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

Sunday, March 20, 2016
Empty Oneself

Today's Readings: Luke 19:28–40; Isaiah 50:4–7; Psalm 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Philippians 2:6–11; Luke 22:14–23:56. This Sunday marks the beginning of the holiest week of our liturgical year. The community gathers to retell the story of Jesus' Passion and Death to prepare for the celebration of the Resurrection. Holy Week is a time to be intentional about prayer so that our hearts can be roused by God's Word and moved to compassion. It's a time to allow Christ's Passion to pierce your heart. During this season of Lent, we have been asked to die to our sinful ways and turn back to God. Contrition has moved us to seek God's mercy and deepened our relationship with God. Today, the Scriptures tell the whole story of Jesus' Passion. It's hard to

capture the beauty and intensity of these passages. We are also called to empty ourselves and totally give of ourselves for the other. Jesus didn't die because of guilt. His compassion overflowed and his Death brought us life. How have you emptied yourself so that others might have life? What do you still need to let go of so you can grow in compassion and share the joy of Christ's Resurrection? Remember that each time we celebrate the Eucharist, the love of God is poured out and shared with us. It is shared not only for us to give worship to God, but to conform our hearts to Christ's and therefore sanctify us. During this Holy Week, you might physically prepare your house for Easter as a way to ponder emptying yourself.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 21, 2016

Anointing

Our Gospel today portrays Mary anointing Jesus' feet, foreshadowing the burial anointing. Judas selfishly asks about the oil. Is this a sign that he has turned away from Jesus? The First Reading announces that God's servant will bring justice and light to those in darkness. Does Mary's anointing help us see Jesus as the Messiah who will redeem us? Use oil in your family prayer tonight and talk about Jesus, the Anointed One, and how oil is a part of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders.

Today's Readings: Isaiah 42:1-7; Psalm 27:1, 2, 3, 13-14; John 12:1-11.

Tuesday, March 22, 2016

Betrayal

Today, we hear the story of Judas' betrayal. This Apostle spent so much time with Jesus and then turned away from him. All of us can identify with Judas, because even our small sins are a turning away from Christ. Jesus, the Light to the Nations, is always seeking to heal and reconcile with us. In preparation for Easter, light a candle and reflect on your Baptism.

Today's Readings: Isaiah 49:1-6; Psalm 71:1-2, 3-4a, 5ab-6ab, 15 and 17; John 13:21-33, 36-38.

Wednesday, March 23, 2016

Spy Wednesday

We again hear of Judas' betrayal. Jesus indicates that it is necessary to fulfill God's will. Like the servant in Isaiah, Jesus perseveres; he continues to preach the Kingdom of God. Jesus freely offers himself so that we might be saved. He is God's servant, the chosen one of Israel who, though led to the slaughter like a lamb, triumphs over sin and death.

Today's Readings: Isaiah 50:4-9a; Psalm 69:8-10, 21-22, 31 and 33-34; Matthew 26:14-25.

Thursday, March 24, 2016

Holy Thursday

The Chrism Mass highlights Jesus as the Anointed One. At this Mass, the holy oils are blessed by the bishop and then brought back to each parish. The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and Christ's washing of the Apostles' feet. We are given a mission to serve others and share the Good News. After the evening Mass, spend time adoring Christ in the chapel. *Today's Readings: (Chrism Mass) Isaiah 61:1-3a, 6a, 8b-9; Psalm 89:21-2, 25 and 27; Revelation 1:5-8; Luke 4:16-21; (Mass of the Lord's Supper) Exodus 12:1-8, 11-14; Psalm 116:12-13, 15-16bc, 17-18; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; John 13:1-15.*

Friday, March 25, 2016

Good Friday

Today's liturgy invites us to ponder the mystery of Christ's Death and how our lives are connected to it. Pay close attention to the Passion narrative and the solemn intercessions. When venerating the cross, linger a moment and rejoice that God's goodness has saved us from death. *Today's Readings: Isaiah 52:13—53:12; Psalm 31:2, 6, 12-13, 15-16, 17, 25; Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9; John 18:1-19:42.*

Saturday, March 26, 2016

Easter Vigil


Tonight's liturgy is filled with rich symbols to tell the story of our faith. Settle in and listen attentively to the readings, which lead baptismal liturgy. This is the night, the holiest night in our Church year. We rejoice at Christ's wondrous victory over death. *Today's Readings: Genesis 1:1-2:2; Psalm 104:1-2, 5-6, 10, 12, 13-14, 24, 35; Genesis 22:1-18; Psalm 16:5, 8, 9-10, 11; Exodus 14:15-15:1; Psalm: Exodus 15:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 17-18; Isaiah 54:5-14; Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13; Isaiah 55:1-11; Psalm: Isaiah 12:2-3, 4, 5-6; Baruch 3:9-15, 32-4:4; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Ezekiel 36:16-17a, 18-28; Psalm 42:3, 5; 43:3, 4; Romans 6:3-11; Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23; Luke 24:1-12.*

la muerte.



Domingo, 20 de marzo de 2016 Vaciarse de sí mismo

Lecturas del día: Lucas 19:28–40; Isaías 50:4–7; Salmo 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Filipenses 2:6–11; Lucas 22:14–23:56. Comienza la semana más santa del año litúrgico. La comunidad se reúne para contar la pasión y muerte de Jesús, como preparación a la resurrección. La Semana Santa es un tiempo para orar con mayor conciencia, de modo que nuestro corazón se vea seducido por la palabra de Dios y se mueva a compasión. Es cuando la pasión de Cristo puede traspasar nuestro corazón. En la Cuaresma se nos pide morir a nuestros modos pecaminosos y volvernos a Dios. La contrición nos mueve a buscar la misericordia de Dios y a profundizar nuestra relación con él.

