Sunday, December 3, 2023

Come, Lord Jesus



Today's readings: Isaiah 63:16b–17, 19b; 64:2–7; Psalm 80:2–3, 15–16, 18–19; 1 Corinthians 1:3–9; Mark 13:33–37. The season of Advent (from the Latin *adventus* meaning “coming”) is a time to prepare for the coming of Christ. We anticipate three advents: the first is the historical coming of the Christ two thousand years ago; the second, the coming of Christ among us now; and the third advent, the hope of Christ coming again at the end of time.

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas. This year, it lands in early December, shortening our Advent season by an entire week. One of the best-known customs of the season is the Advent wreath. The circle of evergreens

symbolizes the eternal character of God's time and Christ's reach into our time to lead us to the light of everlasting life. The four candles on the wreath—three violet, one rose—mark our progress through the season. The rose candle is for the Third Sunday of Advent, called *Gaudete Sunday* after the first word of the entrance antiphon on that day, meaning “rejoice.” The day symbolizes our joy as we draw closer to the birth of Christ. Bless your Advent wreath with the lighting of the first violet candle, and as a prayerful entrance into Advent invoke today's psalm response: “Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved” (Psalm 80:4).



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, December 4

Say the Word

Today's Gospel relates a miracle performed by Jesus. Within the dialogue, the words of a Roman soldier become what we pray at Mass: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." The soldier understands that Jesus' words carry divine power. Throughout Advent, we follow the soldier's example of faith by assuming a stance of humility and openness to the work of the Lord. *Today's readings: Isaiah 2:1-5; Psalm 122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9; Matthew 8:5-11.*

Tuesday, December 5

The Shoot of Jesse

The Jesse tree is an Advent custom that helps us connect the festive practice of decorating Christmas trees to Jesus' biblical ancestors. Its name is derived from today's first reading, "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots" (Isaiah 11:1). Jesse, the father of King David, is often looked upon as the first person in the genealogy of Jesus. For your Jesse tree, start with a bare branch and hang a new ornament every day. These ornaments represent the individual figures from the Bible. They can be made from any material you choose. *Today's readings: Isaiah 11:1-10; Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17; Luke 10:21-24.*

Wednesday, December 6

St. Nicholas

St. Nicholas was the bishop of Myra (modern-day Turkey) in the fourth century. According to legend, he anonymously provided generous help to those in need. One story says he dropped bags of gold down the chimneys of poor families, widows, and orphans. Surprise family members with a stocking filled with gifts. Plan an anonymous gift for a person or agency in need this Advent. *Today's readings: Isaiah 25:6-10a; Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6; Matthew 15:29-37.*

Thursday, December 7

St. Ambrose

St. Ambrose served as the bishop of Milan during the fourth century. A brilliant theologian and doctor of the Church, St. Ambrose helped articulate the Christian faith through his writings. He is also remembered for a beautiful Advent carol, "O Come, Redeemer of the Earth." Create your own playlist of Advent music to keep your heart and mind firmly planted in the spirituality of preparation. *Today's readings: Isaiah 26:1-6; Psalm 118:1, 8-9, 19-21, 25-27a; Matthew 7:21, 24-27.*

Friday, December 8

Immaculate Conception

The Church sets aside today as a holyday of obligation, recognizing that Mary was conceived without original sin so that she could become the vessel to bear God made flesh. Today's Gospel highlights the fullness of grace given to Mary, by which she said *yes* to God's plan for her life. Advent is a perfect time to pray the joyful mysteries of the Rosary, from the mystery of the annunciation through the incarnation to the rearing of Jesus in faith. *Today's readings: Genesis 3:9-15, 20; Psalm 98:1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4; Ephesians 1:3-6, 11-12; Luke 1:26-38.*

Saturday, December 9

St. Juan Diego

On December 9, 1531, the Virgin Mary asked Juan Diego to tell the bishop that she desired a temple to be built on Tepeyac Hill in Mexico. From this place, she would hear the anguish of all who live in the region and respond with love, compassion, and protection. Hesitant to accept Juan Diego's account of Mary's appearance, the bishop requested a sign. Mary sent Juan Diego to pick roses where only desert plants grew. She arranged the roses in Juan's cloak and sent him back to the bishop. When Juan opened his tilma before the bishop, he discovered an image of the Virgin of Guadalupe imprinted on it. *Today's readings: Isaiah 30:19-21, 23-26; Psalm 147:1-2, 3-4, 5-6; Matthew 9:35-10:1, 5a, 6-8.*

Domingo, 3 de diciembre de 2023

Ven, Señor Jesús



Lecturas del día: Isaías 63:16b–17, 19b; 64:2–7; Salmo 80:2–3, 15–16, 18–19; 1 Corintios 1:3–9; Marcos 13:33–37.

