Sunday, January 7, 2024
Look Back, Look Forward



Today's readings: Isaiah 60:1–6; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12–13; Ephesians 3:2–3a, 5–6; Matthew 2:1–12. Little is known about the three visitors from the East who paid the Holy Family homage. Still we can't help but marvel at their determination to meet Jesus despite the distance and that their only guide was a star.

In many cultures, Epiphany is celebrated with as much festivity as Christmas. The day may be marked with parades, parties, gift-giving, the three kings cake, and holiday meals. Create annual traditions to make Epiphany special in your household. The liturgy offers a house blessing on this day. Inscribe 20+C+M+B24 with chalk on the door frame. It stands for *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "let Christ bless this house" and the current year. Custom

attributes the letters to the names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Bring the figurines of the three Magi closer to the manger, light candles, and sing your favorite Epiphany and Christmas carols.

The Christmas season ends at sundown on the Baptism of the Lord. This weekend invites us to look back upon our journey since the beginning of Advent. From waiting for the coming of Christ, to welcoming him anew into our lives, and then making a permanent home for him in our hearts, we also traveled far. What new insights did you uncover along the way about the in-breaking of God into humanity? How will your faith journey bring you closer to Christ in the coming year?



THIS WEEK AND BEYOND

Monday, January 8

The Baptism of the Lord

The Scriptures turn from Christ's infancy to his initiation and mission. At his baptism the Holy Spirit anointed and revealed Jesus as the Son of God. We are invited to ponder our baptism, which welcomed us into the community of the children of God. Pull out baptismal pictures, garments, and mementos, and recall the stories of baptisms in your family. Reach out to godparents and godchildren with a note or a call. Remember our baptismal commitment to keep the light of Christ burning brightly in our lives. *Today's readings: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Psalm 29:1-2, 3-4, 3, 9-10; Acts 10:34-38; Mark 1:7-11.*

January 9—February 13

Ordinary Time

Our six-week journey from the First Sunday of Advent to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord has come to an end, and the Church now enters the season of Ordinary Time. There is nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time. It is named after ordered or counted time. There are five Sundays, thirty-eight days of time before Lent. Change your prayer space colors to green and reflect on how you hope to grow spiritually in the not-so-ordinary weeks ahead.

Wednesday, January 24

St. Francis de Sales

St. Francis de Sales served the Church in sixteenth-century Europe with his extraordinary gifts of communication about the spiritual life for the laity. He was tenacious in evangelizing through his humility, wisdom, teaching, and eloquent writing. Some of his letters to the faithful are collected in the book *The Introduction to the Devout Life*. Francis de Sales is the patron saint of writers and journalists. *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4-17; Psalm 89:4-5, 27-28, 29-30; Mark 4:1-20.*

Thursday, January 25

Conversion of St. Paul

A brilliant, highly educated Jewish Roman during the first century, Paul was converted from a zealous persecutor of the early Christians to the most prolific and compelling disciple of Christ. Without a doubt, Paul accelerated the growth of the Christian community like no other evangelist. He was beheaded in Rome for his tenacious faithfulness. Read Acts, chapters 9-28, to recall his full story. *Today's readings: Acts 22:3-16 or Acts 9:1-22; Psalm 177:1, 2; Mark 16:15-18.*

Wednesday, January 31

St. John Bosco

St. John Bosco followed his call to minister to poor and neglected youth in Turin during the early nineteenth century. His patience and compassion for children seemed limitless. He opened a church and a home and school for boys who would otherwise have been without care. He founded the Salesian order, named after his favorite saint, St. Francis de Sales, as well as an order of women to do similar ministry for girls. John Bosco is remembered as the patron saint of children. *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 24:2, 9-17; Psalm 32:1-2, 5, 6, 7; Mark 6:1-6.*

Friday, February 2

The Presentation of the Lord

Today's feast commemorates the purifying of Mary according to Jewish law, forty days after the birth of a male child, as well as the consecration of the child in the temple. This feast is always celebrated with candles (it used to be known as Candlemas) because of Simeon's recognition that in the person of Jesus, God has given us "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people, Israel" (Luke 2:30-32). Prepare a special meal, light candles for the table, and read chapter 2 of Luke's Gospel at prayer time. *Today's readings: Malachi 3:1-4; Psalm 24:7, 8, 9, 10; Hebrews 2:14-18; Luke 2:22-40.*

Domingo, 7 de enero de 2024

Mirar atrás, mirar adelante



Lecturas del día: Isaías 60:1-6; Salmo 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13; Efesios 3:2-3a, 5-6; Mateo 2:1-12. De lo poco que se sabe de los tres visitantes del Oriente que rindieron homenaje a la Sagrada Familia, es que estaban resueltos a conocer a Jesús pese a la distancia y a tener de guía a una estrella; ante ello es difícil evitar asombrarnos.

