**Sunday, March 17, 2024**

**Covenant of Love**



*Today's readings: Jeremiah 31:31–34; Psalm 51:3–4, 12–13, 14–15, (12a); Hebrews 5:7–9; John 12:20–33.* On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the readings begin by recalling the covenant God made with the chosen people. The Lord tells the prophet Jeremiah, “I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people.” In the covenant that God keeps with us today, he offers us eternal life. Jesus refers to that life in the Gospel reading, saying, “Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life.”

The first reading explains that all shall know God, for he “will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no

more.” In the second covenant, Jesus lays down his life for us on the cross, erasing our sins and reconciling us with God. The Letter to the Hebrews explains that Christ “became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.”

To obey God, to have a place for him in our hearts, we seek a pure heart, praying from Psalm 51, “Create a clean heart in me, O God.” In this psalm, we ask not only that our souls be cleansed of sin but for a steadfast and willing spirit. How will you carry this psalm with you through this week so that you can be true to the love God offers? How can this psalm turn you to God’s presence so that you might be a walking testimony of his love?



## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, March 18 Traps for Kindness

Even though Jesus was without sin, he did not condemn. How much more should we, with our failings and shortcomings, follow his example and offer a kind word instead of judgment. As we live these final days of Lent, let us practice kindness by complimenting others and refraining from critical words. *Today's readings: Daniel 13:1-9, 15-17, 19-30, 33-62; Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6; John 8:1-11.*

### Tuesday, March 19 Feast of St. Joseph

"It was not through the law that the promise was made to Abraham and his descendants that he would inherit the world, but through the righteousness that comes from faith," we hear in today's reading from Romans. The phrase "righteousness from faith" personifies St. Joseph, who was inclined to quietly divorce the pregnant Mary but followed the angel's instruction and took her into his home. Have you considered looking to St. Joseph as a model of faith? *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4-5a, 12-14a, 16; Psalm 89:2-3, 4-5, 27 and 29; Romans 4:13, 16-18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18-21, 24a or Luke 2:41-51a.*

### Wednesday, March 20 Becoming Better

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his listeners that to be his disciples, they are to remain in his Word. Only by remaining in his Word will they know the truth and be set free from sin. Reading and meditating on Scripture is a regular practice of many to come closer to God during Lent. During your prayer time, ponder how you act out your discipleship. Are the people that you encounter aware that you are a Christian by the way you live? *Today's readings: Daniel 3:14-20, 91-92, 95; Psalm: Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56; John 8:31-42.*

### Thursday, March 21 Beyond Imagination

Abraham surely never imagined that God would come to him to make a covenant. It is beyond imagination that God would come to make "an everlasting pact." Yet God promised the childless Abraham that he would be "the father of a host of nations." God has a plan for each of us too. In the Gospel, we hear, "Whoever keeps my word will never see death." To keep God's Word is the work of each disciple. For that work, the reward is eternal life. *Today's readings: Genesis 17:3-9; Psalm 105:4-5, 6-7, 8-9; John 8:51-59.*

### Friday, March 22 Do You Believe?

In the first reading, we hear the prophet Jeremiah say, "All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine." Jesus, too, knew that people who practiced their religion looked for reasons to arrest or stone him. Reminding them of the Father's good works he had performed, he asked, "For which of these are you trying to stone me?" In the world today, who is being punished for their good works? How do you recognize the work and action of Jesus around you? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 20:10-13; Psalm 18:2-3a, 3bc-4, 5-6, 7; John 10:31-42.*

### Saturday, March 23 All Praise to God

As we stand at the precipice of Holy Week, reflect on a time when you turned away from God. Perhaps you felt persecuted or ashamed of your relationship with God. Many young people face this problem; they hide their faith because it is unpopular, yet our faith in God is not about popularity. How can we be examples of hope to the younger generation? How can you turn a tense moment into an opportunity to share God's love and mercy? *Today's readings: Ezekiel 37:21-28; Psalm: Jeremiah 31:10, 11-12abcd, 13; John 11:45-56.*

**Domingo, 17 de marzo de 2024**

**Alianza de amor**



*Lecturas del día: Jeremías 31:31-34; Salmo 51:3-4, 12-13, 14-15, (12a); Hebreos 5:7-9; Juan 12:20-33.* En este Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma, las lecturas empiezan evocando la alianza que Dios hizo con el pueblo elegido. El Señor dice al profeta Jeremías, “Meteré mi Ley en su pecho, la escribiré en su corazón, yo seré su Dios y ellos serán mi pueblo”. Con la alianza que Dios mantiene hoy con nosotros él nos ofrece vida eterna. Jesús se refiere a esa vida en la lectura del evangelio al decir: “El que se aferra a la vida la pierde, el que desprecia la vida en este mundo la conserva para una vida eterna”.

