My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

War, whether it be in Ukraine or in the Middle East is terrible. It is heart wrenching for the people living in these respective locations, but also for family and friends who care about those who live there.

Today, Tuesday, October 17, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, Archbishop Latin Primate of Jerusalem, called for us to join him in praying for Peace and Reconciliation in the Holy Land. We spiritually accompany him in prayer, not only today, but also in the days ahead. The terrible massacre of Israeli children, women, and men (young and old) on Saturday, October 7th (*Our Lady of the Rosary*) was unthinkable and horrific. Now, hostages are being held. There is no excuse for this kind of violence and hate, regardless of what country or people. Every act of violence and hate begets more violence and hate!

How many times have I cried out upon hearing of such an atrocity, ***“When will we learn, O Lord?”*** Amidst, these difficult days, it is easy to become cynical and disengaged when this War seems to be so distant from us here in the United States. Regardless of national origin, these are our brothers and sisters!

Cardinal Pizzaballa has urged Catholics to organize times of praying with Eucharistic Adoration and recitation of the Rosary, *“to deliver to God the Father our thirst for peace, justice and reconciliation.”* He also said, *“In this time of sorrow and dismay, we do not want to remain helpless. We cannot let death and its sting (1 Cor 15-55) be the only word we hear.”* *“That is why we feel the need to pray, to turn our hearts to God the Father. Only in his way we can draw the strength and serenity needed to endure these hard times, by turning to him, in prayer and intercession, to implore and cry out to God amidst this anguish.”*

As this war progresses, just as in Ukraine, let us be mindful of the humanitarian crisis that is growing exponentially every day. Innocent civilians, whether they be of Israeli or Palestinian descent are caught up in the middle of these acts of terror and destruction. There are NO winners!

Let us not forget to pray also for emergency and humanitarian workers: those who are assisting victims of this violence, who are in need of food, water, health care, and shelter. May our Lady of Peace intercede for all of us during this difficult time!

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

La guerra, ya sea en Ucrania o en el Medio Oriente, es algo terrible. Es desgarrador para las personas que viven en estos respectivos lugares, pero también para los familiares y amigos que se preocupan por quienes viven allí.

Hoy, martes 17 de octubre, el Cardenal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, Arzobispo Primado Latino de Jerusalén, nos hizo un llamado a unirnos a él para orar por la paz y la reconciliación en la Tierra Santa. Lo acompañamos espiritualmente en la oración, no sólo hoy, sino también en los días venideros. La terrible masacre de niños, mujeres y hombres (jóvenes y mayores) israelíes el sábado 7 de octubre (día de Nuestra Señora del Rosario) fue impensable y horrible. Ahora hay rehenes retenidos. No hay excusa para este tipo de violencia y odio, sin distinción del país o el origen de las personas. ¡Cada acto de violencia y odio engendra más violencia y odio!

¿Cuántas veces he clamado al oír semejante atrocidad: **“¿Cuándo aprenderemos, oh Señor?”** En medio de estos días difíciles, es fácil volverse cínico y desconectado cuando esta guerra parece estar tan lejos de nosotros aquí en los Estados Unidos. Independientemente del origen nacional, ¡estos son nuestros hermanos y hermanas!

El cardenal Pizzaballa ha instado a los Católicos a organizar tiempos de oración de Adoración Eucarística y el recitar el Rosario, *“para entregar a Dios Padre nuestra sed de paz, justicia y reconciliación”*. También dijo: *“En este momento de dolor y consternación, no queremos permanecer indefensos. No podemos permitir que la muerte y su aguijón (1 Cor 15-55) sea la única palabra que escuchemos”*. *“Por eso sentimos la necesidad de orar, de volver el corazón a Dios Padre. Sólo de su camino podemos sacar la fuerza y la serenidad necesarias para soportar estos tiempos difíciles, recurriendo a Él, en oración e intercesión, para implorar y clamar a Dios en medio de esta angustia”*.

A medida que esta guerra avanza, al igual que en Ucrania, seamos conscientes de la crisis humanitaria que crece exponencialmente todos los días. Civiles inocentes, ya sean de ascendencia Israelí o Palestina, están atrapados en medio de estos actos de terror y destrucción. ¡NO hay ganadores!

