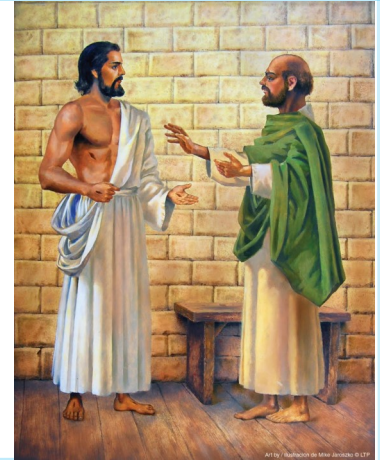

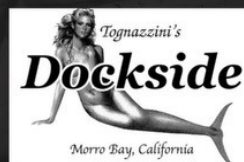

Sunday, April 7, 2024  
Ever Merciful



*Today's readings: Acts 4:32–35; Psalm 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; 1 John 5:1–6; John 20:19–31.* On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Church also celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. The readings today reveal some of the many facets of God's mercy. The psalm proclaims that "his mercy endures forever," and in the Gospel, Jesus enacts that mercy as he greets the disciples in peace. In a loving manner, Jesus helps the group of disciples overcome doubt about the resurrection. Though his followers do not recognize him, he is gentle, beginning both visits with the greeting, "Peace be with you."

During the homily on the canonization of St. Faustina, Pope John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter

would be called Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Faustina had shared her visions of Jesus appearing to her dressed in a white garment and with rays of light emanating from his heart. Jesus asked her to share the word of his mercy for a day to celebrate his mercy. St. Faustina trusted her vision.

The disciples to whom Jesus first appeared and whom he showed his wounds also trusted the man standing before them. At the sight of Jesus, these followers surrendered themselves completely to God. Think about your first encounter with Jesus. What was that moment like for you? How has your relationship changed over the stages of your life? Have others come to know Christ through your belief?



## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, April 8 Say Yes!

God loved the world so much that he sent his only Son and chose Mary as his mother. Though Mary was a young girl, she did not waver in her response to God, replying to the angel, “May it be done to me according to your word.” How hard is it for you to say yes to God? Do you need to practice an affirmative response to God? As we continue to celebrate Easter, pause for a moment to acknowledge the opportunities in your life to say yes to God’s will. *Today’s readings: Isaiah 7:10–14, 8–10; Psalm 40:7–8a, 8b–9, 10, 11; Hebrews 10:4–10; Luke 1:26–38.*

### Tuesday, April 9 Invitation to Give

Imagine being told you need to rid yourself of all your possessions and give them to those in need. Many saints eschewed lavish lives and gave their wealth to the poor. These men and women stood in solidarity with those in need. God invites us to be in relationship with both him and others. Just as Jesus emptied himself for us, we must empty ourselves in service to others. How can you empty yourself for members of your community? *Today’s readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; John 3:7b–15.*

### Wednesday, April 10 Forgiving Yourself

Not only does God hear the cry of the poor, as the psalm proclaims, but he sent his Son so that all who believe might have eternal life. It is especially heartening to hear that “God did not send his Son into the world to condemn.” Pray to God that he might help you forgive yourself for shortcomings. Should you not show yourself the same forgiveness that God shows you? *Today’s readings: Acts 5:7–26; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; John 3:16–21.*

### Thursday, April 11 Power to Speak

“We must obey God rather than men,” Peter tells his persecutors in today’s reading from Acts. On this Memorial of St. Stanislaus, the Church honors a bishop who was not afraid to speak out against the evil in the king’s deeds. As a Christian, are you committed to the work of fighting injustice and asserting the dignity of all people? Are you ready to be pointed out because you speak the truth? Pray to God that, through the power of the Holy Spirit, you are bestowed with strength and courage to denounce injustice and suffering. *Today’s readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2, 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.*

### Friday, April 12 Trust in God

Have you ever discovered that you were “fighting against God,” as today’s first reading cautions? Why is it so hard for you to trust in God and let something be? After all, God will more than provide for our needs just as Jesus did when he multiplied the loaves and fish for the people who came to him. Humbly ask God to bestow upon you a gentle heart that listens to his Word and is open to his will. *Today’s readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.*

### Saturday, April 13 Surrender

“It is I. Do not be afraid,” Jesus says to his disciples. Over and over, Scripture instructs not to be afraid and yet fear keeps a hold on us. God requests his followers to put their complete trust in him. God is always with us. Pause to feel his presence. When feeling alone or afraid, pray that the Holy Spirit fills you with courage to surrender to God. *Today’s readings: Acts 6:1–7, Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.*

**Domingo, 7 de abril de 2024**  
**Siempre misericorde**



*Lecturas del día: Hechos 4:32–35; Salmo 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; 1 Juan 5:1–6; Juan 20:19–31.* En este Segundo Domingo de Pascua, la Iglesia también celebra el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Las lecturas de hoy muestran algunos aspectos de la enorme misericordia de Dios. El salmo proclama que “es eterno su amor” y en el evangelio, Jesús encarna la misericordia al saludar a los discípulos con la paz. De una forma cariñosa, Jesús ayuda a Tomás y al resto de los discípulos a dejar de lado las dudas sobre la resurrección. Si bien sus seguidores no lo reconocen, él es amable al saludarlos en ambas visitas con el mismo saludo: “La paz esté con ustedes”.

