, until a doctor determines it is safe for them to do so.
- 3) Even with the return to Mass, we know that many of our parishioners will continue to join with us virtually through continued Mass on our parish website, and Facebook, and YouTube channel.

- 5) Weekend Liturgy aids and the S.E.A.S. parish bulletin will continue to be emailed to parishioners whose email we have. (To add your name, just send an email to the office email.) They are also available on the parish website and MyParishApp.

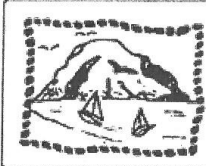