No olvidemos orar también por los trabajadores humanitarios y de emergencia: aquellos que están ayudando a las víctimas de esta violencia, que necesitan alimentos, agua, atención médica y refugio. ¡Que nuestra Señora de la Paz interceda por todos nosotros durante este momento difícil!

In the US and other countries in October it is common for scarecrows, ghosts, witches, tombstones, and other 'scarry' things to appear in yards in preparation for Halloween. According to *statista.com*, in 2022 Americans spent \$3.1 billion on Halloween candy. Did you know that Halloween started as a Catholic holiday?

In the early Church, people remembered their departed loved ones. Tertullian (155—220A.D.), a Father of the Church, wrote about the practice of remembering the dead when writing of a widow, *"Indeed, she prays for his soul, and requests refreshment for him meanwhile, and fellowship (with him) in the first resurrection; and she offers (her sacrifice) on the anniversaries of his falling asleep."* ("On Monogamy." *Newadvent.com*. accessed 10/2023) These saints, recognized by the Church and not, were regularly prayed for on their anniversary of death.

There are references to the feast of All Saints in the 4th century in the writings of St. Ephrem the Syrian and Chrysostom. In 609, Pope Boniface IV decreed the Feast of All Saints to be May 13, at the dedication of the Pantheon in Rome as a church in honor of St Mary and all the martyrs. It coincided with a Roman three-day holiday that honored their beloved dead. At the time of Pope Boniface, there were so many martyrs they were too numerous for the liturgical calendar. This one day, the Feast of All Saints, was set aside for all our beloved Saints to be remembered, especially those known to God alone.

On November 1, 735, Pope Gregory III dedicated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica. *"Pope Gregory III dedicated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica to a variety of saints, making it a privileged feast day in the city of Rome. Shortly thereafter Pope Gregory IV established November 1 as a holy day of obligation in the universal Church dedicated to All Saints. To further cement the day, Pope Gregory VII transferred the Pantheon's feast from May 13 to November 1, combining the two dedications to emphasize it and give it even more solemnity."* ("How the Church exorcized a Roman temple to establish All Saints Day." *Kosloski, Aletia.com*. Nov. 2017, accessed 10/2023) Archbishop of Genoa, Jacobus de Voragine, who chronicled the lives of

saints in *The Golden Legend*, suggests in his writing that regarding celebrating Allhallowtide in November, "supplies were ample after the harvest and the vintage was finished."

Pope Sixtus IV expanded the celebration of this 'triduum of death' to an entire octave because these feasts were so important and it stayed as an eight day celebration for several centuries. ("The Triduum of Death: The Forgotten Season of Allhallowtide." *ChurchPop.com*. Oct 2016, accessed 10/2023) Even William Shakespeare in his *Two Gentlemen of Verona* mentions the holy days when the character Valentine mentioning the practice of the practice of giving small cakes, known as a soul cake, to the poor during Hallowtide octave with the lines, *"A soul-cake, a soul-cake, Have mercy on all Christians for a soul-cake."* In 1955 Pope Pius XII eliminated the octave and shortened it back to its three days, as in the period of the early church, as part of the Church reforms put into motion pre-Vatican II.

There are numerous reasons why Halloween is celebrated as it is today with candy and scary decorations. However, it is especially important to remember why Holy Mother Church keeps holy these days and continues to keep All Saints Day (Nov. 1) a holy day of obligation. We are honoring the Angels, the Martyrs, and all the Saints, even those whom God alone knows. They are our examples in the life of faith. We look toward them as our teachers in how to respond to the love that God has for us, each and every one of us. We honor our beloved dead. Each and everyone of us is important and cherished, for God so reminds us, *"Are not five sparrows sold for two small coins? Yet not one of them has escaped the notice of God. Even the hairs of your head have all been counted. Do not be afraid. You are worth more than many sparrows."* (Lk 12:6-7) As a people of God, a people of Life and Love, we remember that life is sacred and so we show respect to our dead and honor God for them. Recall too the community aspect of sharing with our family and friends, for example, from the time of the early Church in spending time together, interceding in prayer, and offering charity where needed, especially as a sacrifice during those holy days. God loves you. 'coz we love, we give.

