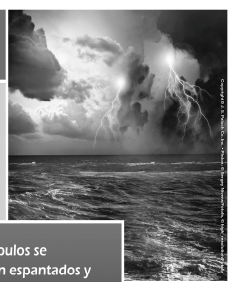

St. Elizabeth budget requires **\$4,408.00 per week** to meet expenses.

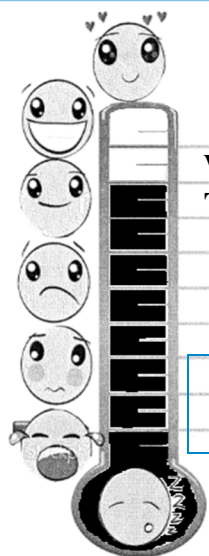
The collection for Saturday– Sunday 13-14 June 2015 was **\$2,140.25**

The weekly plate collection covers just over half of the church's operating expenses. The rest of the expenses are covered by a few monthly donations and our various fundraising events throughout the year: the AMA drive, the International Festival and the other smaller efforts like tamale sales and chicken dinners, etc. When we added in all of the fundraising income to date in this fiscal year (Sept 2014-May 31, 2015), we discovered that we are working within a few hundred dollars of our budget. Moreover, if there is a major expenditure, we do not have an extra income to cover it. This is why your participation in each of our fundraisers is so vitally important—and immensely appreciated.
