Since 2010 Fr Peter is the chief editor of The Angels, Messengers from a Loving God, a quarterly publication. It is perhaps the only magazine dedicated to the topic of the Holy Angels and the Divine Mercy from a Catholic perspective with many compelling articles.

Holding a PhD in Spirituality, by God's providence from 1993 – 1996, Fr Peter served as chaplain to the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw where Saint Faustina started her religious life. It was this Congregation in Warsaw that first suggested to Fr Peter that he would be the best person to go to Australia and talk on Divine Mercy in 2020. For over twenty years with great missionary zeal, he has travelled to many countries proclaiming and explaining The Divine Mercy devotion, always bringing the first class relic of St Faustina when he travels.



Fr Peter has written many articles about St. Faustina and the Divine Mercy. His main charism and expertise is on St Michael the Archangel and the Holy Angels which has led to him becoming a sought after inspirational speaker on these topics and the Divine Mercy. St Faustina testifies to the reverence in which she held Saint Michael the Archangel and to the devotion she had for him (Diary, 667).



We can also have our own issues that we are dealing with in our lives because He rests in our hearts. We have no reason to with family, work, or other events. It can be overwhelming fear. Instead, we find ourselves being called to serve one and may cause fear. For some, the fears and anxieties another, starting with our own families and radiating outmay cause us to not want to leave our homes or may wards. cause us to not sleep and our stomachs to feel like they are twisted in knots.

We are reminded by Holy Scripture as the speaker of the Psalm addresses God (Ps 32:5-7):

> "I declared my sin to you; my guilt I did not hide. I said, "I confess my transgression to the LORD," and you took away the guilt of my sin. Therefore every loyal person should pray to you in time of distress. Though flood waters threaten, they will never reach him. You are my shelter; you guard me from distress; with joyful shouts of deliverance you surround me."

We are invited to live a Sacramental life, to partake of the Wedding Feast, which is full of the grace of God and with new garments as people who have joined our wills toward His, the Father of the Son who is the Bridegroom, through the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Yes, difficulties and grief will come. When we live the Sacraments: our promises made at Baptism, to receive our Lord through the nourishment of the Eucharist, share the gifts we have received through Baptism but unleashed through the outpouring of grace given at Confirmation; to receive the healing needed through the Sacrament of Confession, also known as Reconciliation as well as the healing that comes through the Anointing of the Sick and Extreme Unction or Last Rites, then to live our life in service to each other through the Sacrament of Marriage where we are invited to live a life of service to our spouse and often to the children who may be a product of the love between spouses, or perhaps we are called to the Sacrament of Ho-

When we live a Sacramental life, our eyes are on God

The Catechism of the Catholic Church Part Three speaks of Life in Christ. (CCC 1803-1845) It is the section which directly discusses the Virtues.

The 4 Cardinal (or Principal) Virtues, also known as human virtues because we need to practice them, are prudence, temperance, justice and fortitude. These virtues are highly praised in many parts of Scripture. "Human virtues acquired by education, by deliberate acts and by a perseverance ever-renewed in repeated efforts are purified and elevated by divine grace. With God's help, they forge character and give facility in the practice of the good. The virtuous man is happy to practice them. It is not easy for man, wounded by sin, to maintain moral balance. Christ's gift of salvation offers us the grace necessary to persevere in the pursuit of the virtues. Everyone should always ask for this grace of light and strength, frequent the sacraments, cooperate with the Holy Spirit, and follow his calls to love what is good and shun evil." (CCC 1810-11)

The Theological Virtues are faith, hope, and charity. We look particularly at charity. It is our loving God for his own sake, and out of that love, we love our neighbor as ourselves. "If I . . . have not charity," says the Apostle, "I am nothing." Whatever my privilege, service, or even virtue, "if I . . . have not charity, I gain nothing." Charity is superior to all the virtues. It is the first of the theological virtues: "So faith, hope, charity abide, these three. But the greatest of these is charity." (CCC 1826, 1 Cor 13:1-4, 1 Cor 13:13)

We know that love is powerful and wipes away fears and doubts. Will you remember to pray when you are afraid and need His love to hold you tight? How does love transform your life? Knowing loves transforms, what ways does it call you to share yourself or your gifts with others? We share, 'coz we love, we give.