La primera lectura explica que conocerán a Dios, pues él perdonará las culpas y olvidará los pecados. En la segun-

da alianza, Jesús da su vida en la cruz por nosotros, por lo cual borra nuestros pecados y nos reconcilia con Dios. La Carta a los Hebreos explica que Cristo “llegó a ser para cuantos le obedecen causa de salvación eterna”.

Para obedecer a Dios, para hacerle un lugar en el corazón, hay que desear tener un corazón limpio, como nos indica el Salmo 51: “Crea en mí, oh Dios, un corazón puro”. En este salmo, además de pedir que nos limpie el alma de pecado, también pedimos un espíritu firme y listo. Esta semana, ¿cómo cumplirá usted este salmo de modo que le sea fiel al amor que Dios ofrece? ¿De qué forma este salmo lo llevará ante la presencia de Dios de modo que usted sea un testimonio andante del amor de él?

### Lunes, 18 de marzo

#### Los obstáculos de la amabilidad

### Martes, 19 de marzo

#### Fiesta de san José

“No por la ley le prometieron a Abrahán o a su descendencia que heredaría el mundo, sino por el mérito de la fe”, nos dice hoy la lectura de la Carta a los romanos. Lo de “el mérito de la fe” aplica a san José, quien estaba dispuesto a repudiar discretamente a María embarazada, pero que siguiendo las instrucciones del ángel la llevó a su casa. ¿Ha considerado a san José un modelo de fe? *Lecturas del día: 2 Samuel 7:4-5a, 12-14a, 16; Salmo 89:2-3, 4-5, 27 y 29; Romanos 4:13, 16-18, 22; Mateo 1:16, 18-21, 24a o Lucas 2:41-51a.*

### Miércoles, 20 de marzo

#### Ser mejor

En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús dice a sus escuchas que para que sean sus discípulos, tienen que mantenerse fieles a la palabra de él. Solamente así ellos conocerán la verdad y serán libres de pecado. Muchos leen las Escrituras y las meditan a fin de acercarse más a Dios durante la Cuaresma. Al orar, reflexione sobre cómo practica su discipulado. ¿Acaso sus conocidos saben que usted es cristiano por la forma en que vive? *Lecturas del día: Daniel 3:14-20, 91-92, 95; Salmo Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55, 56; Juan 8:31-42.*

### Jueves, 21 de marzo

#### Más allá de la imaginación

Seguramente Abrahán jamás se imaginó que Dios se le manifestaría para hacer una alianza. Rebasa la imaginación el que Dios venga para hacer una alianza eterna. The release of the loan money from the Diocese has not been finalized. The Diocese of Monterey Finance Department has asked us to show with pledges that we can pay the other 50% of our loan that we have applied for.

To date the bulk of our donations have all been one-time donations with an estimated fewer than 5 signing-up for a pledge. (Online angel donors have not had enough time for pledging to be established fully, so this approximate number is from the donation envelopes.)

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Q: Is S.E.A.S. a nonprofit?**

**A:** Yes! St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is a church and is a 501 (c)(3). Donations are tax deductible.

**Q: May I give a small amount now, and more later?**

**A:** Absolutely! Your direct donations are being recorded for tax purposes. Your accrued total donations determine the tier for which you will be recognized.

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS CONT.:**

**Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?**

**A:** Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

**Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?**

**A:** Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

**Q: How much does the parish hope to keep in savings?**

**A:** It is recommended that the parish keep at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses. The more of course is better.

**Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?**

**A:** The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611 Collected as of March 20, 2023  
 \$ 19, 082 Wall Cross Fundraiser  
 \$ 20, 690 Insurance Payment (for walls)

**Q: What happened to that money collected?**

**A:** That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

**Q: If we add last year's roof fund (\$68, 383 ) to the current TAPRS OFF donations as of 15 March 2024 (\$60, 862) How much do we have?**

**A:** \$ 129, 245. 00 YAY!!!

**Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof drains?**

**A:** No, because that part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000. 00

**Q: It seems like we are doing well with the donations & creative fundraisers. We may not need a loan. What do you think?**

**A:** It depends. We still have the TARPS OFF creative fundraisers lined up:

- March 22—Friday Fish Fry
- March 31—Easter Sunday Kermés
- May 4—Legacy Formal Dinner and Ballroom Dance
- May 19—Pentecost Sunday Kermés
- May 19-June 23—Cross on the Wall Fundraiser

We will see after these. We focus on these and make the most of this 2024 year because the parish keeps the full TAPRS OFF amount for 2024.

