My Dear Parish Staff and Volunteers
who work with Children,

God's Peace and Love!

Last 13th November 2016, Bishop Richard Garcia sent a letter to all Pastors, Principals, Coordinators & Directors of Religious Education, and Youth Ministers requesting to review existing Parish Safe Environment Program. This means that all staff and volunteers who work with children and youth (e.g. All Faith Formation Catechists, Children's Liturgy of the Word Catechists, Altar Servers Coordinator, Youth Minister, Chaperones for overnights and retreats, etc.) must be "cleared and trained as appropriate in accordance with the Safe Environment Program. Those who meet the requirements will be issued badges by the Diocese indicating that they are cleared to work with children."

Last 20th November 2015, the General Counsel of the Diocese of Monterey, Susan Mayer, sent out a letter to all Catechetical Leaders and Youth Ministers of all parishes affirming the seriousness of Bishop Garcia's request and of the *Safe Environment Program* of the Diocese of Monterey. She said, "we need to be absolutely confident that anyone who teaches, trains, or works with any minor is fingerprinted and has completed *Shield the Vulnerable*." "Allowing uncleared adults to work with minors will result in employment or volunteer services being **suspended**."

As your pastor, I am pleased to tell you that we are doing what our beloved Bishop is requesting us to do. However, we are not yet finish with the process because there are still some of you who have not been fingerprinted or have not completed the *Shield the Vulnerable*. Since I value your person and your services to the children and youth of our parish, I instructed Javier Soto Osorio to personally remind you about the fingerprinting and *Shield the Vulnerable*. Please do not get offended when he approaches you. I, the children, and the parish needs you that is why we are trying our best to help you comply with the requirements set by the Diocese of Monterey

Thank you so much for making our parish a safe place for all our children.

El Pasado 13 de noviembre 2016, el obispo Richard Garcia envió una carta a todos los Pastores, Directores, Coordinadores y Directores de Educación Religiosa, y de Ministros de la Juventud solicitando que se revise el Programa de Ambiente Seguro de la Parroquia. Esto significa que el personal y los voluntarios que trabajan con niños y jóvenes (por ejemplo, Formación de la fe y Catequistas, Liturgia de los niños y los Coordinadores de los Monaguillos, Ministro de la Juventud, chaperones para pasar la noche y retiros, etc.) debe ser "aprobados y entrenados de forma apropiada de acuerdo con el Programa de Ambiente Seguro. Las personas que reúnan los requisitos serán dadas insignias de la Diócesis que indican que si puedan trabajar con los niños "

El Pasado 20 de noviembre 2015, el Consejo General de la Diócesis de Monterey, Susan Mayer, envió una carta a todos los dirigentes de catequesis y ministros de jóvenes de todas las parroquias que afirman la gravedad de la petición del obispo Garcia y del Programa de Ambiente Seguro de la Diócesis de Monterey. Ella dijo, "tenemos que estar absolutamente seguros de que cualquier persona que enseña, o trabajan con cualquier menor de edad han hecho sus huellas digitales y han terminado el programa Escudo del Vulnerable." "Permitir que los adultos que no ha hecho estos requisitos para trabajar con menores de edad se traducirá en las suspendidos de su empleo y los voluntarios dejar no podrán ayudar en la parroquia. "




Stay Alert

Today's Readings: Jeremiah 33:14–16; Psalm 25:4–5, 8–9, 10, 14; 1 Thessalonians 3:12—4:2; Luke 21:25–28, 34–36. As we begin this season of hope and expectation, you might want to take a moment to think about the past year. What paths did you take and where did they lead you? In what ways were you a sign of God's love to your family, parish community, or coworkers?

Even though Advent is a relatively short liturgical season, it is a rich time. It calls us to reflect more profoundly on the mystery of Christ's coming first as a child and then at the end of time. The Church gives us this season as a moment to pause and reflect on our life in Christ. She asks us to evaluate our lives and ready our hearts for the coming of Christ.

