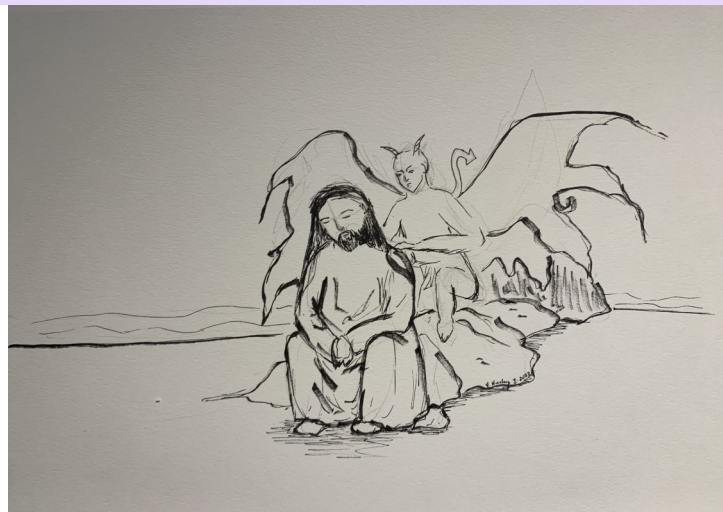

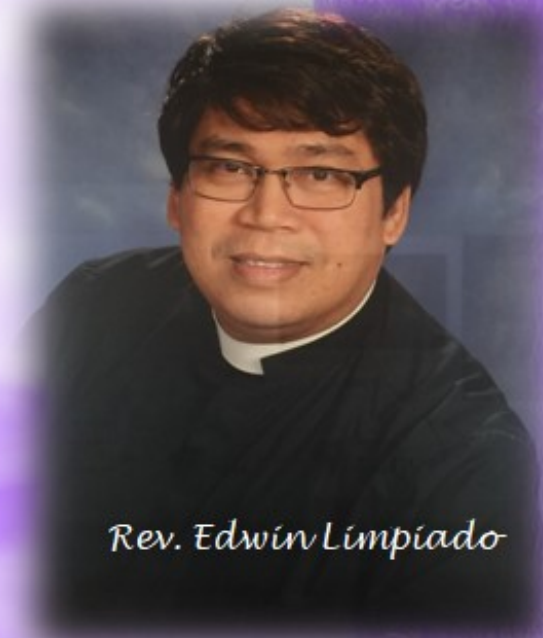

You Matter!

In October 2021 the entire Church entered into a Synod. Pope Francis opened the Synod in Rome and invited every diocese throughout the world to join at a local level. This means that everyone who is part of our parish of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, from the youngest children to the oldest members of our parish communities; those who attend Mass regularly, or just at Christmas and Easter; those who volunteer regularly and those who are homebound—each one of us matters. We are the Body of Christ with Christ as our head. Together, we are the Church. With other parishes in our Diocese, with other Dioceses both in our country and around the world, we are the Church.

We understand and believe that the Holy Spirit works within us, inspires us, and helps us to join together in Christ's mission on earth. We believe that the Holy Spirit gives gifts to people of all different ages, cultural heritages, and experiences. It is important to listen to each other just as a parent listens to a child, an employer listens to their employees, or a pastor listens to his parishioners. This is the point of this Synod on Synodality, to listen to each other and the Holy Spirit because we are journeying together, reconfiguring ourselves toward Christ as individuals and as the Church.

What is a Synod?

The word Synod comes from the Greek word meaning, ‘the same way or path.’ The Church has had synods since the very beginning. A synod was traditionally a gathering of bishops and gave the bishops a chance to meet and discuss issues of importance for the life of the Church so to keep on the same path. In 1965 Pope Paul VI instituted the Synod of Bishops to keep alive that sense of journeying together and positive spirit that the bishops had during Vatican II. Every two to three years since then, synods have been organized to bring together bishops, experts, and others to discuss different topics. Therefore, synods are nothing new. Having a synod is just part of synodality. Synodality is a way of being Church, and not just an event or program. At the end of the synod, the bishops vote on a final document. Then the pope will write his own document called an ‘apostolic exhortation.’ An example is *Evangelii Gaudium* also known as the *Proclamation of the Gospel in Today's World* by Pope Francis.

Communion | Participation | Mission

In October 2021 Pope Francis opened the Synod on Synodality, or basically a coming together to talk about how we as the people of God are on the same path or journeying together: that is, aided by the Holy Spirit, we will share our being in **communion** with each other as described by Pope Saint Paul VI “*communion, that is, cohesion and interior fullness, in grace, truth and collaboration... and mission, that is, apostolic commitment to the world of today*”; **participating** in the life of the Church through actively being in communion with each other, listening to each other and our experiences as members of one Church, one Body, united by Christ through the Holy Spirit; and through this being in unity together, in the words of Pope St. John Paul II, “*gives rise to the Church's mission of serving as a sign of the human family's intimate union with God.*”

What are the Key Elements of Synodality?

As a Church, as members of our parish, communities, and families, we already live synodality. From the Synod Handbook, there are 10 key elements of Synodality.

- 1) Be companions to each other on the journey
- 2) Listening to the Spirit and each other
- 3) Speaking out
- 4) Celebrating together
- 5) Sharing responsibility for our common mission
- 6) Joining dialogue in Church and in wider society
- 7) Participating in ecumenism
- 8) Each claiming their proper authority and participation
- 9) Being part of discerning and deciding
- 10) Forming ourselves in synodality

Before our parish teams meet with you, we hope that you will take the time to prayerfully consider these two questions so that when we do meet, you will have **experiences** that you would like to share.

Question 1:

In recent years, what is an experience you have had when you felt like the Church was "journeying together" with you and/or its people?

II. Listening Sessions:

1. Recognizing the cultural and language differences within our parish, our leadership team has divided into 3 groups based on our native languages to best meet the needs of our parish so that we may obtain the greatest amount of your voices in this sharing process.

Group 1: Spanish as the primary language

Group 2: Tagalog / Ilocano as the primary language

Group 3: English as the primary language

2. Based on cultural norms, the leadership teams for each are planning listening sessions where your answers and experiences to the above questions may be heard and recorded.

III. Reporting:

1. After each listening session, the facilitator and recorder for each session submit their record to the parish team. They will then help to put together the report that will be sent to the Diocese of Monterey. The Diocese will send it to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, who then sends their report to the Vatican so that all the Bishops may understand the experiences of the church and formulate what they heard in their own words, and then share it with us. Pope Francis will do likewise and publish his apostolic exhortation for the world to read, so that we will know his observations from what we have told him through our communion, participation and mission aided by the Holy Spirit.

2. The experiences shared within our community will also help us to grow more in communion with each other as we continue to journey together, continuously reconfiguring our hearts towards Christ, and offer genuine insight to who we are as the parish of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, strengthen our mission through the works of the Holy Spirit as children of God, one family in communion with our triune God.

ADORATION CHAPEL Q & A SERIES #47

Q: My friends are all doing the Stations of the Cross this Lent, but I find myself drawn more to Adoration. Is this wrong?

A. Absolutely not! You are not wrong if you prefer being at Adoration. They are not wrong either. We are all called to different devotions. One thing to consider is that at Adoration, you can actually silently pray the Stations of the Cross or even the Litany of the Passion on your own. Think about it, by using these devotions at Adoration, both will help you pray and reflect while sitting in front of the **same** Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ Jesus that was nailed to the Cross for our sins.
