Come Holy Spirit!



Today's readings: Acts 2:1–11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29–30, 31, 34; 1 Corinthians 12:3b–7, 12–13; Sequence: Veni Sancte Spiritus; John 20:19–23. With the celebration of Pentecost, we have traveled on a ninety-day journey since Ash Wednesday. Throughout Lent we watched for signposts in the Scriptures directing our hearts toward God. At Easter we committed (some of us for the first time and the rest of us once again) to our journey of faith in the risen Christ. As we journeyed through the weeks of Easter, Jesus continually beckoned us to remain close and promised to give us the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will bind us to one another and to God.

The promised gift of the Holy Spirit is affirmed on Pentecost. Before today's Gospel, we acclaim, "Come, Holy

Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love." The gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord—assure us that God is cultivating and nurturing us to life within him. We carry the Holy Spirit within us and radiate that Spirit to all we meet. With the Spirit dwelling within us, we are always close to God. Today this truth of our faith is celebrated!

Take time this week to note the gifts of the Holy Spirit that you depend upon the most. Pray for a strengthening of the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help you on your daily walk as a disciple of the risen Christ. Come Holy Spirit!



THIS WEEK AND BEYOND

Monday, May 29

Mary, Mother of the Church

In 2018, Pope Francis added the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, to the liturgical calendar, placing it on the Monday after Pentecost. This memorial honors Mary in the role that she assumed at the foot of the cross with Jesus' final words to her, "Woman, behold your Son." Venerate Mary today by praying the glorious mysteries of the Rosary. *Today's readings: Genesis 3:9–15, 20 or Acts 1:12–14; Psalm 87:1–2, 3, 5, 6–7; John 19:25–34.*

Tuesday, May 30

Keep Calm, It's Ordinary Time

With the end of our ninety-day journey from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost Sunday, the Church enters the season of Ordinary Time. Do not mistake this season for being *ordinary* as in *routine*. In this season, *ordinary* refers to *ordered* or *counted* time. The Church is now in the Eighth Week in Ordinary Time. Change your prayer space colors to green and reflect on how you can grow spiritually as you decipher God in your life in the graced weeks ahead. *Today's readings: Sirach 35:1–12; Psalm 50:5–6, 7–8, 14 and 23; Mark 10:28–31.*

Wednesday, May 31

The Visitation

The Church devotes May to the devotion of Mary, so it is fitting that the last day of the month in the West is a feast day in her honor. In today's Gospel, we hear Mary proclaim the words of the Magnificat, which the Church prays as part of the Liturgy of the Hours every evening. Pray the Magnificat as part of your grace before meals or at the close of your day. *Today's readings: Zephaniah 3:14–18a or Romans 12:9–16; Isaiah 12:2–3, 4bcd, 5–6; Luke 1:39–56.*

Thursday, June 1

St. Justin, Martyr

Justin converted to Christianity in the second century after years of study, prayer, and reflection. A lover of philosophy and vocal defender of the faith, Justin was martyred for his steadfast adherence to Christianity. During your prayer time, remember all who received the initiation sacraments at the Easter Vigil and pray that they have the resilience to remain steadfast in their faith. *Today's readings: Sirach 42:15–25; Psalm 33:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; Mark 10:46–52.*

Friday, June 2

Growth during Ordinary Time

Ultimately, our Christian mission is to help others grow in an authentic and meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ. Each of us must be able to confidently answer Jesus' inquiry, "Who do you say that I am," with a conviction of faith. Take some time to look back over your spiritual journey since Ash Wednesday and then look forward to the coming weeks in Ordinary Time. How have you grown in your relationship with Christ through your daily attention to the Gospel and how do you hope to deepen your faith in the days and weeks ahead? *Today's readings: Sirach 44:1, 9–13; Psalm 149:1b–2, 3–4, 5–6a and 9b; Mark 11:11–26.*

Saturday, June 3

Triune Unity


Tomorrow the Church commemorates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This observance is a reminder that God desires to be close to us. God's ecstatic love for the world overflows in the gift of the Son and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We explicitly unite ourselves with the mystery of the holy Trinity every time we mark our bodies with the sign of the cross. Try to make the sign of the cross with more intentionality. Allow this gesture that we repeat so often to be a poignant reminder of our unbreakable unity with God. May your faith journey through Ordinary Time be abundantly blessed. *Today's readings: Sirach 51:12cd–20; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Mark 11:27–33.*

