Sunday, March 31, 2024
He Has Risen!



Today's readings: Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23; Colossians 3:1-4; John 20:1-9. The Lord has risen! Alleluia! Our rejoicing at Easter Time acknowledges that Christ's light has conquered darkness. Jesus came to do God's will; he paid the ultimate price, and now we proclaim with joy his resurrection. Our Lord prepared his disciples for his death and resurrection, telling them, "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me" (John 16:16). Jesus' rising from the dead should have come as no surprise to the disciples, yet they were surprised. As today's Gospel proclaims, "They did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Even though we understand, we still need to be open

to seeing with the eyes of our hearts so that we can embrace the resurrected Christ.

After the forty days of penitence of Lent, we celebrate the light defeating the darkness for fifty days. During Easter Time, we are invited to meditate on how our actions allow us to be light for others. How do you aid others to dispel the darkness surrounding them? Do you carry the message that Jesus is alive? Are you willing to shout it? When we share the light of Christ that permeates our lives, we show appreciation for the faith that we have been given. Through Jesus Christ, God has fulfilled his promise and given us eternal life. Let us not be afraid to rejoice in the new life we have been given.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 1

Trust

This week the Gospel shows Jesus encountering his disciples in varied settings. As we pray with these readings, we might see ourselves reflected in the encounters. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were fearful yet overjoyed upon seeing the empty tomb. How many of us have been stopped by our fears? These women trusted what the angel told them about our Lord. When we allow fear to overcome and paralyze us, problems are created. When afraid, seek the help of God, who has given you new life. *Today's readings: Acts 2:14, 22-33; Psalm 16:1-2a, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11; Matthew 28:8-15.*

Tuesday, April 2

Conversion

Many of Jesus' followers are like Mary of Magdala and do not recognize the risen Lord. They continue to seek the Jesus they had known before he fulfilled his mission. To recognize the resurrected Jesus, we ought to rely on the eyes of our hearts, which are filled with faith and trust in the Lord. Allow your heart to have a true conversion leading God to dwell within you. *Today's readings: Acts 2:36-41; Psalm 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22; John 20:11-18.*

Wednesday, April 3

Bread of Life

Imagine that, as one of the apostles, you followed Jesus and broke bread with him just before his death. Then he was nowhere to be found, or so you think. After Jesus' death, the disciples began to feel alone and disillusioned. When have you had an encounter with someone and realized it had been Jesus? At Mass, Jesus becomes the Bread of Life for us. He has not abandoned us; he remains within us, offering spiritual sustenance. *Today's readings: Acts 3:1-10; Psalm 105:1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8-9; Luke 24:13-35.*

Thursday, April 4

Agents of Peace

While the disciples spoke of how Jesus had become known to them in the breaking of the bread, he appeared, saying, "Peace be with you." Rather than being overjoyed, the disciples were scared. Jesus had to show them his wounds for them to believe it was he who had returned. Reflecting on this scene, consider whether you are at peace. Do you bring peace to others? Is there someone with a restless heart who needs your offering of peace? *Today's readings: Acts 3:11-26; Psalm 8:2ab, 5, 6-7, 8-9; Luke 24:35-48.*

Friday, April 5

Moving Forward

Jesus' followers have gone back to their old lives. Many people do the same today. After we experience a genuine encounter with Christ, it can be easy to return to our former ways. The harder path is to continue to move forward in the faith journey. As easy and as comfortable as our old life might have been, Christ calls us to a new life in which we surrender ourselves to God. *Today's readings: Acts 4:1-22; Psalm 118:1-2, 4, 22-24, 25-27a; John 21:1-14.*

Saturday, April 6

Is It Really He?

