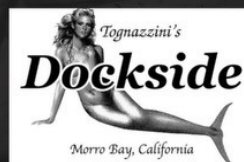

Sunday, April 14, 2024  
Without Fear



*Today's readings: Acts 3:13–15, 17–19; Psalm 4:2, 4, 7–8, 9 (7a); 1 John 2:1–5a; Luke 24:35–48.* “Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures,” we hear in today’s Gospel. Our lives are sometimes filled with so much noise that our Lord’s voice gets lost amid the cacophony. If time in silence with God is carved into our day, we can discern what God is saying to us in Scripture. But being still in a quiet place can be daunting. Begin the practice by sitting in the quiet one minute a day until that minute passes quickly. On subsequent days, increase the time to two, three, and four minutes until you are able to sit for twenty minutes with God.

In that silence, open yourself to be vulnerable to God. Doing so might seem daunting so begin by reading a verse

from Scripture, saying a short prayer, or speaking to God just as you would speak to a friend. Tell God what makes you doubt in his promise. There is no need to fear such a conversation with God, for he wants a deeper relationship with you. Just as he met the startled and terrified disciples where they were in their faith, so he will meet you.

“Peace be with you,” Jesus says to the disciples in today’s Gospel. He wants peace for you also. In the silence, Christ awaits your invitation to open your mind to the Scriptures. He, too, awaits your response as a witness to the mercy and forgiveness he offers all who believe. In accepting the peace that Christ offers, consider who in your life needs you to offer them mercy.



## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, April 15 Bread of Life

Jesus says to his disciples, “You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.” Jesus is the Bread of Life; he gave himself to us in the Last Supper and continues to do so at each Eucharist. Some people continue to go spiritually hungry because they do not avail themselves of the nourishment Christ offers. As you begin your week, ask God to work through you to continue building the kingdom. *Today’s readings: Acts 6:8–15; Psalm 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; John 6:22–29.*

### Tuesday, April 16 Never Hunger

People are always looking for signs. Despite all the times Jesus performed miracles, healed people, and cast out demons, some in today’s Gospel continue to doubt the power of God. People either believe because they have seen or because they have been healed. When asked to be given the bread of life, Jesus responded, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger.” As you receive the Eucharist every week, meditate on what It means for Christ to be the Bread of Life. How is he sustenance for you? *Today’s readings: Acts 7:51–8:1a; Psalm 31:3cd–4, 6, 7b, 8a, 17, 21ab; John 6:30–35.*

### Wednesday, April 17 Visible Signs

“I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me.” With those words in today’s Gospel, Jesus reveals that he has submitted his life to God. The first reading, from Acts, shows how such submission cost St. Stephen his life. But as Philip proclaimed the Messiah to Samaria, “there was great joy in that city.” Do you understand that you have a responsibility to bring the joy of the Gospel to those you meet? *Today’s readings: Acts 8:1b–8; Psalm 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; John 6:35–40.*

### Thursday, April 18 We Believe

Today’s Gospel encourages us to ponder the mystery of the Trinity. The reading tells us that no one has seen the Father “but the one who is from God.” Each Sunday at Mass, the faithful profess in the creed that Jesus is consubstantial with the Father. Pray with either the Apostles’ Creed or the Nicene Creed, taking time to realize what the words and our beliefs about the Trinity mean. *Today’s readings: Acts 8:26–40; Psalm 66:8–9, 16–17, 20; John 6:44–51.*

### Friday, April 19 New Lives

Saul’s plans—to bring back in chains anyone who followed the Way—were upended when Jesus asked, “Why are you persecuting me?” Soon, Saul was seeking baptism and proclaiming the Good News. Sudden changes often bring people to reconsider their priorities. A dramatic example of that occurred during the lockdowns of the COVID-19 pandemic. Do you need to reexamine your values and determine whether they are aligned with how God is calling you? *Today’s readings: Acts 9:1–20; Psalm 117:1bc, 2; John 6:52–59.*

### Saturday, April 20 Be Salt!

In today’s Gospel from John, we hear that many disciples “returned to their former way of life.” That image of people going back to their old ways is contrasted with Peter’s declaration of allegiance and the growth of the Church recorded in Acts. When we give in to temptation and return to former ways, we may experience momentary happiness but miss out on the peace that Christ offers. The reading from Acts tells of the peace in the Church as it was being built up. Where do you notice peace today? *Today’s readings: Acts 9:31–42; Psalm 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; John 6:60–69.*

