## FR. PETER PRUSAKIEWICZ, CSMA

Since 2010 Fr Peter is the chief editor of *The Angels, Messengers from a Loving God*, a quarterly publication. It is perhaps the only magazine dedicated to the topic of the Holy Angels and the Divine Mercy from a Catholic perspective with many compelling articles.

Holding a PhD in Spirituality, by God's providence from 1993 – 1996, Fr Peter served as chaplain to the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw where Saint Faustina started her religious life. It was this Congregation in Warsaw that first suggested to Fr Peter that he would be the best person to go to Australia and talk on Divine Mercy in 2020. For over twenty years with great missionary zeal, he has travelled to many countries proclaiming and explaining The Divine Mercy devotion, always bringing the first class relic of St Faustina when he travels.

Fr Peter has written many articles about St. Faustina and the Divine Mercy. His main charism and expertise is on St Michael the Archangel and the Holy Angels which has led to him becoming a sought after inspirational speaker on these topics and the Divine Mercy. St Faustina testifies to the reverence in which she held Saint Michael the Archangel and to the devotion she had for him (Diary, 667).

Parish Festivals bring everyone together bringing fruition to many months of hard work behind the scenes, but when booths and food are put out, entertainment arrives and performs, and most of all, the community gathers to enjoy, it puts everyone into communion with one another in joy for a single main purpose. These types of gatherings show the love of a community and are necessary for the life of the community while honoring God through our love.

Holy Mother Church brings us together to celebrate each week at Mass and on other special occasions through events at both the diocesan and parish levels.

When was the last time that you thought about Mass being a celebration? What is a celebration like for you? Maybe you think of something to eat? Perhaps there is music and sometimes dancing? Maybe people talk to each other at celebrations and you are thinking of a friend you spoke to recently at a special celebration or gathering?

Did you know that the Mass is a celebration of thanksgiving and all the above elements? (Think liturgical dance.)

Do you ask yourself, Why are we supposed to celebrate and be thankful? Who am I supposed to be thankful too? Maybe your mind floats to the priest? Yes, we are grateful for him. He does a lot around the parish and without him, we wouldn't have Mass. Mass seems to be important, then. Let us consider it.

It is because God is present there in the Mass. We are called to show respect to our Lord who through the hypostatic union was both God and Man, so that our human race could be sanctified: He was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, died, descended into hell, and on the third day was raised in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father and will come again to judge the living and the dead. This is what and why we celebrate at every Mass. This is why we show respect to the Lord Our God, Jesus Christ when we enter into church, during Mass, after Mass, and when in His presence.

We begin the moment we enter the church. We genuflect whenever we pass before the Blessed Sacrament reposed within a tabernacle (General Instruction of the Ro-

man Missal 274). If the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament in repose within is in line with the main aisle, this is why we see people kneel when entering their pew. We also give a bow of the body whenever we pass in front of the altar (Ceremonial of Bishops 72) which is why the ministers bow with the priest at the beginning of Mass at the entrance procession and the servers when their hands are free, during the Mass, toward the altar. The Church's laws state that one is supposed to make the appropriate sign of reverence *whenever* one passes in front of the altar or tabernacle. (*Catholic Answers. Bow or Genuflect*) Not conversing during the Mass and remembering that we are called to a sacred silence in preparation for Mass and after the Mass, but instead taking our conversations outside the worship space is another form of respect.

The Mass itself has 4 major parts: The Introductory Rites (the welcoming and preparation of our souls to be in the Lord's presence), the Liturgy of the Word (this is a reminder that we are God's chosen people, a conversation with God as we hear and respond to his Word), the Liturgy of the Eucharist (when Our Lord who loves intimately gives himself up for the life of the world so that we live in him and him in us in a tangible and real way), and the Concluding Rite (where we are sent forth to share in Christ's mission of spreading the Good News and offering God's love and mercy.)

The word, Eucharist, means thanksgiving. We are worshipping and celebrating God who wants us to be in communion with Him: imitating Christ in being of the same will of the Father through the Holy Spirit, to allow our will to be in repose in His. It is because we are loved that we in turn love and chose this. We share God's love in when we follow the commandment to "Love one another as I have love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love," and elsewhere, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." (Jn 15: 9-10, 5) The good things that we do for others through love are the fruits of the vine. What will you do? We share, 'coz we love, we give.



How has the blessed Eucharist touched my life? The best way I can explain this has to be through a personal story. In 2017 (not actually sure of the date) I lost who I thought was the closest embodiment of Jesus, my grandfather papa Toño. On the day after his passing my family met at his house, where he had left a piece of pan Dulce that he had eaten the day of his passing. We all gathered and one at a time took a small bite of the bread. With eyes full of tears and disparity in our hearts, we each took in that last piece of what was left of my grandfather. When the bread touched my lips, I felt as though that would be the last time I would ever get to be that close to my grandfather. When we take the holy Eucharist we are doing this as well. Remembering Jesus, what he did for us, and for just a second we feel that we are so close to him to even share the bread that he left for us.

Similar to my Papa Toño, the bread symbolizes that although Christ is no longer here in the flesh, the faith he instilled in is still lives on.

This Sunday after the 9:00am Mass the 17th Annual Festival Committee is meeting to review the festival.

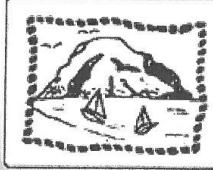