At the end of this first week of Easter, consider how you allowed yourself to be transformed. When have you recognized the presence of Jesus in your faith journey and opened yourself to change? Are there times that Jesus could rebuke you for your unbelief and hardness of heart, as he rebuked the apostles? As you read of the encounters Jesus had throughout his glorious day of resurrection, ponder how you have been the living Christ for others. Take to heart the message of light and hope brought about through the resurrection. *Today's readings: Acts 4:13-21; Psalm 118:24; Mark 16:9-15.*

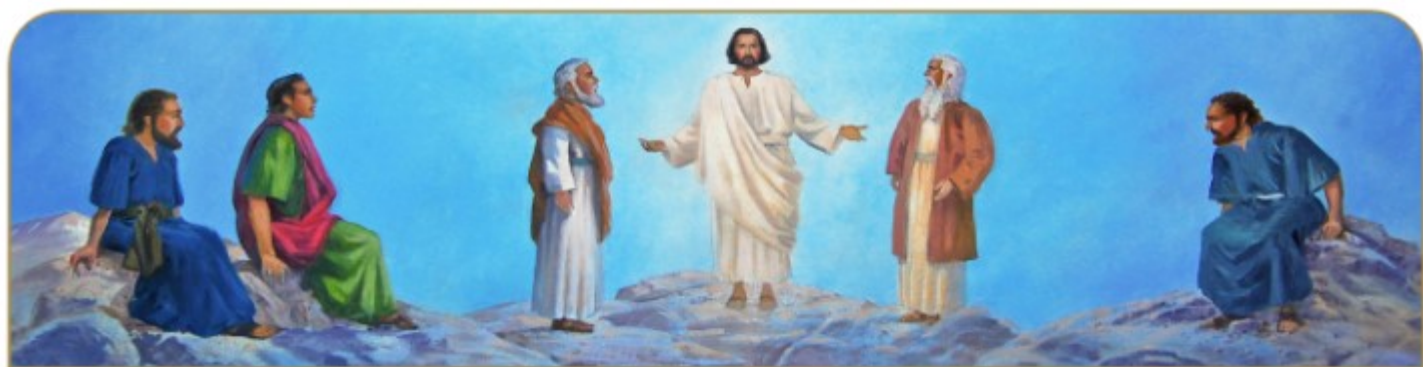
¡Ha resucitado!



Lecturas del día: Hechos 10:34a, 37-43; Salmo 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23; Colosenses 3:1-4; Juan 20:1-9. ¡El Señor ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya! Nuestro júbilo de Pascua reconoce que la luz de Cristo ha vencido las tinieblas. Jesús vino a hacer la voluntad de Dios; pagó con su vida y ahora proclamamos su resurrección. De cara a su muerte, el Señor preparó a sus discípulos: “Dentro de poco ya no me verán, y poco después me volverán a ver” (Juan 16:16). El que Jesús haya vuelto de entre los muertos no debería haber sorprendido a los discípulos; sin embargo, los sorprendió. El evangelio de hoy nos dice, “Todavía no habían entendido que, según la Escritura, él debía resucitar de entre los muertos”. Aun si uno lo enten-

diera, debería estar dispuesto a ver con los ojos del corazón y abrazar al Cristo resucitado.

Tras cuarenta días de penitencia de Cuaresma, durante cincuenta días celebramos la luz que vence las tinieblas. En el Tiempo Pascual se nos invita a meditar sobre cómo las acciones nuestras nos permiten ser luz para los demás. ¿Cómo ayuda usted a disipar la oscuridad de los demás? ¿Les lleva el mensaje de que Jesús está vivo? ¿Está dispuesto gritarlo? Al compartir la luz de Cristo que permea nuestras vidas, apreciamos la fe concedida. Por Jesucristo, Dios ha cumplido su promesa y nos ha dado vida eterna. No temamos regocijarnos en la vida nueva que se nos ha dado.