En muchas culturas, la Epifanía se celebra con tanto afán como la Navidad. Ese día hay desfiles, fiestas, intercambio de regalos, rosca de reyes y comida. Haga de la Epifanía una tradición anual en familia. Este día la liturgia ofrece la bendición de la casa. Con tiza, en el marco de la puerta escriba 20+G+M+B+24. Representan las iniciales de *Christus mansionem benedicat*, “que Cristo bendiga esta casa”, y el año en curso. La tradición atribuye las letras a las

iniciales de los tres reyes magos: Gaspar, Melchor y Baltazar. Acerque al pesebre las figuritas de los tres Reyes Magos, encienda velas y entone sus cantos favoritos de Epifanía y Navidad.

La temporada de Navidad termina al atardecer del Bautismo del Señor. Este fin de semana nos invita a hacer una retrospectiva de nuestro viaje que empezó en Adviento. Ha sido un viaje largo: desde esperar la llegada de Cristo, recibirlo de nuevo en nuestras vidas, hasta hacerle un hogar permanente en el corazón. A lo largo de este viaje, ¿qué ha hallado de novedad sobre la irrupción de Dios en la humanidad? ¿De qué modo este viaje de fe lo acercará a Cristo el año entrante?

Lunes, 8 de enero

El Bautismo del Señor

La lectura del evangelio pasa de la infancia de Cristo a su iniciación y misión. En el bautismo de Cristo, el Espíritu Santo lo unge y lo revela Hijo de Dios. Se nos invita a reflexionar sobre nuestro bautismo, el cual nos recibió dentro de la comunidad de hijos de Dios. Saque del baúl de los recuerdos las fotos, las prendas, los objetos de su bautismo y evoque los otros bautismos de familiares. Llame a los padrinos y a los ahijados o escríbalos una nota. Tenga presente el compromiso bautismal de mantener encendida la luz de Cristo en nuestras vidas. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 42:1-4, 6-7; Salmo 29:1-2, 3-4, 3, 9-10; Hechos 10:34-38; Marcos 1:7-11.*

9 de enero al 13 de febrero

Tiempo Ordinario

Ha terminado el itinerario de seis semanas desde el Primer Domingo de Adviento hasta la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, y ahora la Iglesia entra al Tiempo Ordinario. Nada ordinario tiene el Tiempo Ordinario. Se llama así por el orden del tiempo. Abarca cinco domingos, treinta y ocho días antes de Cuaresma. Cambie a verde el color del espacio donde usted ora y reflexione cuánto espera crecer en lo espiritual en las semanas venideras y para nada ordinarias.

Miércoles, 24 de enero

San Francisco de Sales

En la Europa del siglo XVI, la Iglesia se sirvió de los dones excepcionales de san Francisco de Sales para transmitir la vida espiritual a los laicos. Dotado de sabiduría, didáctica y una prosa elocuente, fue tenaz para evangelizar. Algunas de sus cartas a los fieles fueron reunidas en el libro *Introducción a la vida devota*. Francisco de Sales es el patrón de los escritores y los periodistas. *Lecturas del día: 2 Samuel 7:4-17; Salmo 89:4-5, 27-28, 29-30; Marcos 4:1-20.*

Jueves, 25 de enero

Conversión de san Pablo

Brillante y cultivado, Pablo era un judío helenizado del siglo I, que de ser un implacable perseguidor de los primeros cristianos se convirtió en el más prolífico y persuasivo discípulo de Cristo. No cabe duda de que Pablo aceleró el crecimiento de la comunidad cristiana como ningún otro evangelista. Por su fidelidad a toda prueba, fue decapitado en Roma. Lea Hechos, capítulos 9-28, y rememore su historia. *Lecturas de hoy: Hechos 22:3-16 o Hechos 9:1-22; Salmo 177:1, 2; Marcos 16:15-18.*

Miércoles, 31 de enero

San Juan Bosco

San Juan Bosco siguió el llamado a servir a los pobres y a los jóvenes olvidados de Turín, Italia, a comienzos del siglo XIX. Su paciencia y compasión con los niños parecían inagotables. Abrió una iglesia y un hogar y escuela para varones desamparados. Fundó la Congregación Salesiana, llamada así por san Francisco de Sales, su santo favorito, y también una orden de féminas para hacer una labor similar con las niñas. A Juan Bosco se le recuerda como el santo patrón de la infancia. *Lecturas de hoy: 2 Samuel 24:2, 9-17; Salmo 32:1-2, 5, 6, 7; Marcos 6:1-6.*

