Prop. 1 Passage Devastating for Women, Children, and Families in CA

The California Catholic Conference has released the following statement in response to the passage of Proposition 1:

"The passage of Prop. 1 is devastating for women, children, and families in California.

"Prop. 1 has opened the door to unregulated, late-term abortions, all at taxpayer expense, redirecting state funding away from solutions for the greatest needs of California families.

"Prop. 1 does not solve any of the underlying personal challenges that women cite as reasons for choosing abortion—intimate partner violence, housing insecurity, inadequate access to healthcare, insufficient paid leave, childcare opportunities, or having no one in their lives able to accompany them through pregnancy and parenting.

"Time and truth go hand in hand. The reckless language and realities of Prop. 1 will be realized in due time, and we look forward to fighting again to protect life when Prop 1 is inevitably challenged in the courts.

"While Prop 1 politicians celebrate their political gain, the pro-life community will continue doing what we always do—accompanying women and families in their most difficult moments with life-affirming resources and support. Every day, hundreds of California women facing an unexpected pregnancy look for support in our great state. The pro-life community is there for them through our network of resource centers, pregnancy clinics, maternity homes, and call centers.

"The Catholic community in California invites you to join us through our We Were Born Ready campaign to educate Californians on ways to support and advocate for women in crisis pregnancy situations in our communities. And we continue to pray for our state and the countless lives lost to abortion."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

By now, you have no doubt heard that Prop. 1 passed. While this is tremendously disappointing, and not the outcome we have been working toward and praying for, there is still much to be proud of and thankful for.

Our deepest heartfelt gratitude to every single person who generously answered the call to raise awareness against Prop. 1. Our Catholic dioceses and parishes participated in a way and at an intensity that cannot be denied, and the polling and the election results prove it.

Though the measure succeeded, the number of Californians who identify as pro-life has increased by [almost ten percent](#) since this campaign began. In contrast, the number of Californians identifying as pro-choice has dropped seven percentage points, from 62% to 55%. We've shown that we can unite and be winsome in advocating against the extreme, expensive, and unnecessary push for late-term abortion.

Thank you to our Bishops, who were vocal in their opposition to Prop. 1 and shepherded us through the contentious waters of abortion in California with a heart for Christ, proclaiming the dignity of every human life.

Thank you to all priests and deacons who courageously brought the fight against Prop. 1 to parishioners through impassioned homilies and prayer events.

Thank you to diocesan leaders and parish captains who poured so much time into organizing, creating materials, and communicating the truth about Prop. 1.

Thank you to every parishioner who gave their precious time to our coalition, from holding voter drives to putting up yard signs and well beyond.

Finally, thank you to every person who acts as the hands and feet of Christ, walking daily with women, children and families in greatest need in our communities.

At the beginning of this year, the CA bishops [stated their resolve](#) "To commit to our sisters that we, the Catholic community of California, will be by your side as you walk the journey of motherhood." In our parishes, from baby showers to donations to awareness campaigns, the Catholic community is here for every mom and dad and family through our network of resource centers, pregnancy clinics, maternity homes, and call centers. Now is the time to reinvigorate our support for women, children, and families through [We Were Born Ready](#).

We have responded to our Gospel call to serve on behalf of the most vulnerable and to share the love of Christ Jesus. And despite the passage of Prop. 1, we can rest knowing that the Lord sees our work and recognizes our struggle. For, the core of our mission as Christians is to evangelize, spreading the good news of Jesus to the world. We build up the kingdom of God here in our midst, but our mindset is eternal, with hope for the world to come.

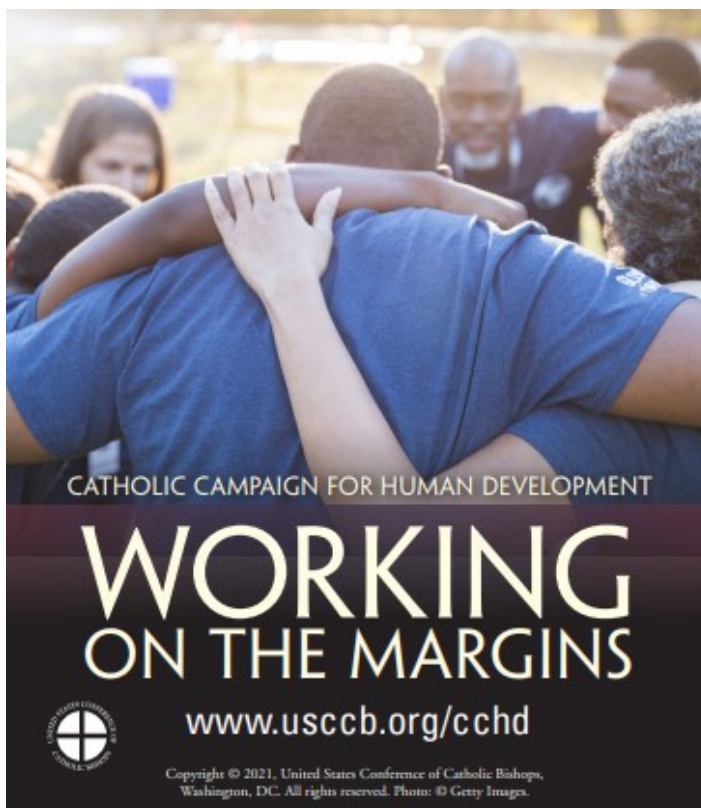
19th and 20th Nov. we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

