In the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 18, we hear Jesus teaching about the economy of salvation. He is doing the Father’s work of bringing the Good News to the people and calling them to repentance so that they may be reconciled to the Father. Jesus does this through several examples, first of placing a child in the midst of the disciples and telling them to humble themselves like that child. Next he warns them against the near temptation to sin because it can take us further away from salvation and the Kingdom of Heaven. Then he shares the story of the Lost Sheep and how wonderful the Father’s love and mercy that not one should be lost. Jesus continues teaching and explains further how we should treat each other, by reconciling with each other—a precursor to reconciling to the Father, and if not reconciliation, then coming to peace with one another. Matthew shares Christ Jesus’ words with us, entrusting them to us and challenging us to live them, just as Jesus originally challenges all his disciples, of which we are. Saint Paul in his letter to the Corinthians (2 Cor 5:19) reminds us, “*God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.*”

Holy Mother Church continues to nourish us with these lessons, so that through our love for others we will give of ourselves as witness to Christ and as partakers in his Mission on earth. Sometimes we can feel challenged and like there is nothing we can do to spread that love because sometimes things of this world can be consuming and eat away at us, at our souls. It is in those times that we rely on Christ the most and let the warmth of our Holy Mother the Church wrap her arms around us through the entire Body of Christ.

There is now an entire generation who was born after September 11, 2001 when four coordinated Islamist terrorist attacks were carried out by nineteen people against the United States killing thousands of people when three airliners smashed into the World Trade Center towers, the Pentagon, and Flight 93 crashed into a field in Pennsylvania. Pope at the time, St. John Paul II, a Polish survivor of WW II was greatly affected by the sad event, as we all were. He

addressed the world the very next day saying in this excerpt:

“Yesterday was a dark day in the history of humanity, a terrible affront to human dignity. After receiving the news, I followed with intense concern the developing situation, with heartfelt prayers to the Lord. How is it possible to commit acts of such savage cruelty? The human heart has depths from which schemes of unheard-of ferocity sometimes emerge, capable of destroying in a moment the normal daily life of a people. But faith comes to our aid at these times when words seem to fail. Christ’s word is the only one that can give a response to the questions which trouble our spirit. Even if the forces of darkness appear to prevail, those who believe in God know that evil and death do not have the final say. Christian hope is based on this truth; at this time our prayerful trust draws strength from it.”

The bountiful mercy of the God the Father showed through his children as they aided the survivors in the ashes and rubble that day, and in the subsequent days when we, the Body of Christ, was present to those who needed to talk about it, share how they felt, and mourn through the guidance of our Holy Mother the Church in the US, through the direction of the USCCB. We are loved. ‘coz we love, we give.



It's (The Eucharist is) really about receiving God himself in a special inexplicable way, and I want to dip into theology here because it is not magic. But to some people, it's not special because when you receive it there are not flashing lights, no fanfare.

And so we know there is some kind of mysterious and profound stuff happening. So, receiving the Eucharist at Mass is to say, partaking in the Last Supper; and the Eucharist is God and the priest is really Jesus Christ, and it is really happening.

It's one of those opportunities to remind oneself about what God did and everything he gave up for our sake. And so it's both celebration and a, well, like a feast, a spiritual nourishment: Given like a degree to which all these wondrous aspects of the Eucharist, to the degree that we seek and want them. It's like Jesus says, "to the degree that you measure, it will be measured out to you." So essentially the degree to which one participates in the Mass and receiving the Eucharist dictates to what one receives. Guess you'd also call that openness.

It's also about, really, like being. It reminds us to experience what Love is, who is Love, who Loves us, and our being filled with that Love to the point of wanting to go out and share it. That is really a big part of what the Eucharist is about.

An image of Servant of God, Cora Louise Evans, 20th century Catholic mystic and first person from our Diocese to begin the process for Sainthood thanks in part to the late Bishop Richard Garcia, has been hanging in our parish Sacristy since Fr. Joey first arrived. Several have noticed her name used for intercessory prayer at Mass recently.

In 2011 the cause for Cora Evan's Saint hood was officially opened by Bishop Rich Garcia. In 2012 the Vatican granted nihil obstat authorizing the Cause for Beatification and Canonization to proceed. Cora's life, writings and the miraculous cures attributed to Cora Evan's intercession are being investigated (past and current) as part of her cause for Sainthood. This intercessory prayer was granted the Imprimatur for use of the Faithful:

Dear Jesus, You blessed Cora Evans with many supernatural mystical gifts as a means of drawing us to a deeper and more intimate union with your Sacred Heart through Your Divine Indwelling, Your Mystical Humanity. I ask You through her intercession to help me in my special request (name the favor) and my efforts to do Your will here on earth and be with You, Your Blessed Mother, Saint Joseph and the whole Court of Heaven forever.

Say three times: the Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be to the Father

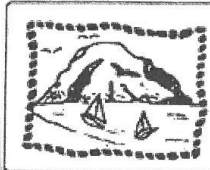
FIREFIIGHTERS ARE TRAINING