Viernes, 2 de febrero

Presentación del Señor

La fiesta de hoy conmemora la purificación de María conforme la ley judía, cuarenta días después de nacido un hijo varón, así como la consagración del niño en el templo. Esta fiesta siempre se celebra con velas (antes se le llamaba la Candelaria) pues, en la persona de Jesús, Simeón reconoció la salvación que Dios ha "dispuesto ante todos los pueblos como luz para iluminar a los paganos y como gloria de tu pueblo Israel" (Lucas 2:30-32). Prepare un platillo especial, sobre la mesa ponga velas encendidas y, a la hora de orar, lea el capítulo 2 del Evangelio según san Lucas. *Lecturas de hoy: Malaquías 3:1-4; Salmo 24:7, 8, 9, 10; Hebreos 2:14-18; Lucas 2:22-40.*

As we look at the possibility of another wet winter and spring, we are reminded as we cover the pews with tarps just before each rain that the roof on the church NEEDS to be replaced.

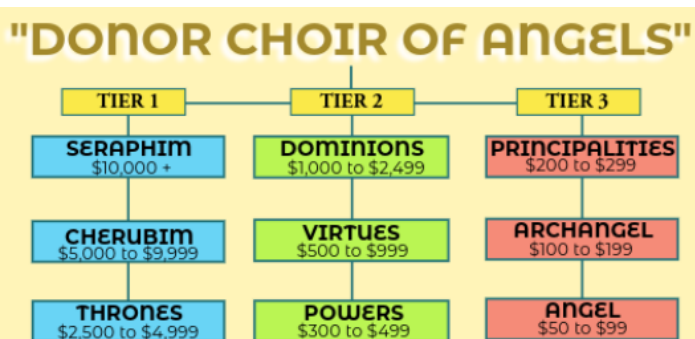
This cannot be a 'one person' effort. Together we CAN cover the cost of the roof. We can make it so our parish stays "TARPS OFF!"

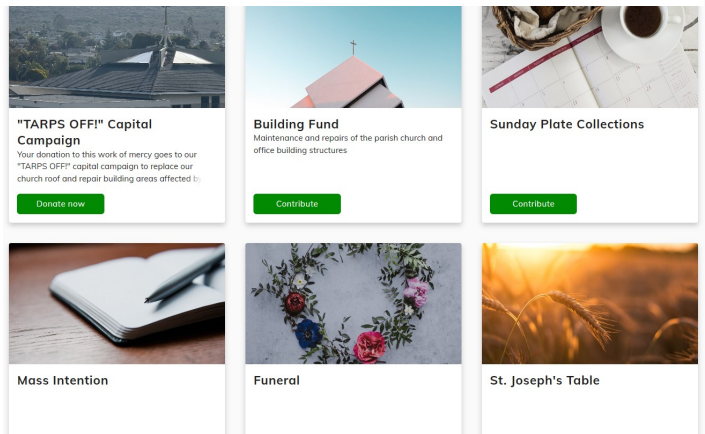

16 Jan (Tues) at 7:00pm— The annual Respect Life Mass celebrated by Most Reverend Bishop Daniel E. Garcia will be at Madonna del Sasso Pro-Cathedral, 320 E. Laurel Dr, Salinas.

16-24 Jan—9 DAYS FOR LIFE

Nine Days for Life is the U.S. Catholic bishops' annual novena in January surrounding the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn, which this year is January 22nd. The novena will be January 16-24. This is an opportunity to join the bishops and Catholics across the country in praying for protection of all unborn babies.





Traditionally the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated on January 6th in the western or 'Latin' Church. That gives twelve days of celebration between Christmas when we celebrate His birth and the Epiphany when we celebrate the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the World, the Messiah, the King of Kings, to all nations and gentiles as represented through the Magi, or Wise Men, who traveled from the ends of the earth to worship and adore God made Man. Let us be in awe of this great work of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for the salvation of our souls!

Celebrated since the 3rd Century, the Epiphany has not always been a Holy Day of Obligation. During the papacy of Pope St. John Paul II, the revised Code of Canon Law in 1983, included in Canon 1246 listing ten holy days of obligation in addition to Sundays. (Prior to this, Canon Law had not been revised since 1917.) The Epiphany, the last day of the Christmas Season, was part of the list of Holy Days of Obligation. In 1991 the National Conference of Catholic Bishops of the United States of America also known as the NCCB, which would merge later with the U.S. Catholic Conference to form the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops, reduced the number of non-Sunday Holy Days of Obligation to six by transferring some to Sundays, which also included the Epiphany. The Church in several other nations did the same. In fact, in many parts around the world the Epiphany is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8 inclusively. Pope Francis in his homily at St. Peter's Basilica on January 6, 2024 reminds us to re-examine the Epiphany through the eyes of the Magi. The Magi lifted their eyes to heaven. This is where our eyes should gaze. Our Lord God is in Heaven. We, like them, are living in the world while journeying forward toward the Light of the World and simultaneously are called to come to Him in humble adoration.