ESTA SEMANA EN CASA

Lunes, 1 de abril

Confianza

En el evangelio de esta semana Jesús se aparece ante sus discípulos en varios escenarios. Al orar con tales lecturas, es posible vernos reflejados en los encuentros. Al ver la tumba vacía, María Magdalena y la otra María sintieron temor y júbilo a la vez. ¿A cuántos no nos han detenido el temor? Estas mujeres confiaron en lo que lo que el ángel les dijo sobre el Señor. Cuando permitimos que el temor nos domine y paralice, surgen los problemas. En esos casos, busque la ayuda de Dios, que nos ha dado vida nueva. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 2:14, 22-33; Salmo 16:1-2a, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11; Mateo 28:8-15.*

Martes, 2 de abril

Conversión

Muchos de los seguidores de Jesús son como María de Magdala y no logran reconocer al Señor resucitado. Siguen buscando al Jesús que habían conocido antes de que este cumpliera su misión. Para reconocer al Jesús resucitado, debemos ver con los ojos del corazón, que están llenos de fe y de confianza en el Señor. Permítale al corazón una conversión verdadera en la que Dios viva con usted. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 2:36-41; Salmo 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22; Juan 20:11-18.*

Miércoles, 3 de abril

Pan de vida

Supongamos que usted es uno de los apóstoles y que ha seguido a Jesús con quien comparte el pan antes de que él muera. Entonces él desaparece, o eso es lo que usted cree. Tras la muerte de Jesús, los discípulos empezaron a sentirse solos y desilusionados. ¿Cuándo ha tenido un encuentro con alguien que resulta ser Jesús? En la misa, Jesús se convierte en el Pan de Vida. No nos ha abandonado; sigue con nosotros y nos ofrece apoyo espiritual. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 3:1-10; Salmo 105:1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8-9; Lucas 24:13-35.*

Jueves, 4 de abril

Agentes de paz

Cuando los discípulos dicen haber reconocido a Jesús cuando él partió el pan, él se les aparece y les dice, "La paz esté con ustedes". En vez de alegrarse, los discípulos se asustan. Jesús tuvo que mostrarles las heridas para que le creyeran que había vuelto. Reflexione sobre este pasaje y considere si usted está en paz o no. ¿Lleva paz a los demás? ¿Hay alguien de corazón rebelde al que le haga falta que usted le ofrezca la paz? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 3:11-26; Salmo 8:2ab, 5, 6-7, 8-9; Lucas 24:35-48.*

Viernes, 5 de abril

Hacia adelante

Los seguidores de Jesús han vuelto a su vida anterior. Mucha gente hace lo mismo. Luego de haber experimentado un encuentro verdadero con Cristo, es fácil que caigamos en lo mismo. El camino más arduo es seguir adelante en este viaje de fe. No importa cuán fácil y cómoda haya sido nuestra vida anterior, Cristo nos ha llamado a una vida nueva en la que nos entregamos a Dios. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 4:1-22; Salmo 118:1-2, 4, 22-24, 25-27a; Juan 21:1-14.*

Sábado, 6 de abril

¿De verdad es él?

Al final de la primera semana de Pascua, considere cómo se ha dejado transformar. En su viaje de fe, ¿cuántas veces ha reconocido a Jesús y se ha abierto usted al cambio? ¿Ha habido ocasiones en la que Jesús bien habría podido reprocharle la incredulidad y la dureza de corazón tal como él se las reprochó a los apóstoles? Lea los encuentros que Jesús tuvo durante los días gloriosos de resurrección y medite cómo ha sido usted el Cristo viviente para los demás. Tómese a pecho el mensaje de luz y esperanza que nos trae la resurrección. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 4:13-21; Salmo 118:24; Marcos 16:9-15.*

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?

A: Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?

A: Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

Q: If we collect our goal of \$200, 000 before year's end, will we discontinue the Tarps Off Campaign?

A: No. The money collected this year is not assessed so we will continue the Tarps Off Capital Campaign. It is recommended that the parish has at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses.

Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?

A: The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611 Collected as of March 20, 2023
\$ 19, 082 Wall Cross Fundraiser
\$ 20, 690 Insurance Payment (for walls)

Q: What happened to that money collected?

