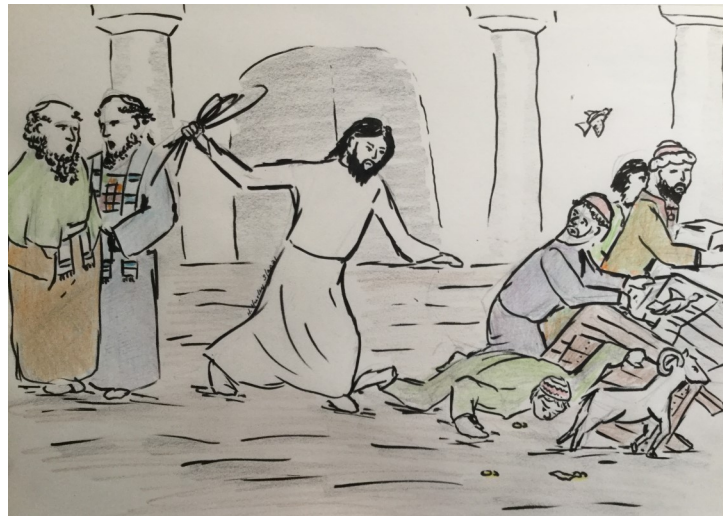

GRACE TEVIS & THE ADORATION CHAPEL

Long time parishioner Grace Tevis bequeathed the funding for our parish Adoration Chapel. Groundbreaking for the Chapel is this Saturday, March 6 at 5:15 p.m.

Many parishioners remember Grace as the 'Woman in the Wheelchair' who used to attend the daily and Sunday liturgies. She usually kept to herself. Often Grace could be found, head bowed, and sitting before the tabernacle in prayer after Masses when others had gone to their faith sharing groups during the week. On Sundays she enjoyed listening to the various conversations while enjoying the delicious foods.

Grace was a woman of very strong opinions. One of her thoughts was that Our Lord deserved to be honored and adored to the best of our ability for all that he gave so that we could partake in the glories of heaven. She shared the stories of how her mother would take her on errands when she was young, but that they would, when passing the Catholic Church, go inside to say a prayer; they also regularly attended

Sunday Mass. That lesson of going to Jesus and adoring him, no matter where you had to be or were going, stuck with her and helped her to put Jesus as best she could at the center of her life.

Grace Tevis, neé Grace Kobbe, was from the Altadena area of southern California. There she married the love of her life, Lloyd Tevis. Lloyd was an attorney and held several positions at the Jesuit Law School, *Loyola Law School* at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles including adjunct professor, professor, Associate Dean and Dean. During his years as an adjunct professor Lloyd also worked for a private law firm. Grace often served as his secretary for him during his profession years, she would sometimes say. She also did quite a bit of charity work.

During the early 1960s Grace saw an article about a priest who had left the Jesuit order and was starting with Mother Theresa a group called the Missionaries of Charity. Grace helped to collect money from the United States and send it to the Missionary Brothers in India, Saigon, and Cambodia, according to the *Loyola Lawyer*, 1986, vol. 4, no 3. During the Vietnam War era the Brothers fled Viet Nam and the spreading Communism. In the 1970s they took refuge with Lloyd and Grace Tevis at their home in Altadena and became established in Los Angeles thanks to Grace and Lloyd's efforts.

From there, Grace's penchant for charity and helping others in need continued to spread. She continued to help with the Jesuit and Brothers of Charity needs that she saw locally. Grace actively helped those she knew by supporting their service to others. As the years passed she stayed in touch with friends from the Missionary Brothers of Charity especially former Brothers of Charity, Michael Geilenfeld and Jeremy Hollinger. Grace and Lloyd helped the Brothers of Charity settle a home and center in Haiti. Later they helped their friend, Michael, to build and establish an orphanage and school for street boys in Haiti as well. Grace and Lloyd were able to travel to see what they had helped to start and were much encouraged by the good that was being done for the greater glory of God.

Grace and Lloyd, through Brother Anton, met Maya, the then director of Wings of Hope, which during the 1980s helped to provide schools in India and Malawi. Grace and Lloyd helped to provide funding for some of these schools and Grace was able to travel to Malawi to see some of the schools that she had helped to bring to fruition while meeting some of the students and their teachers.

When Lloyd retired from Loyola Law School, he and Grace moved to their retirement home in Los Osos, which they had designed and built. Even in retirement Grace kept busy. She used to share that she worked for a number of years at the Newman Catholic Center that serves both Cuesta and Cal Poly students in our local area.

Grace and Lloyd seemed to live deliberately and tried to be good stewards of their time and talents. Grace had a strong connection to her friends and was careful to choose them. When Lloyd died in 1991 Grace lost her best friend. There is a fountain at the entrance to the Newman Center in San Luis Obispo dedicated to his memory, donated by her.