Durante la homilía de la canonización de santa Faustina, Juan Pablo II declaró que el Segundo Domingo de

Pascua se llamaría en adelante Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Santa Faustina había compartido sus visiones de Jesús que se le aparecía vestido de blanco y con rayos luminosos saliéndole del corazón. Para celebrar su misericordia, Jesús le pidió correr la voz al respecto. Santa Faustina confió en su visión. Los discípulos a quienes Jesús se les apareció primero y a quienes les mostró las heridas también confiaron en el hombre que tenían enfrente. Al ver a Jesús, estos seguidores se rindieron por completo ante Dios. Recuerde el primer encuentro que tuvo con Jesús. ¿Cómo le resultó ese momento? Con el correr de los años, ¿qué tanto ha cambiado esa relación? ¿Otros han conocido a Jesús a través de la fe de usted?

The release of the loan money from the Diocese has not been finalized. The Diocese of Monterey Finance Department has asked us to show with pledges that we can pay the other 50% of our loan that we have applied for.

Thank you for your pledge!

**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

**Q: Did the amount needed for the roof change from 2023 to 2024?**

**A:** Yes. With the 2023 rise in prices for building materials and labor, the roofing companies said this is an increased cost to us. 'Surprises' due to wood rot and other issues were NOT factored into bids; we are told to prepare.

**Q: If the parish collects more than is needed to repay the loan, where will that money go?**

**A:** Any money collected beyond the \$200,000 to repay the loan will be placed into our parish savings account for the months when annually Sunday collections, especially the summer months and holiday breaks when parishioners travel, are lean and we barely receive enough funding, and sometimes don't, for parish operations.

**Q: If we collect our goal of \$200, 000 before year's end, will we discontinue the Tarps Off Campaign?**

**A:** No. The money collected this year is not assessed so we will continue the Tarps Off Capital Campaign. It is recommended that the parish has at least \$50,000 in savings for lean months and unexpected expenses.

**Q: Could you share with us the funds that we collected last year?**

**A:** The following were published in our bulletin, website and announced at Masses last year:

- \$ 28, 611 Collected as of March 20, 2023
- \$ 19, 082 Wall Cross Fundraiser
- \$ 20, 690 Insurance Payment (for walls)

**Q: What happened to that money collected?**

**A:** That money is still set aside for the roof replacement. The Diocese requires parishes to have half the loan amount needed before giving a parish a loan. The Diocese waived the full amount needed to acquire the loan as we have \$68, 383 (see above) and need is great.

**Q: If we add last year's roof fund (\$68, 383 ) to the current TAPRS OFF donations as of 25 March 2024 (\$76, 296) How much do we have?**

**A:** \$ 144, 679. 00 YAY!!!

**Q: With that amount, can we start the work at least for the slope, flat roofs, roof top parapets, and roof drains?**

**A:** No, because that part of the construction amounts to almost \$150, 000. 00

**Q: It seems like we are doing well with the donations & creative fundraisers. We may not need a loan. What do you think?**

**A:** It depends. We still have the TARPS OFF creative fundraisers lined up:

- May 4—Legacy Formal Dinner and Ballroom Dance
- May 19—Pentecost Sunday Kermés
- May 19-June 23—Cross on the Wall Fundraiser

We will see after these. We focus on these and make the most of this 2024 year because the parish keeps the full TAPRS OFF amount for 2024.

*Dubium sapientiae initium*” meaning, “Doubt is the origin of wisdom,” is a phrase that René Descartes used in his writing, *Meditations on First Philosophy*, when exploring the usefulness of doubt to solidify knowledge. Writing in the first person, he explained that in general we get stuck in our opinions and experiences and therefore we come to doubt things until it is proven often through our senses, and then we can believe. He wrote, “*I will at length apply myself earnestly and freely to the general overthrow of all my former opinions. But, to this end, it will not be necessary for me to show that the whole of these are false...All that I have, up to this moment, accepted as possessed of the highest truth and certainty, I received either from or through the senses. I observed, however, that these sometimes misled us; and it is the part of prudence not to place absolute confidence in that by which we have even once been deceived. But it may be said, perhaps, that, although the senses occasionally mislead us respecting minute objects, and such as are so far removed from us as to be beyond the reach of close observation, there are yet many other of their information (presentations), of the truth of which it is manifestly impossible to doubt.*” (Descartes, R., Meditation 1, *OF THE THINGS OF WHICH WE MAY DOUBT*, Para. 1, 2,3-4. ClassicalLibrary.org., last accessed 4-5-2024)

In Holy Scripture, in particular, Jn 20:19-31 the Apostle Thomas, also called Didymus in Greek, portrays this same sense of doubt towards new information because he already has his own thoughts and opinions, and he is afraid of trusting in something that is not true, and he so he wants to know it well and be enough proof for him to shake away all that he believed as his highest truths. He is being challenged to grow and mature his thought processes to a greater extent past what his prior observations and experiences have taught him were truth.

