Divine Mercy



Today's readings: Acts 2:42–47; Psalm 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; 1 Peter 1:3–9; John 20:19–31. During the Jubilee Year of 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina Kowalska and declared that the universal Church would henceforth observe the Sunday after Easter as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. As we end the Octave of Easter, we are invited to contemplate the mystery of the resurrection in the light of God's infinite mercy. The richness of God's mercy radiates through today's Scriptures and especially in Jesus' compassionate response toward Thomas' unbelief. The gift of mercy is explicitly given when Jesus commissions his disciples as ministers of divine mercy: "He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you

forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained'" (John 20:22–23). Through entrusting the first disciples with the gift of forgiving sins, Jesus initiated a waterfall of mercy for all of humanity.

Sr. Faustina repeatedly heard a call to proclaim God's mercy to the world. She promoted the chaplet of divine mercy to raise spiritual awareness of God's mercy. Today, many Catholics will visit shrines devoted to divine mercy and pray the chaplet of divine mercy. Our Church announces to the world that God is merciful and that we are invited to rest in his loving embrace. May our hearts grow more aware of the mercy of God in our lives. In turn, may we actively show mercy to those who need it most.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 17

Follow Acts

A reading from Acts is proclaimed on nearly each day of the Easter season. Written as a continuance of his Gospel account, Luke paints the broad strokes of the Church's development from the resurrection of Jesus to Paul's first imprisonment. Luke emphasizes the powerful role of the Holy Spirit in the formation of the Christian community and the spread of the Word of God. Read Acts through to gain a perspective of how this period unfolded. *Today's readings: Acts 4:23–31; Psalm 2:1–3, 4–7a, 7b–9; John 3:1–8.*

Tuesday, April 18

Everyone Had Enough

The early Christian community laid the groundwork for upholding the common good by placing their treasure in a common purse to be shared fairly across the community. As a result, everyone had enough. Religious communities and some other intentional Christian communities follow this practice to this day. The care for the whole community supersedes the wants of the individual. While this ideal may seem radical to our modern way of thinking, there is much to be learned. How can you more intentionally share from our wealth with the most vulnerable in society? *Today's readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; John 3:7b–15.*

Wednesday, April 19

Walk in the Light

During the Advent season as we await the birth of Christ, the prophet Isaiah announces, “The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light” (Isaiah 9:1). Jesus himself proclaims, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life” (John 8:12). In today's Gospel reading, Jesus equates light with the eternal power of good and dark with the power of evil. As Christians, we are invited to walk in the light,

to seek the truth, and to practice goodness. *Today's readings: Acts 5:17–26; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; John 3:16–21.*

Thursday, April 20

Obey God

When confronted by the temple leaders about their bold preaching, Peter and the apostles reply, “We must obey God” (Acts 5:29). The Latin root of the word *obey* means “listen” or “hear.” This is powerful instruction for us today. There are so many loud and competing voices in the world. As Christians, we are charged to listen to the voice of God. Attending carefully to the preaching of the apostles in Acts and the speeches of Jesus in the Gospel of John will strengthen the words of truth in our hearts and help drown out all others. *Today's readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.*

Friday, April 21

My Light and My Salvation

Our responsorial psalm for today captures the essence of Easter faith. We keep our eyes glued on the Lord throughout our earthly life with hope that we will rest in the house of the Lord for all of eternity. Carry Psalm 27 in your pocket, tape it on your bathroom mirror, and pray it daily until you have it memorized. It will carve a path to holiness. *Today's readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.*

Saturday, April 22

Miracles Abound

We hear of two powerful miracles in today's readings. Acts relates that the number of those in Jerusalem coming to believe in Jesus “increased greatly” (Acts 6:7). John's Gospel recounts how Jesus rejoined the disciples in the boat by walking across the water. Which miracle stirs your heart more: the exponential number of people coming to faith or Jesus walking across the sea? Take it to prayer. *Today's readings: Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.*