A: That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

Q: If we add last year's roof fund (\$68, 383) to the current TAPRS OFF donations as of 25 March 2024 (\$69, 476) How much do we have?

A: \$ 137, 859. 00 YAY!!!

Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof drains?

A: No, because that part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000. 00

Q: It seems like we are doing well with the donations & creative fundraisers. We may not need a loan. What do you think?

A: It depends. We still have the TARPS OFF creative fundraisers lined up:

March 31—Easter Sunday Kermés

May 4—Legacy Formal Dinner and Ballroom Dance

May 19—Pentecost Sunday Kermés

May 19-June 23—Cross on the Wall Fundraiser

We will see after these. We focus on these and make the most of this 2024 year because the parish keeps the full TAPRS OFF amount for 2024.

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Christ lived, was crucified, died on the Cross, and was raised to new life before he ascended to heaven for the salvation of our souls.

Usually the Pope gives an “Urbi et Orbi” message with a blessing at Christmas and Easter as well as other important times, like when the world shut down during the COVID pandemic and needed hope. Urbi et Orbi means ‘To the City (of Rome where the Pope is Bishop) and the world. This blessing is for all of us, the entire world. The accompanying message has value as well.

At Christmas, for example, Pope Francis’ Urbi et Orbi message focused on Bethlehem which at that time he called “a place of sorrow and silence.” Currently in the region known as the State of Palestine, the same country as the West Bank, our Christian brothers and sisters in Bethlehem celebrated the Light of Christ coming into our dark world in a subdued fashion, using rubble from missile destroyed buildings as creches on that Holy Night, at least depicted on some of the major news channels.

As reported by Christopher Wells in the Vatican News ‘*Pope to Catholics in Holy Land: May hope arise from seeds sown in pain*,’ from 27 March 2024, [vaticannews.va](https://www.vaticannews.va) Pope Francis in his Easter letter to those living in the Holy Lands offers hope to our brothers and sisters in Christ who walk those same roads and in the same towns as our Lord Jesus Christ. Pope Francis acknowledged their strength in staying where their families have been living for centuries, and those priests, monks, and other religious who serve, catechize, and evangelize in the Holy Lands. Pope Francis also thanked them for preserving and maintaining those holy places which we may see when the war and conflict cease. In the meantime, Pope Francis asks all of us to keep these brothers and sisters of our in our thoughts and prayers as well as all those around the world who strive to live Christ’s message of love and mercy in war torn places around the world.

Pope Francis wrote to them and to us in his letter: “*Lord, you are our peace (cf. Eph 2:14-22). You who proclaimed blessed the peacemakers (cf. Mt 5:9): set human hearts free from hatred, violence, and the spirit of revenge. We look to Your example, and we follow You, Who are merciful, meek, and humble of heart (cf. Mt 11:29). May no one rob our hearts of the hope of rising anew with You. May we never tire of defending the dignity of every man, woman, and child, without distinction of religion, ethnicity,*

or nationality, beginning with the most vulnerable among us: women, the elderly, children, and the poor.”

Thinking of the difficulties of the world can be overwhelming. We pray for God’s grace in the world. Through His strength, we are His hands and feet going out into the world to evoke the change that we pray for in the ways available to us whether in our immediate families, our communities, or even sometimes at a state or national level. We should also know too that when if the state of the world becomes too overwhelming for us; if we find ourselves focused only on that, or someone tells us they are concerned that we are depressed, that it is okay to seek out help. Christ Jesus the Divine Physician wants us to be healthy in mind body and soul.