Hoy escuchamos el relato completo de la pasión de

Jesús. No es fácil captar la belleza y la intensidad de sus pasajes que nos invitan a vaciarnos de nosotros mismos y a darnos totalmente a los demás. Jesús no murió por haber cometido algún crimen. Derramó su compasión, y su muerte nos trajo vida. ¿Cómo se ha vaciado usted, para que otros tengan vida? ¿De qué cosas necesita usted liberarse para crecer en la compasión y compartir la alegría de la resurrección de Cristo? Recuerde que cada vez que celebramos la Eucaristía, Dios derrama su amor sobre nosotros. Se nos da no sólo para rendir culto a Dios, sino para que nuestro corazón se asemeje al de Cristo y, así, santificarnos. En la Semana Santa, usted puede físicamente ir preparando su casa para la Pascua, como un modo de vaciarse de sí mismo.



LA SEMANA EN CASA

Lunes, 21 de marzo de 2016 Unción

Escuchamos el relato de María ungiendo los pies de Jesús, como una anticipación a la unción funeraria. Movido por el egoísmo, Judas pregunta por el aceite. ¿Es esto una señal de que se ha alejado de Jesús? ¿La unción de María nos ayuda a ver a Jesús como el Mesías que nos redimirá? Para la oración familiar de esta noche, coloque enfrente un platito con aceite y converse sobre Jesús, el Ungido, y cómo el aceite forma parte de los sacramentos del Bautismo, de la Confirmación y del Orden Sacerdotal. *Lecturas del día:* Isaías 42:1–7; Salmo 27:1, 2, 3, 13–14; Juan 12:1–11.

Martes, 22 de marzo de 2016 Traición

Judas acompañó a Jesús un largo tiempo y luego se alejó de él. Todos podemos identificarnos con Judas, porque incluso nuestros pequeños pecados nos alejan de Cristo. En preparación a la Pascua, usted puede encender una vela y meditar en su propio bautismo. *Lecturas del día:* Isaías 49:1–6; Salmo 71:1–2, 3–4a, 5ab–6ab, 15 y 17; Juan 13:21–33, 36–38.

Miércoles, 23 de marzo de 2016 El traidor

Vuelve a salir la traición de Judas. Jesús indica que es necesaria para cumplir la voluntad de Dios. Por propia voluntad, Jesús se ofrece por la salvación del mundo. Él es el Siervo, el Elegido de Israel, quien, a pesar de ser llevado como cordero al matadero, triunfa sobre el pecado y la muerte. *Lecturas del día:* Isaías 50:4–9a; Salmo 69:8–10, 21–22, 31 y 33–34; Mateo 26:14–25.

Jueves, 24 de marzo de 2016 Jueves Santo

La Misa Crismal resalta que Jesús es el Ungido. En esa misa, el obispo bendice los santos óleos y los entrega a cada parro-

quia. La misa vespertina de la Cena del Señor conmemora la institución de la Eucaristía y a Cristo lavando los pies de los apóstoles. Después de la misa vespertina, dedique algún tiempo a la adoración de Cristo sacramentado en el sagrario. *Lecturas del día:* (Misa Crismal) Isaías 61:1–3a, 6a, 8b–9; Salmo 89:21–2, 25 y 27; Apocalipsis 1:5–8; Lucas 4:16–21; (Misa de la Cena del Señor) Éxodo 12:1–8, 11–14; Salmo 116:12–13, 15–16bc, 17–18; 1 Corintios 11:23–26; Juan 13:1–15.

Viernes, 25 de marzo de 2016 Viernes Santo

La liturgia de hoy se concentra en la muerte de Cristo. Se nos invita a considerar su misterio y cómo nuestra vida se conecta con su muerte. Ponga mucha atención al relato de la pasión y a las intercesiones. Al acercarse usted a la cruz para venerarla, medite en ella y regocíjese de que Dios, en su bondad, nos ha salvado de la muerte. *Lecturas del día:* Isaías 52:13–53:12; Salmo 31:2, 6, 12–13, 15–16, 17, 25; Hebreos 4:14–16; 5:7–9; Juan 18:1–19:42.

Sábado, 26 de marzo de 2016 Vigilia Pascual

Esta noche, la liturgia está llena de los símbolos que cuentan la historia de nuestra fe. Esta noche es la más santa de las noches del año en la Iglesia. Nos regocijamos por la maravillosa victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte. Cantamos con mucho brío el Aleluya, y recibimos a los iniciados en la fe con intenso júbilo, y los festejamos en comunidad después de misa. ¡El Señor resucitó! *Lecturas del día:* Génesis 1:1–2:2; Salmo 104:1–2, 5–6, 10, 12, 13–14, 24, 35; Génesis 22:1–18; Salmo 16:5, 8, 9–10, 11; Éxodo 14:15–15:1; Salmo: Éxodo 15:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 17–18; Isaías 54:5–14; Salmo 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12, 13; Isaías 55:1–11; Salmo: Isaías 12:2–3, 4, 5–6; Baruc 3:9–15, 32–4:4; Salmo 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Ezequiel 36:16–17a, 18–28; Salmo 42:3, 5; 43:3, 4; Romanos 6:3–11; Salmo 118:1–2, 16–17, 22–23; Lucas 24:1–12.
