The Diocese of Monterey needs us to show that we can pay our loan over time. They are asking that we show them that we have

The release of the loan money from the Diocese has not been finalized. The Diocese of Monterey Finance Department has asked us to show with pledges that we can pay the other 50% of our loan that we have applied for.

We don't want to burden anyone, so a three year pledge would be really helpful.

To date the bulk of our donations have all been one-time donations with an estimated fewer than 5 signing-up for a pledge. (Online angel donors have not had enough time for pledging to be established fully, so this approximate number is from the donation envelopes.)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Q: Is S.E.A.S. a nonprofit?

A: Yes! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is a church and is a 501 (c)(3). Donations are tax deductible.

Q: Do you accept stocks?

A: Yes. We can accept stocks and bonds as donation.

Q: Can I ask my employer to be a matching donor?

A: Yes. Often businesses are willing to match their employee contributions to different causes.

Q: May I give a small amount now, and more later?

A: Absolutely! Your direct donations are being recorded for tax purposes. Your accrued total donations determine the tier for which you will be recognized.

Q: What are some of the fundraising events for this coming year to support TARPS OFF!

A: Tentative ideas are Tamale sales, Dinner & Dance, Live Auctions, Ballroom Dance, Kermes, etc. Some are already in the planning stages, some not yet.

Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?

A: The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611	Collected as of March 20, 2023
\$ 19, 082	Wall Cross Fundraiser
\$ 20, 690	Insurance Payment (for walls)

Q: What happened to that money collected?

A: That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?

A: Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?

A: Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

Q: How much does the parish hope to keep in savings?

A: It is recommended that the parish keep at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses. The more of course is better.

During the days leading to Ash Wednesday, we may find ourselves trying to remember what exactly fasting and abstinence are. When fasting a person is allowed to eat one full meal as well as two smaller meals which are not equivalent to a full meal. Abstinence is refraining from something that is good but is not inherently sinful. In terms of Lent, we refrain from food, specifically meat.

The United States Council of Catholic Bishops, or the USCCB reminds us that Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For Roman Catholics, For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. [Fast & Abstinence | USCCB](#) We also abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent.

Why fasting and abstinence? According to Catholic Online, [Fasting and Abstinence - Easter / Lent - Catholic Online](#), *“There’s an ancient practice of fasting in sorrow and repentance for sins found in the Old Testament. Fasting also accompanied fervent prayer to God. The idea was that fasting made one’s prayer more acceptable to God. It was a way of demonstrating one’s level of commitment before the Lord. These ideas remain valid today. God desires that we prove our love for him. As the old adage goes, actions speak louder than words.”*

Exodus 90 ([The Origins and Development of the Season of Lent - Exodus 90](#)) shares the early history of Lent.

“Originally, Lent wasn’t a defined season. In ancient Rome and the Western Church, a brief fast was observed just before Easter. This varied from a day to a week and was more clearly about preparing for Easter than the Lent we know today. Similarly, early Christians fasted as part of baptismal preparation. Writers like Justin Martyr and Tertullian highlighted fasting and praying for those gearing up for baptism. Both of these early fasting traditions laid the foundation for what would become Lent.

A major change occurred when Rome introduced a three-week fasting period, first recorded around 439.

This was initially a baptismal preparation, not tied to Easter. Over time, as baptism became associated with Easter, this period was anchored to the calendar before Easter and eventually grew into the forty-day Lent.”... Lent evolved from two main traditions: baptismal preparation and preparing for Easter. Both grew side by side until Baptism at Easter was formalized, combining the pre-baptismal and pre-paschal fasts into what we now know as Lent.

Today, the Roman Church follows both original themes of Lent. The first two weeks are more penitential, focusing on repentance and reflection. The next three weeks emphasize baptismal elements, and the final two weeks are dedicated to preparing for the Passion of Christ. This structure is not just a ritualistic timeline; it’s the key to observing Lent well.”

Above all, Lent is an opportunity to join in solidarity with Jesus Christ our Lord in his sufferings. It helps us to be more aware too of those who are suffering around us. Holy Mother Church reminds us of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy which we are all called to do. These can help us as we journey through our Lent repentance and reflection in preparation for the Passion of Christ.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are:

- 1) To feed the hungry; 5) To give drink to the thirsty;
- 2) To clothe the naked; 6) To harbor the harborers;
- 3) To visit the sick; 7) To ransom the captive;
- 4) To bury the dead.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are:

- 1) To instruct the ignorant ; 6) To counsel the doubtful ;
- 2) To admonish sinners ; 7) To bear wrongs patiently;
- 3) To forgive offences willingly;
- 4) To comfort the afflicted;
- 5) To pray for the living and the dead.

Let us remember to make a prayer of our fast and abstinence, of our Works of Mercy, and our small sacrifices for the good of others. Let us give generously for love of God. Cuz we love, we give.

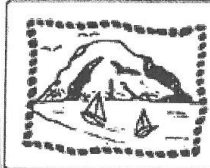
