Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The parish of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton follows the *Safe Environment Program* designed by the Diocese of Monterey in accordance with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*.

Due to recent changes, the *Safe Environment Program* is now comprised of three distinct elements:

1. **LIVE Scan fingerprinting** (used for background checks);
2. **Shield the Vulnerable** (an online child safety course in identifying and reporting abuse);
3. **Seminar on Safe Environment Program** (teaches ministers and volunteers how to empower kids to protect themselves and how to establish a safe environment for kids in the parish)

Combined these three elements better equip the ministers and volunteers in protecting, safeguarding, and providing a safe and secure place for our children and young people within St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (SEAS) parish.

## **WHO MUST DO THE 3?**

To be fully compliant with the requirements set by the Diocese of Monterey, **all ministers and volunteers who have contact with children in parish service MUST complete all three aspects of the Safe Environment Program.**

Accomplishing all 3 means you are allowed by the Diocese of Monterey to serve children in St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church and other diocese-sponsored or hosted activities.

## **WHAT MUST BE DONE?**

1. If you need the LIVE Scan fingerprinting, please pick up the form in the parish office.
2. The *Shield the Vulnerable* takes less than 90 minutes to complete online. We ask that you print 2 copies of your certificate, submit 1 to the parish office, and keep 1 for your records. Visit the websites:

If you don't have access to computer, please make an appointment in the parish office. We are happy to assist you.

3. On September 2015, the diocesan director of the *Safe Environment Program* Deacon Warren Hoy will give two seminars (one in English, one in Spanish) at our parish for the *Safe Environment Program*. All ministers and volunteers who have contact or potential contact with children or youth are expected to attend one of these meetings. Exact date and time to be announced later.

I know that all these entail extra effort from everyone, including myself. However, the benefits of this program outweighs all the hassles: a secure worship and learning environment for all; kids are surrounded with ministers and volunteers with diocese-issued ID or badges whom they can easily recognize, approach, ask help when needed during parish clean-up days, International Festival, parish parties and functions, etc.

I appointed Heather Hurley to coordinate with Deacon Warren to ensure that our parish staff, ministers, and volunteers have completed all requirements for the *Safe Environment Program*. If you have questions or concerns regarding the *Safe Environment Program* or any aspect of it, please contact Heather or leave a message for her in the parish office.





## **GOSPEL JN 6:1-15**