Grace continued to live charitably. At times Grace would often deny herself creature comforts so that she could save money for different charities including our own parish. During the 2010s toward the end of her life Grace helped the Jesuits to establish a Cristo Rey school in San Jose, CA. During that same time she purchased for them a statue of Jesus for their lobby. While looking she realized that our parish did not have statues of Mary or Joseph and realized that we needed the Holy Family in our church. Working with our pastor at the time she bought the statues of St. Mary and the other of St. Joseph holding the child Jesus that are in the niches at the altar in our parish church.

GRACE TEVIS & THE ADORATION CHAPEL CON'T.

Grace Tevis practiced Ignatian spirituality which helped direct her towards trying to be a person for others: placing God first in her life, then friends, then herself to the best of her ability. Grace strove to live according to the Jesuit maxim, *ad maiorem dei gloriam*, meaning 'For the greater glory of God' whether she was helping poor children around the world, religious communities, talking with friends, or praying before the Blessed Sacrament.

In one of her last acts of charity at her death in February 2016, Grace Tevis bequeathed to our parish a portion of her assets for the specific purpose of building an Adoration Chapel. (She provided for other charities as well at her death.) With the building of our Adoration Chapel she is sharing her love for Christ in the Eucharist with us and challenges us to keep Him at the center of our lives. It is in loving gratitude that we break ground on the Adoration Chapel this 6th of March.

The Adoration Chapel has taken five years from her death until the present to be able to break ground. During that time committees were formed. Permits were applied for. Bids for architects and contractors sought and accepted. Building plans developed. Costs estimates gathered and changes made. Direction from a succession of our Diocesan bishops and permissions granted. Contracts approved.

We are truly blessed to have had as part of our Adoration Chapel Committee: Ron and Mary Munds, Hank Watterworth, †David Bresnan, Richard Avila, Patricia Nelson, Javier Soto Osorio, and Fr. Joey Buena. These people helped to make the needed decisions in light of Grace's wishes and the needs of our parish community from the beginning.

A separate committee, affectionately called the *Dream Team*, was created in 2016 for a brief purpose of helping to inspire the Adoration Committee. It consisted of Pete McAdam, Patricia Nelson, Javier Soto Osorio, Fr. Joey Buena, and Heather Hurley.

News of our Adoration Chapel has spread throughout the local area. We have had many visitors to our little parish because of it. One of many examples: in the winter of 2018/9 Cal Poly's College of Architecture and Environmental Design had heard of chapel project. Professor Humberto Norman was granted permission by Fr. Joey and the Diocese of Monterey to bring several of his classes to our parish campus to explore the grounds, get a feel for the environment, learn about Roman Catholicism and how we worship in preparation for their class assignment—building a chapel. It turns out that what we are building now is a perfect project for neophyte architecture students. Professor Norman used our particular site for their constraints and geographic features. The presentation put together by members of the Dream Team was a useful tool for the students. That was not the end of the relationship. Our office staff was invited to attend the showcases from the quarters that the students prepared projects in Spring and Fall of 2019. Their ideas were incredible and deeply spiritual and very much inspired by what was observed at our little parish.

Grace's longtime friend and attorney, Mr. Robert Mott, will take her place at the groundbreaking ceremony joined with the remaining living members of the Adoration Committee, Mr. Michael Smith, and Mr. Nick Arnold. We thank Mr. Jeremy Hollinger, a longtime friend of Grace, for his input in Grace's relationship with the Brothers of Charity. He sends us his best wishes and is grateful to see the Adoration Chapel come to its first phase of realization.

Let us in turn keep Grace Tevis in our prayers. May God bless her for the good that she did during her earthly life and even now. May our loving Father let his perpetual light shine upon Grace. May she rest in peace. Amen.

We pray too that our Adoration Chapel may be a beacon of God's light, love peace: His ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world for those weary in the tempestuous sea of life. May through regular contemplation of Our Lord in the Eucharist, may we realize the great gift we receive of being in God's very real presence. We ask this through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

MASS REMINDERS

- 1) The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation issued on March 12, 2020, is still in effect until further notice.
- 2) Even with the resumption of public liturgies, parishioners who are particularly vulnerable should be urged to remain home (e.g. over the age of sixty, have an existing heart or lung conditions, diabetes, or are otherwise immuno-compromised). Such individuals should not volunteer or be asked to volunteer to fulfill liturgical ministries.

Likewise, parishioners who feel sick in any way, those with a fever or cough, and those who live with a person found to be positive for COVID-19, should be urged to refrain from public gatherings, including liturgical celebrations, until a doctor determines it is safe for them to do so.

- 3) Even with the return to Mass, we know that many of our parishioners will continue to join with us virtually through continued Mass on our parish website, and Facebook, and YouTube channel.
- 4) To register for weekend in person Mass, please use the "reserve my seat" button on our parish website to register. You can do it from a cell phone. **You need to register for each Mass and must receive a confirmation message.**

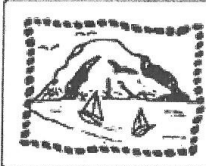