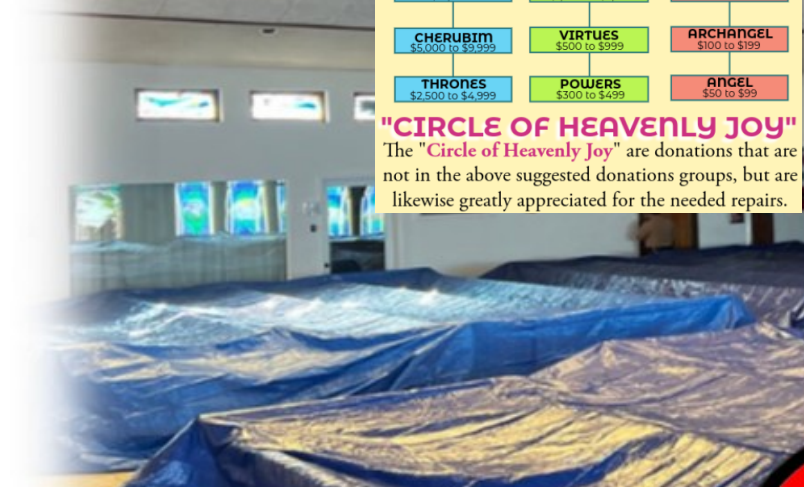

So many people find themselves living paycheck to paycheck. That is why radio shows such as the Ramsey Show and others are so popular. People are always seeking ways of getting wealthier so they can “live better.” Interestingly enough, financial personalities will often help people get financially stable through cutting back on unimportant expenses in their lives, then helping to create a monthly budget, then remind the person they are helping that they will not be financially satisfied until they help others financially. This is an interesting concept. Surprisingly, it has Biblical roots.

Regarding debt Proverbs 22: 7 tells us, “Just as the rich rule the poor, so the borrower is servant to the lender. And elsewhere, St Paul reminds, “Owe nothing to anyone—except for your obligation to love one another. If you love your neighbor, you will fulfill the requirements of God’s law.” (Rom 13:8) One could easily say this is just in the Bible, it does not matter today, everyone owes money. Did you know that according to the American Civil Liberties Union, “An estimated 77 million Americans have a debt that has been turned over to a private collection agency. Thousands of these debtors are arrested and jailed each year because they owe money. Millions more are threatened with jail. The debts owed can be as small as a few dollars.” (<https://www.aclu.org/issues/smart-justice/mass-incarceration/criminalization-private-debt> las viewed 3/15/2024)

Imagine a world in which we did not have debt. Would we be happier? Would we love our neighbor more? Would we give more freely to those in need?

The Bible also speaks of fiscal responsibility in places like Proverbs, “The wise have wealth and luxury, but fools spend whatever they get.” (Pv 21: 20) and “Good people leave an inheritance to their grandchildren, but the sinner’s wealth passes to the godly.” It lets us know that it is okay to have wealth, but that we do have the responsibility to use it like a tool and that we must be wise about it, using it for the purposes that are good and just. Even Christ Jesus in the Gospels spoke about the Dishonest Steward who had squandered his master’s wealth and to help make him-

self look a little better rewrote the promissory notes of those who owed the master so that they would look more favorably upon both him and his master. At the end of the parable, Jesus said to his listeners, “If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth?” (Lk 16: 11) In other words, the good things of this world have been entrusted to us for our use and good stewardship, but they are a reflection of how we take care of those for those things which are Holy, like the life of grace in us and others.

God provides. Repeatedly in our modern world and even in Holy Scripture we hear about God’s goodness and divine providence. The Prophet Jeremiah reminds of God’s benevolence towards us, “But blessed are those who trust in the Lord and have made the Lord their hope and confidence. They are like trees planted along a riverbank, with roots that reach deep into the water. Such trees are not bothered by the heat or worried by long months of drought. Their leaves stay green, and they never stop producing fruit.” (Jer 17: 7-8)

The Prophet Malachi teaches, “Should people cheat God? Yet you have cheated me! “But you ask, ‘What do you mean? When did we ever cheat you?’ “You have cheated me of the tithes and offerings due to me. You are under a curse, for your whole nation has been cheating me. Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my Temple. If you do,” says the Lord of Heaven’s Armies, “I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you will not have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!” (Mal 3: 8-10)

Let us consider especially as tax season looms, how we think of money. Does it control us? Has it become a god in our lives? Do we look upon money greedily? Do we easily fall into debt through excess shopping? Or do we use it as a tool for helping others through our churches or directly? How is God asking us to be a good caretaker for this gift that we have in our lives? Are we taking care of it well? Do we tend and grow it to give it? How much good we can do! ‘cuz we love, we give.

Many thanks to all who came and to those who came for Confession from Fr. Edwin Limpiado, Fr. Pedro Espinoza, and Fr. Joey.

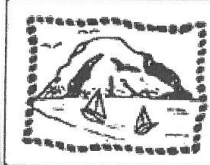
