### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

**Q: Is S.E.A.S. a nonprofit?**

**A:** Yes! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is a church and is a 501 (c)(3). Donations are tax deductible.

**Q: Do you accept stocks?**

**A:** Yes. We can accept stocks and bonds as donation.

**Q: Can I ask my employer to be a matching donor?**

**A:** Yes. Often businesses are willing to match their employee contributions to different causes.

**Q: May I give a small amount now, and more later?**

**A:** Absolutely! Your direct donations are being recorded for tax purposes. Your accrued total donations determine the tier for which you will be recognized.

**Q: What are some of the fundraising events for this coming year to support TARPS OFF!**

**A:** Tentative ideas are Tamale sales, Dinner & Dance, Live Auctions, Ballroom Dance, Kermes, etc. Some are already in the planning stages, some not yet.

**Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?**

**A:** The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611	Collected as of March 20, 2023
\$ 19, 082	Wall Cross Fundraiser
\$ 20, 690	Insurance Payment (for walls)

**Q: What happened to that money collected?**

**A:** That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

**Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?**

**A:** Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

**Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?**

**A:** Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

**Q: How much does the parish hope to keep in savings?**

**A:** It is recommended that the parish keep at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses. The more of course is better.

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It has been a month since Christmas when we celebrated the birth of Jesus, God made man, the Light of the World. Although Christmas has passed, Christ remains ever present in a special way to his Church through the Eucharist. (CCC 1380) It may seem like the Lord entered our time, time created for man and made from the things of nature like the turning of the planet and movement of the stars. However, if we contemplate Christ present with us, we find it is a religious experience more than a historical experience. It is a moment of insight wherein we come to know God better and an indelible impression is inscribed upon our souls. If we fixate on the world around us, if we lose our sense of these holy moments when we know God in the present, then we create obstacles that take away what is holy in our lives.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, a leading Jewish theologian, in the prologue of his book, *The Sabbath* (Farrar, Straws & Young, New York, 1951) explains that we are all called to sanctify time by our actions and prayers, especially for us who are joined to Christ Jesus in the sharing of his ministry through our Baptism. Heschel, writing at the end of World War II, keenly indicates "The Sabbaths are our Greatest Cathedrals; and our Holy of Holies is a shrine that neither the Romans nor Germans were able to burn; a shrine that not even apostasy can easily obliterate: the Day of Atonement...not the day itself, but the 'Essence of the Day.'" (p8) That essence is everlasting, holy, and not of this world of nature, but of God. We gravitate toward God and are perfected through Christ with the help of the Holy Spirit in alignment with the Father's will. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains similarly:

"The Church . . . will receive its perfection only in the glory of heaven," at the time of Christ's glorious return. Until that day, "the Church progresses on her pilgrimage amidst this world's persecutions and God's conso-

lations."...The Church is in history, but at the same time she transcends it. It is only "with the eyes of faith"183 that one can see her in her visible reality and at the same time in her spiritual reality as bearer of divine life." (CCC 769-770)

We must look beyond this world and to allow our hearts to be open to transcending the created nature surrounding us in order for God to mold us into that which is holy and Divine. We do this by being partakers of Christ's mission on earth. We cannot have Faith and not be sharers of Christ's mission. We must share God's holy love and mercy with others. St. James reminds us, "What good is it, dear brothers, and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone?" (Jas 2:14) If we do not pray, if we are not just, of loving, or moved to act, then how are we helping to move ourselves and the Church closer to that perfection when the essence of that Day is found holy? Jesus gave us parables to teach us that the world is ever changing and passing and to teach us to act, and let go of unimportant things of the world.

In Luke 12: 16-21 Jesus presents the parable of the rich man who yielded an abundant harvest but had nowhere to put it so he built two silos for the harvest thinking that he would have years of abundance ahead of him. However, that was not to be the case because he died.