El Adviento (del latín *adventus*, que significa “venido”) es cuando nos preparamos a la venida de Cristo. Anticipamos tres adventos: el primero es la venida histórica del Cristo de hace dos mil años; la segunda, la venida de Cristo entre nosotros ahora; la tercera, la esperanza de que Cristo vuelva al final de los tiempos.

El Adviento suele empezar el domingo más próximo a la fiesta de san Andrés (30 de noviembre). Este año tiene una semana menos al empezar a principios de diciembre. Una de las características de la temporada es la corona de Adviento.

El círculo verde de siemprevivas simboliza el carácter eterno del tiempo de Dios y cómo Cristo viene para encaminarnos a la luz de la vida eterna. Las cuatro velas de la corona —tres violetas, una rosa— indican el paso de la temporada. La vela rosa corresponde al tercer Domingo de Adviento, llamado domingo Gaudete por la primera palabra de la antífona de entrada de ese día; significa “regocíjense”. Este día nos regocijamos porque nos acercamos cada vez más al nacimiento de Cristo. Bendiga su corona de Adviento y encienda la primera vela violeta al orar este Adviento; medite la respuesta del salmo de hoy: “¡Oh Dios, vuélvete a nosotros, ilumina tu rostro y nos salvaremos!” (Salmo 80:4).



ESTA SEMANA EN CASA

Lunes, 4 de diciembre

Una palabra tuya

El evangelio de hoy narra un milagro de Jesús. Las palabras del centurión romano son las que oramos antes de recibir a Jesús en la Eucaristía: “Señor, no soy digno de que entres en mi casa, pero una palabra tuya bastará para sanarme”. El centurión sabe que la palabra de Jesús tiene poder divino. Durante el Adviento seguimos el ejemplo de fe del centurión al adoptar una actitud de humildad y de apertura a la labor sacra del Señor en el corazón y en la vida de uno y en el mundo. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 2:1-5; Salmo 122:1-2, 3-4, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9; Mateo 8:5-11.*

Martes, 5 de diciembre

El árbol de Jesé

En Adviento, relacionamos el árbol navideño con los ancestros bíblicos de Jesús y el árbol de Jesé. Su nombre proviene de la primera lectura de hoy: “Pero retoñará el tocón de Jesé, de su cepa brotará un vástago” (Isaías 11:1). A Jesé, padre del rey David, se le considera el primero de los antepasados de Jesús. Cada día cuelgue un adorno distinto en el árbol de Jesé, una rama a la vez. Estos adornos representan las figuras individuales de la Biblia. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 11:1-10; Salmo 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17; Lucas 10:21-24.*

Miércoles, 6 de diciembre

San Nicolás

Cuenta la leyenda que san Nicolás, obispo de Mira (Turquía) del siglo iv, ayudaba generosa y anónimamente a quienes menos tenían. Según otra versión, él dejaba caer bolsas de oro por las chimeneas de las familias más pobres. Sorprenda a su familia con “botas” o “calcetas” navideñas llenas de regalos. Este Adviento, haga un regalo anónimo a una persona o agencia que lo necesite. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 25:6-10a; Salmo 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6; Mateo 15:29-37.*

Jueves, 7 de diciembre

San Ambrosio

San Ambrosio fue un obispo de Milán del siglo iv. Brillante teólogo y doctor de la Iglesia, san Ambrosio ayudó a expresar la fe cristiana mediante sus escritos. También se le recuerda por el bello himno de Adviento, “Veni redemptor gentium” (Ven, Redentor de los pueblos). Elabore una lista de música de Adviento para sintonizar la mente y el corazón con la espiritualidad de los preparativos. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 26:1-6; Salmo 118:1, 8-9, 19-21, 25-27a; Mateo 7:21, 24-27.*

Viernes, 8 de diciembre

Inmaculada Concepción

La Iglesia ha declarado este día fiesta de guardar, en reconocimiento a que María fue concebida sin pecado original de modo que fuera el medio por el que Dios se hiciera humano. El evangelio de hoy enfatiza la gracia plena dada a María mediante la cual ella dijo *sí* al plan que Dios le tenía. El Adviento es el tiempo perfecto para meditar los misterios gozosos del Rosario, desde el de la anunciación, el de la encarnación hasta la educación en la fe de Jesús. *Lecturas del día: Génesis 3:9-15, 20; Salmo 98:1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4; Efesios 1:3-6, 11-12; Lucas 1:26-38.*