**Sin miedo**



*Lecturas del día: Hechos 3:13–15, 17–19; Salmo 4:2, 4, 7–8, 9 (7a); 1 Juan 2:1–5a; Lucas 24:35–48.* “Entonces les abrió la inteligencia para que comprendieran la Escritura”, escuchamos en el evangelio de hoy. En ocasiones, estamos tan distraídos con el ruido de nuestro alrededor que la voz de Dios se pierde entre la cacofonía. Si dedicáramos un momento en silencio a Dios, podríamos discernir lo que Dios nos dice en las Sagradas Escrituras. Pero estarse quieto en un lugar sin ruido podría resultar en todo un reto. Empiece por sentarse en silencio durante un minuto por día hasta que ese minuto transcurra. En los días posteriores, alárguese a dos, tres y cuatro minutos hasta que logre sentarse con Dios durante veinte minutos.

En tal silencio, ábrase y muéstrese vulnerable ante Dios. ¿Le parece abrumador? Empiece por leer un versículo de las Escrituras, o por decir una oración breve, o por hablarle a Dios tal como lo haría con un amigo. Cuénteles sus dudas a Dios pues él desea profundizar la relación con usted. Así como él se presentó a los discípulos cuando ellos estaban asustados, él también se le presentará. “La paz esté con ustedes”, dice Jesús a los discípulos en el evangelio de hoy. Para usted también él quiere la paz. En silencio, Jesús aguarda la invitación de usted para abrirle la inteligencia a las Escrituras. También aguarda la respuesta de usted en cuanto testigo de la misericordia y el perdón que él ofrece a quienes creen.

**Lunes, 15 de abril**

### Pan de vida

Jesús dijo a los discípulos, “Les aseguro que no me buscan por las señales que han visto, sino porque se han hartado de pan”. Jesús es el Pan de Vida; se nos entregó en la Última Cena y sigue haciéndolo en la Eucaristía. Hay gente que sigue pasando hambre espiritual debido a que se han privado del alimento que Cristo nos ofrece. Esta semana, ore a Dios para que él obre a través de usted a fin de seguir edificando el reino. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 6:8–15; Salmo 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; Juan 6:22–29.*

**Martes, 16 de abril**

### Jamás con hambre

Hay gente que siempre está atenta a las señales. No obstante que Jesús obraba milagros, sanaba gente y expulsaba demonios, había gente que continuaba dudando del poder de Dios, según el evangelio de hoy. Algunos creían por lo que habían visto; otros, porque habían sido sanados. Cuando le piden que les dé el pan de vida, Jesús les responde, “Yo soy el pan de la vida: el que viene a mí no pasará hambre”. Esta semana al recibir la Eucaristía, medite lo que significa que Cristo sea el Pan de Vida. ¿De qué forma él es el sustento de usted? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 7:51–8:1a; Salmo 31:3cd–4, 6, 7b, 8a, 17, 21ab; Juan 6:30–35.*

**Miércoles, 17 de abril**

### Señales visibles

“Porque no bajé del cielo para hacer mi voluntad, sino la voluntad del que me envió”. Con tales palabras Jesús revela en el evangelio de hoy que ha entregado la vida a Dios. La primera lectura, de Hechos, muestra el grado de sumisión que le costó la vida a san Sebastián. Pero a medida que Felipe proclamaba el Mesías en Samaría, “la ciudad rebotaba de alegría”. ¿Tiene conciencia de la responsabilidad de llevar la alegría del Evangelio a cuantos usted conozca? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 8:1b–8; Salmo 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; Juan 6:35–40.*

**Jueves, 18 de abril**

### Sí creemos

El evangelio de hoy nos anima a reflexionar sobre el misterio de la Trinidad. La lectura nos dice que nadie ha visto al Padre “sino el que está junto al Padre”. En cada misa de domingo, el fiel profesa en el Credo que Jesús comparte la misma sustancia con el Padre. Ore con el Credo apostólico o el Credo Niceno y dedique tiempo para internalizar lo que significan esas palabras y las creencias de uno sobre la Trinidad. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 8:26–40; Salmo 66:8–9, 16–17, 20; Juan 6:44–51.*