Three years ago on another Easter, Pope Francis gave an Urbi et Orbi message. He said, “The Easter message does not offer us a mirage or reveal a magic formula. It does not point to an escape from the difficult situation that we are experiencing...In the face of, or better, in the midst of this complex reality, the Easter message speaks concisely of the event that gives us the hope that does not disappoint: “Jesus who was crucified has risen.” It speaks to us not about angels or ghosts, but about a man, a man of flesh and bone, with a face and a name: Jesus...The crucified Jesus, none other, has risen from the dead. God the father raised Jesus, his Son, because he fully accomplished his saving will...The witnesses report an important detail: the Risen Jesus bears the marks of his wounds in his hands, feet, and side. All those who experience a painful trial in body or spirit can find refuge in these wounds and, through them, receive the grace of the hope that does not disappoint...The crucified and risen Lord is comfort for those who have lost their jobs or experience serious economic difficulties and lack of adequate social protection. May he inspire public authorities to act so that everyone, especially families in greatest need...” (Pope Francis. *Full text: Pope Francis’ Easter Urbi et Orbi blessing 2021*. Vatican City, April 4, 2021. Catholic News Agency last viewed 3/29/2024.

Let this Easter to love our brothers and sisters and really turn a charitable heart toward them. ‘cuz we love, we give.



THE EUCHARISTIC CREED

I believe in my heart and openly profess that the bread and wine placed upon the altar are, by the mystery of the prayer and words of the Redeemer, substantially changed into the true and life-giving flesh and blood of Jesus Christ the Lord, and that after the consecration, there is present the true Body of Christ which was born of the Virgin and offered up for the salvation of the world, hung on the cross and now sits at the right hand of the Father, and that there is present the true blood of Christ which flowed from His side. They are present not only by means of a sign and of the efficacy of the Sacrament, but also in the very reality and truth of their nature and substance.

EASTER AND THE HOLY EUCHARIST

We do not usually associate Easter and the Holy Eucharist. But we should. Our faith tells us that God became man in order that, by His death on the Cross, He might redeem the world. But this same faith tells us that, when Christ died on Calvary, the Church came into existence. We may therefore say that we were delivered from sin by the Savior's death, and receive the blessings of His grace through the Mystical Body which came into being the moment Jesus expired on Good Friday...

It (the Eucharist) is the Sacrifice-Sacrament of the Mass, the Communion-Sacrament of Holy Communion, and the Presence-Sacrament of the Real Presence.

On all three levels, the Eucharist is the Risen Jesus Christ whose humanity is a channel of divine grace to the world. It is impossible to exaggerate the importance of this truth of our faith. Even as we say this, we must remember that the Holy Eucharist is Jesus Christ who rose from the dead on Easter Sunday...

Sacrifice-Sacrament. The Risen Christ offers Himself during the double consecration in the Sacrifice of the Mass. He is on the altar as the Incarnate God in His human nature. He can no longer die a bodily death because He is now in His glorified Body. But He is ready to die because He has a truly human will by which He would die if He could...

Communion-Sacrament. In Holy Communion, the Risen Christ gives us Himself in the fullness of His divinity and humanity. The benefits of Holy Communion are beyond human calculation. When we receive our Lord, He strengthens our supernatural life, He gives us the ability to resist the unruly passions of our fallen human nature, He increases our virtues of faith, hope and charity, He removes the guilt of our venial sins and reduces the temporal punishment due to our forgiven sins.

Presence- Sacrament. During His visible presence in Palestine, Christ did mainly two things: He preached God's truth to the people and performed many miracles. Moreover, He foretold that those who believed in Him would witness even greater miracles in the future...

In the Blessed Sacrament, it is the same divine Teacher and the same Miracle Worker who taught and worked wonders during His visible stay before His ascension into heaven. All that is necessary on our part is to believe. Remember what the evangelist tells us in the Gospels? There were places in Palestine where the Savior was unable to convince the people of His teaching and unable to work miracles. Why? Because of their lack of faith.

Despite the rain, there was a good turn out for Good Friday's Veneration of the Cross and the evening's Stations of the Cross. Much appreciation to all who served this week.

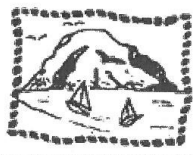