Sábado, 9 de diciembre

San Juan Diego

El 9 de diciembre de 1531 la Virgen María envió a Juan Diego ante el obispo con este mensaje: construir un templo en el cerro del Tepeyac. Desde allí ella escucharía los pesares de todos los lugareños y les respondería con amor, compasión y protección. El obispo dudó de Juan Diego y le pidió una señal. María mandó a éste y a recoger rosas donde sólo crecen plantas desérticas. Le acomodó las rosas en la tilma y lo despachó al obispo. Juan Diego la abrió ante el obispo, quien vio en ella la imagen impresa de la Virgen de Guadalupe. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 30:19-21, 23-26; Salmo 147:1-2, 3-4, 5-6; Mateo 9:35-10:1, 5a, 6-8.*

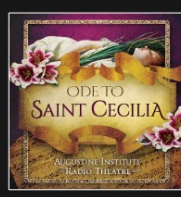

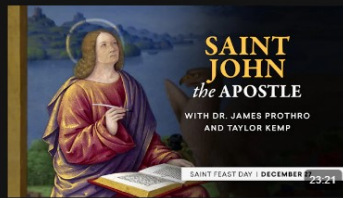

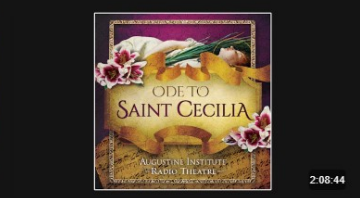

We read in Holy Scripture, *"I have love you with an everlasting love."* (Jer 31:3) God speaks to us elsewhere and says, *"I have called you by your name. You are mine. The waters will not drown you. Fire will not burn you. I will give up nations for you. You are precious to me. I love you. Even as a mother could forget her child, I will not forget you. I have carved you on the palm of my hand. You are precious to me. I love you."* (Is 43: 1-4, 49:15-16)

These are God's words to us. He knows us. Each one of us is precious and created for a special purpose.

Christ Jesus reveals himself at every Mass, the breaking of the bread, by offering the world God's divine love. The Eucharist is a Sacrament of charity.

In the Apostolic Exhortation from February 22, 2007, *Sacramentum Caritatis*, The Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI explains regarding the Eucharist, the Bread Come Down from Heaven, *"The first element of eucharistic faith is the mystery of God himself, trinitarian love. In Jesus' dialogue with Nicodemus, we find an illuminating expression in this regard: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn 3:16-17). These words show the deepest source of God's gift. In the Eucharist Jesus does not give us a "thing," but himself; he offers his own body and pours out his own blood. He thus gives us the totality of his life and reveals the ultimate origin of this love. He is the eternal Son, given to us by the Father."*

It is a gift of the Holy Trinity. It is the work of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: an outpouring of their love.

Pope Benedict continues, *"My Father gives you the true bread from heaven; for the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven, and gives life to the world" (Jn 6:32-33), and even identifies himself, his own flesh and blood, with that bread: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh" (Jn 6:51). Jesus thus shows that he is the bread of life which the eternal Father gives to mankind."*

God's world of salvation for humanity is not for one or two persons, but is available for all.

In the Mass after the Lord's Prayer, the priest, who through the entire liturgy to that point has been addressing his words either to the assembly or to God the Father. Now he addresses his prayer directly to Christ. It is a prayer for peace. Fr Jeremy Driscoll, OSB in his book, *What Happens at Mass*, states *"We can think of peace as another word for communion, another name for Christ's Body and Blood that we are about to receive. The prayer recalls our Lord's words at the Last Supper in which he himself in effect calls the Body and Blood by this other name, peace. He said, "I leave you peace, my peace I give you." (Jn 14:27)*

After the Sign of Peace and the reception of the Body of Christ by us who are the Body of Christ, we are truly fed and nourished by Christ through the mystery of the Sacrament. We are caught up in Sacred Silence. At first, earlier in the Mass there was a Sacred Silence at hearing God's voice. How much more profound this silence is! We are filled with awe. Our entire faith was concentrated in what just happened. The eternal Son of God, Christ Jesus just shared himself with us in a most intimate way. This is Christ *"the Son of God who loved me and gave himself up for me."* (Gal. 2:20)

We stand for the final prayer. The priest says, *'Peace be with you.'* We respond, *'And with your spirit.'* It is the third time during the Mass we say this, almost like Peter who must tell Jesus three times he loves Jesus after denying him three times. It is an act of the assembly to remind the priest of the grace within him in what he is about to do, namely to send us forth in Christ's name. *"As the Father has sent me, so I send you."* (Jn 20:21)

Just as God's charity draws us to be receivers of his love, we are given that shared Mission through the partaking of the Eucharist to go forth and share that divine love with others through the actions we take in our lives. *"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will remain."* (Jn 15:15-16) That fruit is love. 'cuz we love, we give.

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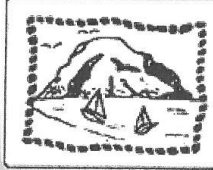