**Viernes, 19 de abril**

### Vidas nuevas

Saulo tiene planeado encadenar a todo aquel que siga el Camino del Señor, pero sus planes se frustran cuando Jesús le pregunta, “¿Por qué me persigues?”. Al punto, Saulo desea bautizarse y luego proclamará la Buena Nueva. Hay cambios repentinos que hacen que uno reconsidere sus prioridades. Un ejemplo extremo de lo anterior ocurrió durante el confinamiento a causa de la pandemia del COVID-19. ¿Usted reevalúa sus valores para determinar si se alinean o no con el llamado de Dios? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 9:1–20; Salmo 117:1bc, 2; Juan 6:52–59.*

**Sábado, 20 de abril**

### ¡Sean sal!

El Evangelio de san Juan nos dice hoy que “muchos de sus discípulos lo abandonaron [a Jesús] y ya no andaban con él”. Esta imagen de la gente que vuelve a las andanzas de antes se contrasta con la declaración de fe de Pedro y con el crecimiento de la Iglesia registrada en Hechos. Cuando cedemos a la tentación y volvemos a las andanzas, es posible que nos sintamos felices por un momento, pero al cabo nos perdemos de la paz que Cristo nos ofrece. La lectura de Hechos nos habla de la paz de la que se gozaba a medida que se edificaba la Iglesia. ¿Dónde siente que hay paz ahora? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 9:31–42; Salmo 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; Juan 6:60–69.*

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?**

**A:** Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

**Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?**

**A:** Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

**Q: If we collect our goal of \$200, 000 before year's end, will we discontinue the Tarps Off Campaign?**

**A:** No. The money collected this year is not assessed so we will continue the Tarps Off Capital Campaign. It is recommended that the parish has at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses.

**Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?**

**A:** The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

\$ 28, 611 Collected as of March 20, 2023  
\$ 19, 082 Wall Cross Fundraiser  
\$ 20, 690 Insurance Payment (for walls)

**Q: What happened to that money collected?**

**A:** That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

**Q: If we add last year's roof fund (\$68, 383 ) to the current TARPS OFF gross donations (expenses not taken out) as of 25 March 2024 (\$77, 227) How much do we have?**

**A:** \$ 145, 610. 00 YAY!!!

**Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof drains?**

**A:** No, because that part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000. 00

**Q: It seems like we are doing well with the donations & creative fundraisers. We may not need a loan. What do you think?**

**A:** It depends. We still have the TARPS OFF creative fundraisers lined up:

- May 4—Legacy Formal Dinner and Ballroom Dance
- May 19—Pentecost Sunday Kermés
- May 19-June 23—Cross on the Wall Fundraiser
- June 22—"Painting Party"

We will see after these. We focus on these and make the most of this 2024 year because the parish keeps the full TARPS OFF amount for 2024.