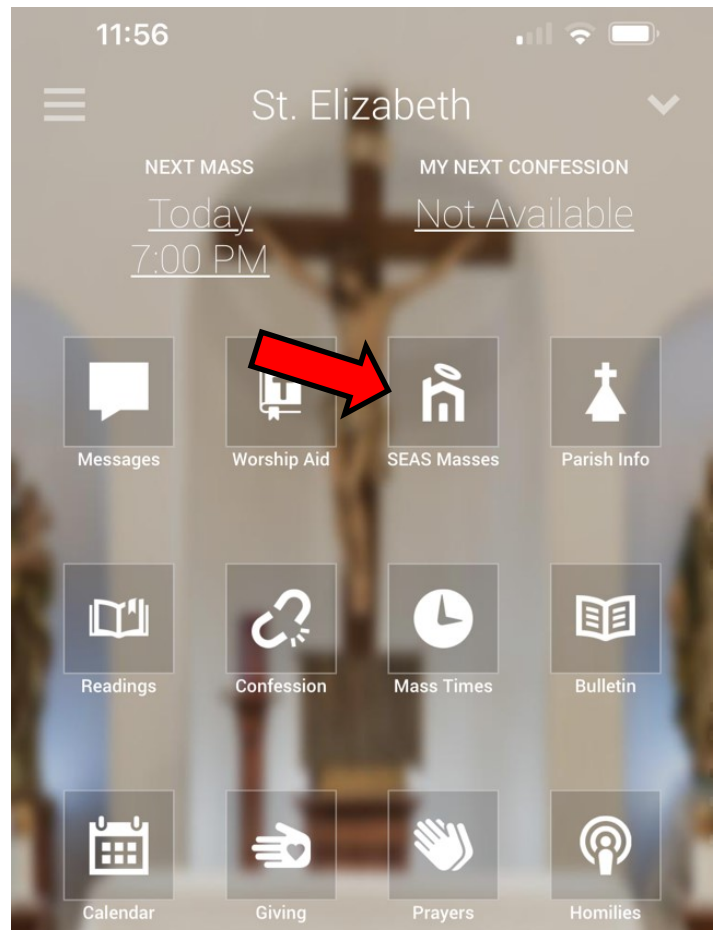

Holy Week offers a myriad of behind-the-scenes preparation and constant cleaning for each of our liturgical services.

This year at Easter Vigil we celebrated two adult Baptisms. The preparation for the adult Baptism started over two years ago with weekly classes and learning about who we are as a community that portrays Christ to one another so that they could have an example of how to live a Christian life and be supported in their faith journey. Preparation for the Rite of Christian Initiation is a unique but very important aspect of the preparation for the Easter Vigil reflecting the dynamic character of the Holy Spirit infusing life within the Church.

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week. Both the palms and Easter Candle need to be ordered months in advance, usually just after Christmas to be placed on back order to ensure they arrive in time for Holy Week.

Holy Oils were received by our parish at the Chrism Mass on Tuesday of Holy Week. With the priests of the Diocese gathered and representatives from every parish in the Diocese, the oils of the Sick, oil of Catechumen, and oil of Chrism were presented separately to Bishop Danny who blessed them and prayed over them invoking the Holy Spirit, and then he breathed on them, yet another sign of the love and grace bestowed by our Lord to all who will receive them sacramentally. These Holy Oils were presented on Holy Thursday Mass by those adults, Kersten Iverson and Clayton Hartwell who were Baptized at Easter and also by Getzmezany Ruiz Nunez, our current adult Confirmation Candidate, who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at Mission SLO on April 29th: please keep all of them in your prayers.

Yellow and white bouquets adorned the altar on

Holy Thursday were arranged weeks in advance and were able to be used at the Baptismal font and the second was placed in the Chapel on Holy Saturday.

Our parish Confirmation classes annually help with the carrying of the bowls, water and towels for Holy Thursday Mass. They are also responsible for lighting the luminaries that light our way during the procession to the altar of repose. This year we have thirteen 1st Yr. and four 2nd Yr. students. Although school and sports are in session, we are grateful to those young people who were able to help.

With the young people, our Elect, our lectors, our extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, altar servers, those helping with the procession, those who would help with the altar of repose, and all the others who helped, we needed to hold a practice before the Mass. Jonniepat Mobley guided everyone through

the Mass during our practice so that we would be more confident in knowing the flow for the Mass that night.

Friday of the Passion of the Lord of Good Friday as we often call it always leads to the question of which cross will be used for veneration during the liturgy. Last year a small cross was used. During our outdoor parking lot Masses we used the large cross. This year it was decided that we would use the one from the altar itself. Jeff Lambert was called forth from the crowd to help carry Jesus' Cross, and quipped that he knew exactly what Simon (from the Gospel) felt when he did the same. He was not the only one to be asked for help at the last moment. Bob Villa was gracious to help initially with the table and then briefly with the cross before turning it back over to Lambert and Javier Soto so that Villa could help with the candle stands around our Crucified Lord. Terri Warren also helped Heather Hurley to set-up the table for the crucifix.

All catechism classes, members of both Spanish and English choirs, and others were asked for help on Holy Saturday. With short notice, we did not expect many people, but are grateful to Estela Roman, Pat West, Javier Soto Osorio, Angelina Martiñon, Alma Aranda, and Heather Hurley for your help that Saturday morning in cleaning and preparing the church and chapel. Lunch was catered by Phil and Sylvia Radford.

The attendance was high. Our church was full at each Mass like it was prior to COVID.

On Sunday both Masses had hospitality provided by our parish in gratitude to our Lord, and catered by parishioner Alma Pineda's company, Pinedas 805 Taco. It was enjoyed by many. Thanks again to everyone!