In Mt. 19: 16-30 Jesus gives us another parable of the rich young man who followed all the Commandments but was unwilling to let go of his possessions to follow the Lord.

Do you keep holy the Sabbath? Do you keep Christ at the center of your life? Are you willing to give from your abundance of what you have? Are you willing to give freely? Do you live with one foot on the earth and the other in heaven? Are you like the man with the harvest or the rich young man? If so, what things can you do to do to better follow Christ? 'cuz we love, we give!

## ***ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA***

OF HIS HOLINESS  
**POPE JOHN PAUL II**

The Church was born of the paschal mystery. For this very reason the Eucharist, which is in an outstanding way the sacrament of the paschal mystery, stands at the centre of the Church's life. This is already clear from the earliest images of the Church found in the Acts of the Apostles: "They devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (2:42). The "breaking of the bread" refers to the Eucharist. Two thousand years later, we continue to relive that primordial image of the Church. At every celebration of the Eucharist, we are spiritually brought back to the paschal Triduum: to the events of the evening of Holy Thursday, to the Last Supper and to what followed it. The institution of the Eucharist sacramentally anticipated the events which were about to take place, beginning with the agony in Gethsemane. Once again we see Jesus as he leaves the Upper Room, descends with his disciples to the Kidron valley and goes to the Garden of Olives. Even today that Garden shelters some very ancient olive trees. Perhaps they witnessed what happened beneath their shade that evening, when Christ in prayer was filled with anguish "and his sweat became like drops of blood falling down upon the ground" (cf. Lk 22:44). The blood which shortly before he had given to the Church as the drink of salvation in the sacrament of the Eucharist, began to be shed; its outpouring would then be completed on Golgotha to become the means of our redemption: "Christ... as high priest of the good things to come..., entered once for all into the Holy Place, taking not the blood of goats and calves but his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption" (Heb 9:11- 12)...(EE 3)

In the paschal event and the Eucharist which makes it present throughout the centuries, there is a truly enormous "capacity" which embraces all of history as the recipient of the grace of the redemption. This amazement should always fill the Church assembled for the celebration of the Eucharist. But in a special way it should fill the minister of the Eucharist. For it is he who, by the authority given him in the sacrament of priestly ordination, effects the consecration. It is he who says with the power coming to him from Christ in the Upper Room: "This is my body which will be given up for you This is the cup of my blood, poured out for you...". The priest says these words, or rather he puts his voice at the disposal of the One who spoke these words in the Upper Room and who desires that they should be repeated in every generation by all those who in the Church ministerially share in his priesthood...(EE n 5)

The Church constantly draws her life from the redeeming sacrifice; she approaches it not only through faith-filled remembrance, but also through a real contact, since this sacrifice is made present ever anew, sacramentally perpetuated, in every community which offers it at the hands of the consecrated minister. The Eucharist thus applies to men and women today the reconciliation won once for all by Christ for mankind in every age. "The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice." Saint John Chrysostom put it well: "We always offer the same Lamb, not one today and another tomorrow, but always the same one. For this reason the sacrifice is always only one... Even now we offer that victim who was once offered and who will never be consumed...(EE 12)

In giving his sacrifice to the Church, Christ has also made his own the spiritual sacrifice of the Church, which is called to offer herself in union with the sacrifice of Christ. This is the teaching of the Second Vatican Council concerning all the faithful: "Taking part in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, which is the source and summit of the whole Christian life, they offer the divine victim to God, and offer themselves along with it..." (EE 13)

In the humble signs of bread and wine, changed into his body and blood, Christ walks beside us as our strength and our food for the journey, and he enables us to become, for everyone, witnesses of hope. If, in the presence of this mystery, reason experiences its limits, the heart, enlightened by the grace of the Holy Spirit, clearly sees the response that is demanded, and bows low in adoration and unbounded love. 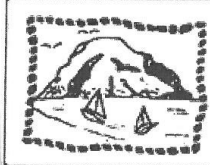