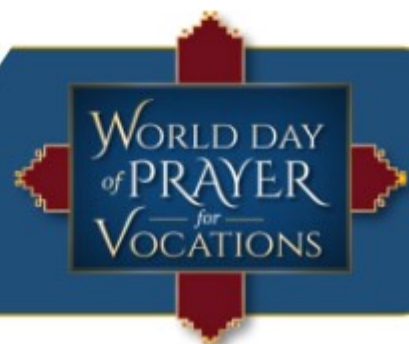

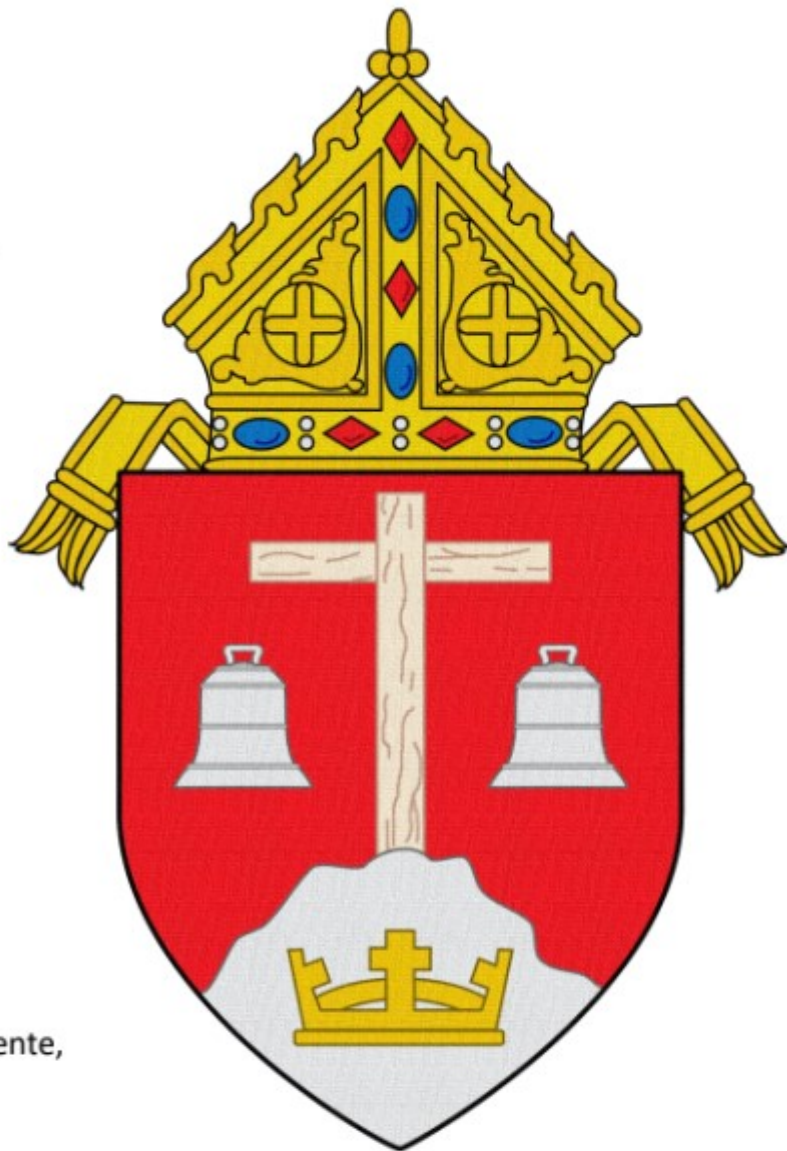

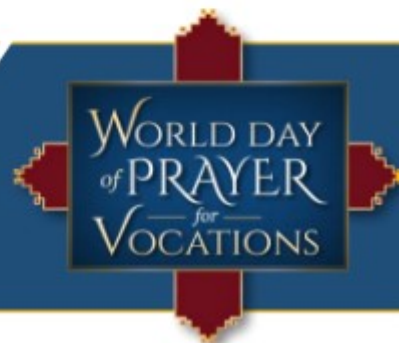

Love and mercy come in all forms, but it all leads us back to God. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read about how St. Peter was being questioned by the leaders of the people and the elders. (Acts 4:8-12) He knew in his heart that it was Christ who bestowed upon him the ability to heal and save another. He told the crowd gathered,

*“...then all of you and all the people of Israel should know that it was in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead; in his name this man stands before you healed. He is the stone rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved.”*

The Acts of the Apostles are believed to be written by Luke after he wrote the Gospel. The Acts are the story of the early Church, of our brothers and sisters in Christ including the Apostles and early disciples who were alive while Christ Jesus was, or knew of him through those who knew, saw, and were taught and healed by Christ. It is through them that our Tradition within the Catholic Church has been handed down through the generations along with Holy Scripture, both of which have been entrusted to the Magisterium, that line of successors of Christ, that is, the Pope, the Bishops, priests, and deacons, to teach, interpret scripture and make judgments on “tradition” within the Church.

The Magisterium is defined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church as *“The task of giving an authentic interpretation of the Word of God, whether in its written form or in the form of Tradition, has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone. Its authority in this matter is exercised in the name of Jesus Christ.” This means that the task of interpretation has been entrusted to the bishops in communion with the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome. (CCC 85)*

We see this in Peter’s statement above where he teaches about Jesus being the cornerstone that the builders rejected, using language and scripture familiar to the teachers of the Jewish people, to instruct them about Jesus and

opening their eyes to the love and mercy that Jesus Christ taught through his healing ministry for the salvation of the world.