It is important to remember that Thomas had great faith in Jesus. He was there when Jesus learned that Lazarus was sick. Jesus said, “This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it.” Jesus explained to the Apostles through their opposition to return to Judea where Jesus was just nearly stoned, that Lazarus was dead. It was

Thomas himself who said, “Let us also go to die with him,” so willing to go with Jesus and encouraged the others to come as well. (Jn 11:1-16)

At the Last Supper when Jesus acknowledged the Apostle’s faith in God asked them to have faith in them too during the discourse at supper. Jesus told them that he was going to his father’s house and prepare rooms for them, and that they should follow. In his honesty and misunderstanding, Thomas blurted out, “Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?” Jesus said in reply, Jesus said to him, “I am the way and the truth\* and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him.” (Jn 14:1-14)

Thomas had faith. He struggled to understand entirely Jesus’ meaning behind his words. He needed to see and experience their friend Lazarus raised from the dead to that Lazarus’ illness truly did not end in death, something which Jesus had said. He needed more to help him understand what his senses were telling him was real. He needed the Word broken open for him to reaffirm his truth in which he placed his faith. And Jesus came to Thomas after he had heard about the resurrection from those who had gone to the grace, from those returning from Emmaus, and even those who had been present when Jesus came into the locked room and breathed upon the ten Apostles there days before.

This was his time. This our time. We join with Thomas in stating emphatically, “My Lord and my God!” (Jn 20:28)

These are the very words that we say quietly to Our Lord when he is presented to us at the altar during Mass. Doubt can hold us back from being our best self, but Jesus takes us and invites us to put ourselves into his side, into his nail holes to believe better: to be one with him as he is in the Father because he is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We share in his work the way Thomas and the others did. We give freely the love, mercy, and compassion given to us by the Holy Trinity. Christ is our Truth. The Holy Spirit is our advocate to the Father through the Son. We believe. We love. We share what we have. ‘cuz we love, we give.



“I thanked the Lord Jesus for having redeemed us and for having given us the greatest of all gifts, the Holy Eucharist.” “You wanted to stay with us, and so you left us yourself in the Sacrament of the Altar, and you opened wide your mercy to us. You opened an inexhaustible spring of mercy for us, giving us your dearest possession, the Blood and Water, that gushed forth from Your Heart” (*Diary* 1747).

At the moment of consecration...the sacrifice was fully consummated. Hereafter, only the external ceremony of death will be carried out. Never in my whole life had I understood this mystery so profoundly as during that hour of adoration” (*Diary* 684, 757, 832)

Who will ever conceive and understand the depth of mercy that gushed forth from His Heart? It is only in eternity that we shall know the great mystery given to us in Holy Communion. One day we will know what God is doing for us in each Mass, and what sort of gift He is preparing through it for us.”

“All the tongues of men and angels united could not find words adequate to describe this mystery of Your love and mercy”. “Transform me in Yourself, O Jesus, that I may be a living sacrifice and pleasing to You. I desire to atone at each moment of my life for poor sinners.” Jesus answered her prayers telling her: “You are a living host, pleasing to the Heavenly Father” (*Diary* 1826). Through our communion with Christ we grow in self-emptying love that desires to offer reparation for sinners. The Eucharist moves us to an ever-greater thirst for the salvation of souls.

All the good that is in me is due to the Holy Communion. I owe everything to it.”

Here, I am entirely yours, soul, body and divinity as Your Bridegroom. You know what love demands, one thing only, reciprocity”. (*Diary* 1770) “At that moment, I was drawn into the bosom of the Most Holy Trinity, and I was immersed in the love of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.” (*Diary* 1670, 1121, 1129)

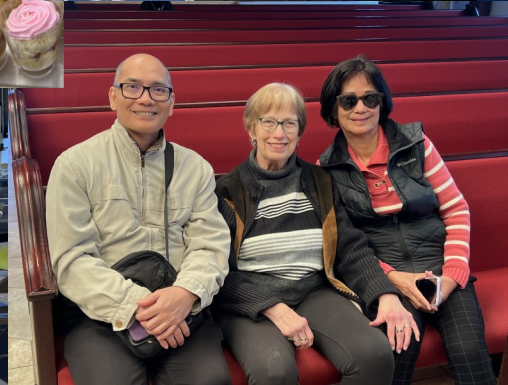

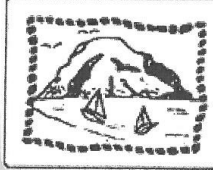