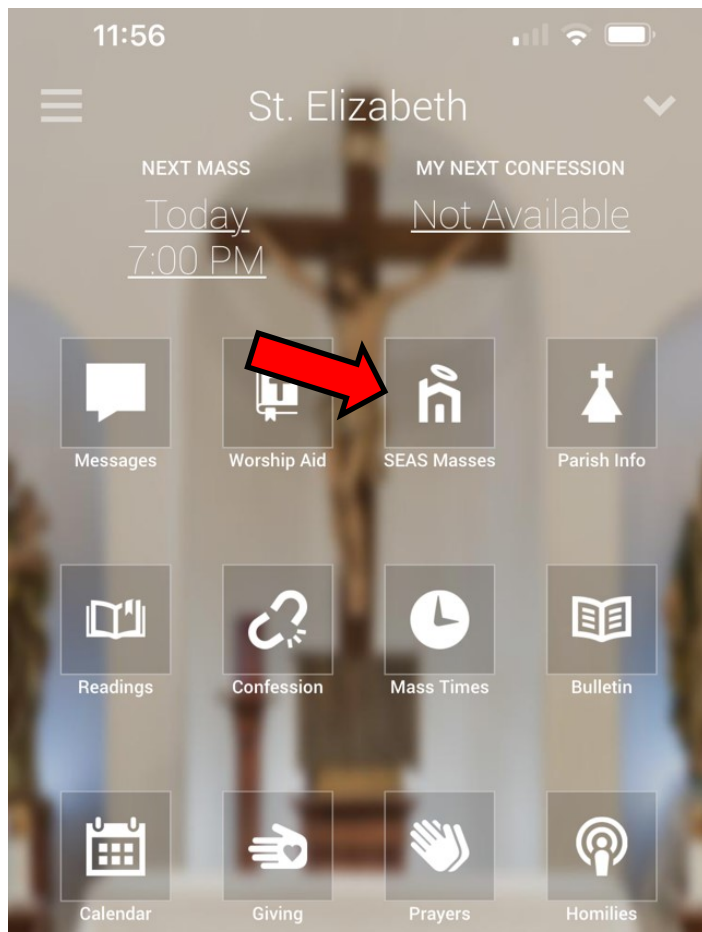

FELICITOUS FENCING FOR SAFETY AND SECURITY

On Friday, May 26th Fr. Joey led members of the parish Liturgy Committee to the patio area behind the community room to view the new security fence and the remains of the damaged areas from the person who raced through our property on May 16th.

Imagine frequent nights where you'd wake up to screeching tires from drag racing; lights zooming across the property on which you live; sudden darkness as the lights go out because someone has tapped into your electricity; gathering of cars for late night and early morning rendezvous; and waking up to stashes of drugs hidden in plants; electrical outlets broken, needing electricians to repair lights; security cameras turned away from what they are supposed to be watching; black streaks across your driveway, parking lot and curbs when the drivers could not fully



make a turn. Every morning our office staff will walk the church property near the buildings to check for damage that may have occurred at night.

After the incident on May 16th, office manager Javier Soto was informed that the Highway Patrol,

who handles car related issues, will no longer make reports unless there is physical property damage to buildings or other edifice.

Undesirable activity, as aforementioned, happens mostly at night, but there have also been incidents of vehicles passing

through our property during the day. The May 16th incident was the 3rd time in about a year that someone has driven between the office and gas meter area, most vehicle trespassing usually it occurs in our Stations of the Cross Prayer Garden.

Our greatest fear is that an incident could occur during a gathering when children are present like during Sunday hospitality or catechism. There are also a number of groups who use our parish hall and families who travel through on their way to

the library whose safety we also must recognize. The May 16th incident was the last straw. Fr. Joey made the decision to protect our parish and friends. Our parish neighbors have voiced their support.

The funding for the fence is from the building fund: the funding for the roof is untouched. Soto, who also serves as partial bookkeeper and chief groundskeeper at the parish, mentioned at the Liturgy Committee Meeting that the building funds specifically used are from the remainder of the Penwell Fund which had been set aside so that interest could be earned from it; the interest is what has been used for our parish building and maintenance along with your donations. Principal was taken from the Penwell fund for the fencing because it is a need. The Penwell family were parishioners who donated a portion of their estate when they died years ago to directly benefit our parish.

Besides improved safety and greater sense of security, another benefit has been noticed: the wind across the back has been diminished, which is a benefit when we have our parish celebrations. The fence also offers a place to anchor the tents we use for hospitality and the festival.

ALWAYS ON THE CUTTING EDGE

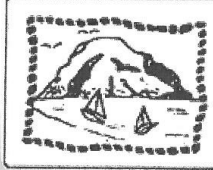