Through his Life, Death, and Resurrection, Christ ransomed us from the snares of death, purchasing for us the rewards of eternal life in communion with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. All we need do is turn to him in humility and prayer. The Latin word from which ‘humility’ comes from is ‘humus’ meaning soil. Genesis 3:19 reminds us that *“By the sweat of your brow you shall eat bread, Until you return to the ground, from which you were taken; For you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”* We consider our gardens. Every good garden needs good soil for the plants to grow. Our faith life needs good soil too, and that is humility. St. Theresa of Avila suggested in her *The Way of Perfection*, that true humility is seeing ourselves the way that God sees us: accepting the good in us and recognizing that the good we have including both physical things and talents are gifts that we do not deserve. She wrote, *“Avoid being bashful with God, as some people are, in the belief they are humble. Yes, it would not be humility on your part if the King were to grant you a favor and you refused to accept it; humility is taking the favor and being pleased with it, and yet realizing how far you are from deserving it.” (Ch 28, 3)*

This is a wisdom that the early Church had. It enabled them to share from their excess freely, selling what they had and giving it to their parishes for redistribution where it was needed most. It also pointed all who witnessed their acts toward Christ Our Savior.

As we look at the world around us, as we look at members of our towns and cities, we see a world impoverished, in need of healing and love. May we be inspired by Christ in the Eucharist, that Bread of Angels, come to us through Christ’s Passion and Resurrection, to remember that what we have is merely a gift, something passing, and to be shared. May we be like the early Church in our zeal to bear witness to Christ through the sharing and witnessing of Christ burning in our hearts. Let us give not for our own glory, but because of our humility and knowing it all comes from God who first loved us. ‘cuz we love, we give.



(Beginning of quote regarding the woman at the well Jn 4: 4-42)

"The Lord had given this person such a lively faith that, when she heard people say they wished they had lived when Christ walked on this earth, she would smile to herself, for she knew that we have Him as truly with us in the Most Holy Sacrament as people had Him then, and wonder what more they could possibly want.

I know, too, that for many years this person, though by no means perfect, always tried to strengthen her faith, when she communicated, by thinking that it was exactly as if she saw the Lord entering her house, with her own bodily eyes, for she believed in very truth that this Lord was entering her poor abode, and she ceased, as far as she could, to think of outward things, and went into her abode with Him. She tried to recollect her senses so that they might all become aware of this great blessing, or rather, so that they should not hinder the soul from becoming conscious of it. She imagined herself at His feet and wept with the Magdalen exactly as if she had seen Him with her bodily eyes in the Phari-see's house. Even if she felt no devotion, faith told her that it was good to be there.

For, unless we want to be foolish and to close our minds to facts, we cannot suppose that this is the work of the imagination, as it is when we think of the Lord on the Cross, or of other incidents of the Passion, and picture within ourselves how these things happened. This is something which is happening now; it is absolutely true; and we have no need to go and seek Him somewhere a long way off. For we know that, until the accidents of bread have been consumed by our natural heat, the good Jesus is with us and we should [not lose so good an opportunity but should] come to Him. If, while He went about in the world, the sick were healed merely by touching His clothes, how can we doubt that He will work miracles when He is within us, if we have faith, or that He will give us what we ask of Him since He is in our house? His Majesty is not wont to offer us too little payment for His lodging if we treat Him well."

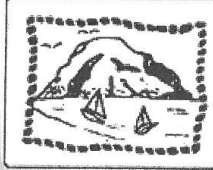
Our 1st Saturday Mass and Rosary last weekend was well attended by those who normally attend our daily Masses. Interestingly, this photo from that Mass captures the natural light from the skylights. So far, only one person has mentioned (positively) the use of limited lighting with mostly natural light at our Masses with the exception of the Saturday evening Mass, which sometimes uses the cross lights in addition to the lights above the altar. It has been part of our efforts to reduce the cost of Parish Operation expenses, since donations have been waning the last few weeks including those funds used for salaries, bills, etc.. The experiment has also given insight to see how much light we actually receive from the skylights.
