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





Life" (Jn. 14:6). When we follow Jesus, we are following His where it was also picked up by some Protestant reformers, Way, which is Love. We are able to love because Jesus like John Calvin. The concept of the Church as our mother loved us first (see 1 Jn. 4:10). From our love of God, we is also stated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, are able to give. Sometimes this can be a challenge, a sacrifice."

Mary, the Mother of God, knew about love and sacrifice. Mary sacrificed her entire life, configuring her will to the will of God and his salvific plan. Sacrificing her only son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, for the salvation of the whole world displays the greatness and magnanimity of Marv. She loved her son dearly and stayed with him even until his last breath. She loved God the Father so much that she gave this Sacrifice. When we reflect on Mary's life, we see an example of true Christian motherhood. Consider this:

"Those who have been called to be mothers have been blessed by God and called to fulfill a very important responsibility. Mothers are the vehicle through which God brings new life into this world. When we talk about Christian stewardship, we talk about sacrificially returning to God what we have been given ... Although the relationship may change to some extent after the child is born, a mother's sacrifice for her child is far from over after birth. The role of the mother is critical in the child's development, both spiritually and physically throughout life. Mothers provide the comfort, nurture and support necessary for their children to become productive citizens and responsible Christians."

(from Catholicsteward.com, Mothers and Stewardship)

Isn't it interesting then, that the Catholic Church is considered our mother? St. Cyprian, a third-century bishop, famously said, "No one can have God as Father who does not have the Church as Mother." The idea of Church as er? Do we love and give to our Mother as much as we do Mother was used throughout the early Church Fathers and for our neighbor and ourselves? 'Cuz we love, we give.

"Jesus told us that He is "the Way, the Truth, and the continued during the Middle Ages and into the Reformation where it says: CCC #169 "Salvation comes from God alone; but because we receive the life of faith through the Church, she is our mother."

> Tish Harrison Warren on May 21, 2015 wrote, The Church Your Mom, for Christianity Today:

"The historic symbol of the church as mother is replete (dare I say pregnant) with meaning: we receive the gospel through the church just as we receive life through our mother; in many traditions, word and sacrament are said to nourish and feed us just as mothers nourish infants through their very bodies; and, extending the Pauline metaphor, the church is historically addressed as the "bride-mother," through which the Spirit bears life to all the world. A French hymn proclaims, "Now Christ, the Model of what all may be, has taken Church, our mother, for his bride...His love is she."

Through her love for us, Our Mother the Church gives us life and we are spiritually reborn in her through our Baptism and nourished through the Eucharist and the rest of her Sacraments. Within her is the seed of life. Like a mother, the Church hopes for us, plans for us, for our future and wanting the best for us, which is salvation, and so she teaches us our faith, and fertilizing us with the gifts of grace. The most visible representation of the church for many is the Magisterium, that is the Pope and our Bishops, the Diocesan offices, and our priests at our parishes. We, the laity, are also the Church: in our Creed we process that the Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic.

The Eucharist is like water and air for me, which I need in order to exist. When I take the host in my mouth I caress it with my lips and my mouth and I take care of each movement because I don't want to mistreat my Lord God; and I enjoy the Blessed Eucharist so much in my mouth, like the best delicacy that my mouth has ever had or tasted.

I feel that the more I know the things of God and I abandon myself to him, I realize very beautiful things that I did not know existed before.


I thank God because he has allowed me to know him and have him in my life.

Fr. Paul Farrelly, O.S.B., son of parishioner Ann Farrelly, has been very gracious these last few weeks presiding at our Monday and Thursday Masses, and sometimes others, while Fr. Edwin Limpiado, regular presider for those days, has been away. Thank you, Fr. Paul!

On Friday, August 4th our parish held its usual 1st Friday Anointing of the Sick at both the 9am English and 7pm Spanish Masses.

The turnout for these Masses has been growing steadily over the last few months causing our 1st Friday Masses to be held in the church in stead of the Adoration Chapel.

Fr. Joey reminded everyone at the Friday evening Mass that those who should be Anointed are those who are chronically ill, like people with Diabetes, the elderly, and children with fever. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not meant for those who are healthy. Those who are preparing for surgery, those afflicted with serious injury or illness, the weakened elderly, and the ill children may receive the Anointing of the Sick.

Catholic Answers includes: The fact is that the effect of the anointing of the sick is precisely the removal of the remains of sin (the fomes, or "kindling") in the soul in view of death and final judgment. Long time parishioner, Mary Fraga, died last Sunday. Her granddaughter, Emily, came to Hospitality last Sunday to share the sad news with her friends at S.E.A.S. Mary so loved our parish and all here.

At 97 Mary was ever ready to help our parish in whatever way we needed. many consecutive For years, she provided all the prizes for the children's prize room at the Int'l Festival. If we needed landscaping rocks; or if she thought watermelons could be used for Hospitality (and she would drive to Lemoore for them!); or if she thought the staff needed TLC she would make it happen. Even in the last few weeks, Mary would ask about the parish and offer ideas, & asked about friends from 9am Mass.