On the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, as other

Solemnities, incense, that beautiful symbol of prayer, is used to purify and sanctify and always helping to place us at God's throne. We are reminded of this in these scriptural passages: *"Let my prayer come like incense before you; the lifting up of my hands, like the evening sacrifice."* Ps 141 and *"Another angel came in holding a censer of gold. He took his place at the altar of incense and was given large amounts of incense to deposit on the altar of gold in front of the throne, together with the prayers of all God's holy ones. From the angel's hand, the smoke of the incense went up before God, and with it the prayers of God's people."* Rv 8:3

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal indicates that incense may be used during the Mass, especially Solemnities, at five places reminding us that we are at Heaven's throne. They are 1) at the entrance procession, 2) incensing the altar at the beginning of Mass, 3) at the Gospel when we hear God's Word, 4) at the preparation of the gifts of bread and wine, our prayers, our financial offerings, and ourselves as our offerings are lifted up to the Lord, 5) and during the elevations of the Eucharistic prayer when the priest still in persona Christi offers to the Father the Body of Christ.

At the fifth time the incense is used, we are bowed down in supplication and adoration as we and Christ Jesus, the Body of Christ for Jesus is our head, are elevated and lifted up by Christ, sanctified through the complete outpouring of love between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for each other, and we are made partakers in this through the Sacrifice on the Cross and Resurrection through the Mass. Like all the angels surrounding us, like the Magi, we are truly humbled in adoration and awe. We, our lives, prayers, and experiences, are our gift to the Lord. This is our gift of love! What do we hear when we receive Holy Communion? 'Body of Christ' as the Blessed Eucharist is presented. It is a gift of love. It is truly a beautiful mystery!

God redirects us then to go forth with the outpouring of love we receive. In what ways that are pleasing to God do we share His love with our family, our friends, our parish, with those in need, the lonely, etc.? 'cuz we love, we give!



From Neumann's diary dated Nov. 22, 1834
Life of Bishop Neumann, p 69-70

My Lord and my God, once more am I to approach the altar of Thy Most August Sacrament; once more am I to receive the Almighty Creator of heaven and earth; once more receive the Most –High God in whose all-seeing eyes the seraphim are not pure; once more receive that Just Judge who knows my crimes better than I do myself; once more receive Him whose garments alone healed the sick! My God, what shall I do, since in Thy sight the angels themselves are not pure? What shall I, a sinner, do that I may not eat judgement and damnation to myself? O my God, my Redeemer, how is it that Though dost desire to confer on me this great favor? Behold, I offer Thee my tears of penance and of love! I have naught else to offer. Deign to accept my heart and my will. Enlighten me, O Eternal Wisdom, that I may practice Thy teachings, that I may concur I the salvation of those whom Thou didst purchase at so great a price! Dio with me what Thou pleases, for all my desire is to fulfil Thy holy will. Ah, I know that Thou lovest me! Though didst grant me to-day tears of love and of penance, for which, O Jesus, mayest Though be ever blessed! I would ask Thee for many things, but alas, I do not know what to ask! O Father, give Thy children daily bread; forgive us our sins; lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil! Preserve They Holy Church, our good Mother! Direct our Holy Father the Pope; be merciful to all the faithful; enlighten unbelievers! Bless my parents, my brother my sisters, my friend, and all my friends and enemies. And thou, my Heavenly Mother, accept and my thanks for thy wonderful intercession! Be forever my refuge, my consoler! My love patrons, whom I have chosen as intercessors at the throne of the Most High, come to my assistance! My loved patrons, whom I have chosen as intercessors at the throne of the Most High, come to my assistance! My holy guardian angel, my faithful guide, though hast seen the tears that have flowered from my eyes—those eyes which were before so long without a tear; to thee I give them, that thou mayest present them to my Judge and Redeemer. Amen.

On rising I will recite the morning prayer from 'The Christian's Day, and in the evening I will say the seven penitential psalms, with the usual prayers. I will meditate on a verse of the Holy Scripture every day. O Holy Spirit, give me Thy grace to perform all this well. O my Jesus, I will every day receive Holy Communion spiritually, and offer it up for the prevention of sacrilegious communion. Lord, in crease in me the effects of Holy Communion. In my visits to the Blessed Sacrament I will recite the psalms xvi, xxvi, and lxxxiii. At the beginning of every sacred function, I will say: O good God, incline unto me a favorable ear!'

FRIDAY'S SKID MARKS



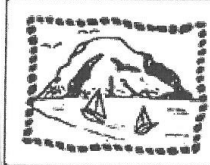

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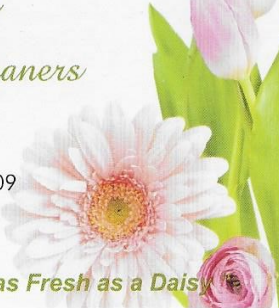