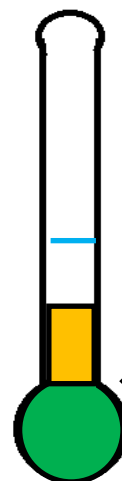

INTERNATIONAL RESTORATIVE JUSTICE MONTH — OVERVIEW

It's been pointed out by legal scholars, sociologists and religious leaders that our criminal justice system is grounded in retribution. Those convicted of crimes — especially violent acts — are to be locked away and punished by the government. Besides cooperating with the police and testifying in court, victims play no further role in the adversarial process. And rehabilitating offenders, at best, is an afterthought for the two million men and women incarcerated in the United States today.

Starting with their 2000 pastoral letter "Responsibility, Rehabilitation, and Restoration: A Catholic Perspective on Crime and Criminal Justice," U.S. bishops have advocated for a more humane approach called "Restorative Justice" to repair the harm caused by criminal behavior to the extent possible. The growing social justice movement encourages victims, offenders and their impacted communities to fully participate in the healing process through victim/offender dialogue, restitution, victim and ex-offender assistance, sentencing circles and community service.

Crime is viewed as an offense against human relationships, so the focus is on healing. By participating in victim-centered programs, offenders see firsthand the impact of their crimes. "Restorative justice is about addressing the rights and needs of everyone impacted by crime in a balanced way — victims, offenders, and the community," says Auxiliary Bishop Gabino Zavala of Los Angeles. "It's a messy process. But the alternative is fear, hatred and divisiveness. The alternative is worse. It means the continual loss of human life."

INTERNATIONAL RESTORATIVE JUSTICE MONTH PRAYER

Richard Mejico wrote, "I never realized a candle of hope was not intended to overpower the darkness but rather be a sign the darkness would not overpower me." We gather here today to light some candles of hope and ask our God to keep those lights glowing brightly.

With the Prayer of St. Francis as our base, we pray

Nothing can ever fill the hole in the hearts of those who have suffered such a loss. Help them to walk with the pain along the path that leads to healing and peace.

Where there is injury, let me sow pardon

God of compassion, help us to reach out to those who are most in need of a gentle touch today. We recognize that you have created us as one family, walking together through life. Help us to be there for each other especially when one of our family members is in pain and sorrowing.

Where there is doubt, let me sow faith

God of justice, give us legislators who have the courage to enact laws that truly restore our communities, heal our divisions, stop neighborhood violence, and result in communities where all people are respected and no one has to live in fear.

Where there is despair, let me sow hope

God of courage and strength, help us to stand up for the rights of those in need of a stronger voice on their behalf. Help us to work together to ensure that the rights of victims become the law of our state and our country. Help us to ensure that all the benefits of the victims' restitution fund be used for the reasons they have been collected. Let us be hope for each other by walking together toward the common goals we share.

Where there is sadness, let me sow joy

God of gentleness and consolation, we are all members of your family but we have been the cause of harm and sadness to each other. Do not let the sadness overcome us. Let us find a joy in being and working together to make your world the place you created it to be.

Where there is darkness, let me sow light

God of light and life, help us to dedicate ourselves to ensuring that no one else loses a loved one to violence. Let us become people of life, not death, people of light, not darkness, people of restoration, not revenge, one family united to insure that there are no more victims,

Let those candles of hope burn in the hearts of each one of us. And, together as one family, we can dispel the darkness that surrounds us.

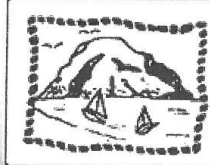
