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As Catholic Faithful we believe in the Holy Trinity. We believe in God the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. We believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, a person of the Holy Trinity, is consubstantial with the Father, and through him all things were made. We believe in the Holy Spirit (also known as the Holy Ghost) who proceeds from the Father and the Son and with the Father and Son is adored and glorified. We believe that Christ Jesus us both truly God and Truly man. (See *Nicene Creed*.)

In 1925 Pope Pius XI wrote an encyclical, *Quos Primas*, to honor the sixteenth centennial jubilee anniversary year of the Council of Nicaea, noting that the "*Nicene Synod defined and proposed for Catholic belief the dogma of the Consubstantiality of the Onlybegotten with the Father, and added to the Creed the words "of whose kingdom there shall be no end," thereby affirming the kingly dignity of Christ.*"

Pope Pius XI inserted into the Sacred Liturgy an annual celebration at the close of the liturgical year for the Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Lord of heaven and earth. It came at a time when secularism and atheism increased due to world strife: the Cristero War in Mexico, the First World War, the Russian anti-religious following the Bolshevik Revolution, and the first glimpse of recognition of the cost of the Industrial Revolution people everywhere.

The continuation of secularism and atheism have been noted by Catholic writers like Flannery O'Connor and Walker Percy among many others. What is secularism then? Fr. Alexander Schmemmann, and Eastern Orthodox priest whose parents had escaped Russia during the revolution explains secularism this way, "*Secularism, I submit, is above all a negation of worship.... If secularism in theological terms is a heresy, it is primarily a heresy about man. It is the negation of man as a worshipping being.*" In essence secularism changes our relationship with God and makes it into a commodity, which allows us to put other things at the center of our lives and we become more like gods. Secularism allows us to be autonomous and not need God, but it does not deny that God exists, as like atheism does. Schmemmann also reminds us, "*When we see the world as*

an end in itself, everying becomes itself a value and consequently loses all value, because only in God is found the meaning (value) of everything, and the world is meaningful only when it is the "sacrament" of God's presence. Things treated merely as things in themselves destroy themselves because only in God have they any life. The world of nature, cut off from the source of life, is a dying world." (pgs. 17. Schmemmann, Fr. Alexander. *Life of the World: Sacraments and Orthodoxy*. St. Vladimir's Seminary Press, Crestwood, New York, 1998)

We begin to see the wisdom of the Holy Spirit moving through Holy Mother Church in her gift of renewing within us the *timor dei*, that awe and reverence we should have for Our Lord and God, Christ Our Savior, King of the the Universe. It is to his heavenly Kingdom that we sojourn through this valley of death and because of him, we fear no evil. (Ps 23:4)

Christ himself is with us, present eternally: our joy in this world. When we join with the angels to sing the Sanctus (Holy, Holy Holy...) we acknowledge the heavenly throne hidden before us, the one which the Prophet Isaiah describes from his vision, "*I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garments filling the temple...seraphim were stationed above; each of them crying aloud to one another: Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of Hosts! All the earth is full of his glory!*" (Is 6:1) At this point in the Mass, we, all but the priest, kneel in the Lord's presence. Kneeling is a gesture of adoration. The priest directs our prayer to God the Father. The whole body is directing its prayer to the Father through the head, which is Christ. Christ the King offers his sacrifice, given once for all: his sacrifice and ours brought to his throne, that is the bread and wine, our monetary gifts, our prayers filled with hopes, joy, difficulties, and despair, joined with his: one gift. God is love. We are called into that communion, nurtured by that love. The frequency of the Mass attendance aids us in configuring our hearts to be like Christ's through the help of the Holy Spirit. It keeps Christ at the center of our lives, not using him as a commodity. God is love. We are called to share that love. 'cuz we love, we give.

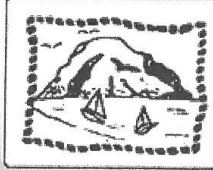
