Pope Francis earlier this month the Church gathered as he welcomed youth from around the world to World Youth Day, in Lisbon, Portugal. He said as a reminder to all in person and virtual, “God is calling you by name.”

Recall from Luke 12:7, “*Are not five sparrows sold for two small coins? Yet not one of them has escaped the notice of God. Even the hairs of your head have all been counted. Do not be afraid. You are worth more than many sparrows.*”

God loves us all so much. How do we respond? Are we like St. Peter who when Jesus asked, “Who do you say that I am?” confessed “*You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.*”

Our Holy Mother the Church teaches us that we are beloved children; that our Father in heaven loves us beyond all measure. At the center of this teaching, this catechesis or re-echoing of our faith, we find Jesus Christ, “*the only Son of the Father...who suffered and died for us, and who now after rising is living with us forever...and to catechize aims at putting people in communion with Jesus Christ: only he can lead us to the love of the Father in the Spirit and make us share in the life of the Holy Trinity.*” CCC 426

And so, if Jesus stands before us as asks, ‘Who do you say that I am?’ What would we say? What is our immediate response? How do we tackle that question in this day and age filled with military coups, wars, assassinations, raging wildfires, political divisions, etc. It is overwhelming. Is it any wonder why people ask where God is?

And yet, here stands the Holy Mother Church, like a beacon of hope standing at the foot of the Cross, she accepts those like John who are mournful, despondent, and lost, and takes them, takes us, close to herself as her children. A mother’s love knows no bounds. Our Mother the Church comforts, gives of herself, and leads us to Christ.

What Saint has lived in an age without war and strife? Let us look toward Saints within Holy Mother Church who have answered that question “Who do you say that I am?” Our examples are great! From St. Peter in this weekend’s Gospel to more modern Saints like Mother St. Theresa who famously said that she is “*Seeking the face of God in eve-*

rything, everyone, all the time, and his hand in every happening; This is what it means to be contemplative in the heart of the world. Seeing and adoring the presence of Jesus, especially in the lowly appearance of bread, and in the distressing disguise of the poor.”

God is truly present. God loves you. God loves us. **God is love.** (1Jn 4:8) We may ask then why evil exists. What does our Holy Mother teach us about it? Her preliminary reply: “*Only Christian faith as a whole constitutes the answer to this question: the goodness of creation, the drama of sin and the patient love of God who comes to meet man by his covenants, the redemptive Incarnation of his Son, his gift of the Spirit, his gathering of the Church, the power of the sacraments and his call to a blessed life to which free creatures are invited to consent in advance, but from which, by a terrible mystery, they can also turn away in advance. There is not a single aspect of the Christian message that is not in part an answer to the question of evil.*” CCC 309

World Youth Day had various activities for the youth during the week, Jimena, a Spanish youth who had been blind since she was 14 years old was able to go. As quoted by the Catholic News Agency (Aug. 8th, 2023 by Almudena Martinez-Bordiu), she shared, “*I opened my eyes and I could see perfectly,*” said she miraculously recovered her sight on Saturday, August 15th after receiving the Eucharist at Fátima, Portugal, during a Mass there.” *The incident is under investigation.*

Through Holy Mother Church and her lens of faith we have a way to answer the question, “Who do you say I am?” In the face of the darkness of this world, which Pope St. John Paul II called a ‘Culture of Death,’ we look to Christ, the Son of the Living God, and join in his mission, which St. Mother Theresa so clearly expressed as *Seeking the face of God in everything, everyone, all the time, and his hand in every happening.* So look around at the love shared at Mass, within our families, within the generous outpouring to our neighbors in need, including Holy Mother Church who wraps her mantle in a special way. You are loved. We are loved. We love. So, ‘coz we love, we give.



This is not so much about an encounter with the Eucharist as about an encounter *about* the Eucharist and the epiphany it produced.

Recently I was given a book about the Eucharist written by a very wise and learned Catholic apologist. In it, the writer, a bishop, quotes from and explicates citations from other very wise and learned men—G.K. Chesterton, C.S. Lewis and Saint Thomas Aquinas, among others. The Style of the writing is trenchant, often requiring reflection, and yet I understood it all. Not because I'm so smart, but because I had the blessing and grace of being taught by nuns and priests from grade school through college, taught not only *things*, but how to *analyze* things. Praise God for Catholic education.

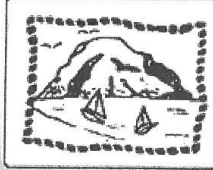