This is no easy task. Often we are distracted, drowsy, and anxious and so we lose sight of Christ.

The readings this Sunday clearly set the stage for our Advent journey and quickly immerse us into the hard questions. Each reading challenges us to consider God's promise to save us from death and establish a reign of peace. In the Gospel, Jesus provides a disturbing description of the world on that final day. Yet, he tells us to stand tall with our heads raised and warns us to be vigilant and to pray for endurance. Do you ever consider your readiness for the coming of the Messiah? If you have fallen in love with Christ, does your life proclaim that to all the earth? Stay alert this season and let Christ guide your heart on the right path.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, November 30, 2015 Feast of St. Andrew, Apostle

The Gospel narratives say little about Andrew, but tradition tells us he evangelized Greece and Turkey and was crucified. The theme of today's Gospel is summed up in the phrase "Follow me." Andrew and Peter risked everything to follow Christ. Jesus invites us every day to follow him and to give witness to his love and mercy. During Advent, take time each day to reflect on your life in Christ. Jesus has called you. How do you respond to his invitation? *Today's Readings:* Romans 10:9–18; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Matthew 4:18–22.

Tuesday, December 1, 2015 Justice Shall Flourish

During the season of Advent, we reflect on the coming of the Messiah not only as a child, but also at the end of time. Today's passage from Isaiah and the psalm describe a world where justice will flourish. All violence and war will cease, and peace will have dominion over all the earth. What a wonderful picture! This week, pray for the peace of Christ to infuse the hearts of rulers, homes, and institutions. You might also consider making a Jesse Tree with your children and discussing the First Reading. *Today's Readings:* Isaiah 11:1–10; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 12–13, 17; Luke 10:21–24.

Wednesday, December 2, 2015 Abundance

Like the Gospel, the First Reading depicts a scene of God's abundance and care for us. Jesus saves us from sin and death so that we can share at the eternal feast. In the Gospel, Jesus cures those brought to him, then broke bread with them, so that they would not go hungry. This act is a sign of God's love, and of the abundance we will share on that final day as followers of Christ. This week, share a feast with someone and give thanks for God's mercy. *Today's Readings:* Isaiah 25:6–10a; Psalm 23:1–3a, 3b–4, 5, 6; Matthew 15:29–37.

Thursday, December 3, 2015 Memorial of St. Francis Xavier, Priest

The three readings proclaimed today highlight that the just will enter the Kingdom of Heaven. In this season, we are asked to ready ourselves and evaluate where our heart is. Is it ready to receive Christ? Do you listen to God's word, and are you moved to act with kindness? Jesus says that those who listen and follow his ways will be like a house built on rock. Because of their steady faith, these people will rejoice as they enter the kingdom. Choose a verse or two of Psalm 118 and sit quietly with it and allow it to penetrate you. *Today's Readings:* Isaiah 26:1–6; Psalm 118:1 and 8–9, 19–21, 25–27a; Matthew 7:21, 24–27.

Friday, December 4, 2015 Light and Healing

I love the refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm, "The Lord is my light and my salvation." Like the blind men in the Gospel, Jesus, the Light, heals and guides us. In faith, we firmly follow Christ, and by sharing in his life, we are saved from our blindness. As you pray today, ask God to heal your blindness so you can see the light of his glory and stand in awe of God's might. Consider using the psalm response as a mantra for your prayer throughout the day. *Today's Readings:* Isaiah 29:17–24; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; Matthew 9:27–31.

Saturday, December 5, 2015 Discipleship

In today's Gospel, Jesus, who has been teaching and curing disease, commissions the twelve disciples to go forth and minister to the lost sheep of Israel. He instructs them to announce that the Reign of God is at hand. You too are a disciple of Christ. We are partners in ministry with Jesus. In what ways are you announcing the Reign of God and gathering the lost sheep? *Today's Readings:* Isaiah 30:19–21, 23–26; Psalm 147:1–2, 3–4, 5–6; Matthew 9:35–10:1, 5a, 6–8.