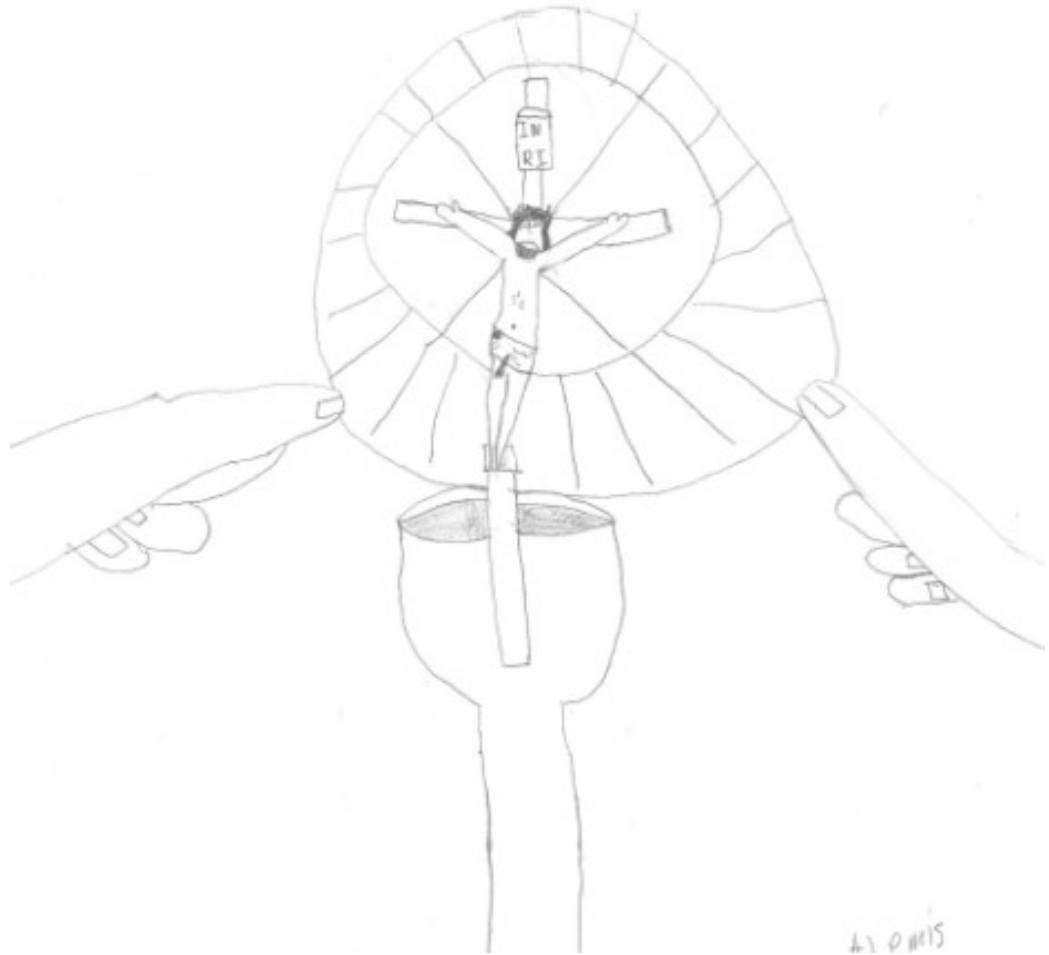

Fr Peter has written many articles about St. Faustina and the Divine Mercy. His main charism and expertise is on St Michael the Archangel and the Holy Angels which has led to him becoming a sought after inspirational speaker on these topics and the Divine Mercy. St Faustina testifies to the reverence in which she held Saint Michael the Archangel and to the devotion she had for him (Diary, 667).

FILIPINO PARISHIONERS CELEBRATE FILIPINO-AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

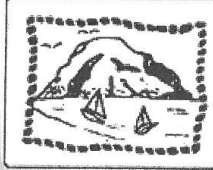
