



# SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER



## A Sense of Peace

God of peace and source of all life,  
we praise you for the gift of new life we  
received in Baptism.  
Like the disciples,  
we too hide from our call to evangelize.  
Grant us, who are filled with fear and doubt,  
a renewed sense of hope and peace.  
In Baptism, you claimed us,  
so help us to hear your voice,  
which calls us from our isolation.  
May the Holy Spirit inspire us to share  
the Good News  
and fill us with the joy of your Risen Son.  
Implant within our hearts  
a deep sense of courage and keen  
sense of faith  
so that until the end of time your chosen  
people will praise your name  
and rejoice in the presence of Christ.  
Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Sunday, April 3, 2016 Peace of Christ

*Today's Readings: Acts 5:12–16; Psalm 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; Revelation 1:9–11a, 12–13, 17–19; John 20:19–31.*  
Two words from the Gospel that stand out are *peace* and *fear*. Imagine what it must have been like for Jesus' followers after his Death and Resurrection. Filled with fear, they locked themselves in a room. Think of a time when you've been so afraid that you needed to hide yourself or your ideas. Consider those who suffer physical or mental abuse, those who are persecuted for their religious convictions, or those who fear speaking truth when faced with death. Feeling afraid can entrap and confuse us.

In Death, Jesus triumphs over sin and death and unlocks the doors to new life. He ushers in a peace that surpasses all understanding, a peace that helps us endure suffering, a

peace that empowers us to forgive, and a peace that demands justice. Think about the past few days. What in your life has been unlocked because of Christ's Death and Resurrection? What still needs to be unlocked and consumed by the peace of Christ? Filled with the Holy Spirit, Christ sends us to be his presence in the world, a presence that speaks peace in the midst of violence, war, and much more. We must say "Peace be with you" to all we encounter so as to restore relationships and help others know the amazing gift of the Resurrection. How does your faith community or family live peace? Consider how you might share the gift of Christ's peace this week at a homeless shelter, a nursing home, or a shelter for survivors of abuse.



## THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, April 4, 2016

### Solemnity of the Annunciation

Today's Psalm refrain, "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will," challenges us to reflect on when we have opened ourselves to the power of the Holy Spirit. Like Mary who said yes and was completely vulnerable before God, we too are asked to completely give of ourselves and bear witness to Christ. As you reflect on the Gospel, think of when you have said no or been too afraid to respond to God's invitation to love and preach the Good News. Take a moment today to pray the Rosary or sing the Hail Mary. *Today's Readings: Isaiah 7:10–14; 8:10; Psalm 40:7–8a, 8b–9, 10, 11; Hebrews 10:4–10; Luke 1:26–38.*

Tuesday, April 5, 2016

### Community

Today's passage from Acts paints an ideal picture of community life in the early Church. Reading this gives me hope and a desire to strive for a more profound experience of community life. The tenets presented here are important. How can we live these ideals in our families, in our parishes, and in the Church? It's not easy to be of one heart and mind. Is there a food pantry to which you can bring nonperishable items or a shelter to which you can bring children's books? *Today's Readings: Acts 4:32–37; Psalm 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; John 3:7b–15.*

Wednesday, April 6, 2016

### God's Love

It is truly amazing to think about how much God loves us. Jesus came to show us God's mercy and love. Through his Paschal Mystery we are saved. Once we were a people of darkness, but in Baptism, we were united to Christ and imbued with the Holy Spirit. Like the Apostles, we must boldly share the Gospel, no matter the risk. Find a quiet place to contemplate God's love for you. If you feel restless, breathe deeply and let God know you are waiting and ready to be

loved. *Today's Readings: Acts 5:17–26; Psalm 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; John 3:16–21.*

Thursday, April 7, 2016

### St. John Baptist de la Salle

As members of the Body of Christ, it is our responsibility to care for the poor and marginalized. The Gospel is not vague. It challenges us to take up our cross and do as Christ did and respond to the cry of the poor. Like St. John Baptist de la Salle, let us bless the Lord's name and seek to do work with the poor and marginalized. *Today's Readings: Acts 5:27–33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17–18, 19–20; John 3:31–36.*

Friday, April 8, 2016

### Thanks

Chapter 6 of John's Gospel illuminates for us Jesus, the Bread of Life. In today's passage, Jesus feeds five thousand. Unlike Matthew, Mark, and Luke, John's account has Jesus giving thanks. Jesus is the source of all nourishment; every time we gather at Mass, we celebrate this amazing gift and receive the Bread of Life and Cup of Salvation. At the evening meal, invite everyone to offer thanks for the gifts of the day or week. *Today's Readings: Acts 5:34–42; Psalm 27:1, 4, 13–14; John 6:1–15.*

Saturday, April 9, 2016

### Neglected


The First Reading begins with an argument between the Hellenists, those who spoke Greek, and the Hebrews, because the Hellenists' widows were being neglected. Seven men were chosen to assist with the ministry, and traditionally, this is the start of the diaconate. What we know is that the Church was growing and there was a need to reach out to everyone, Greek and non-Greek. This also would allow the Good News to spread more widely. Could your family make dinner for residents at a shelter and dine with them? Try to draw the residents of the shelter out and listen to their stories. *Today's Readings: Acts 6:1–7; Psalm 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; John 6:16–21.*


La Paz de Cristo

*Lecturas del día: Hechos 5:12–16; Salmo 118:2–4, 13–15, 22–24; Apocalipsis 1:9–11a, 12–13, 17–19; Juan 20:19–31.*  
Dos palabras que sobresalen en el evangelio son *paz* y *miedo*. Imagine cómo estaban los discípulos después de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús: llenos de miedo y encerrados. ¿En algún momento, por miedo, usted tuvo que esconderse, o silenciar sus ideas? Piense en las víctimas de abuso físico o mental, en los perseguidos por sus convicciones políticas o religiosas, y en los que silencian la verdad por miedo a la muerte. El miedo atrapa y puede confundirnos.

En la muerte, Jesús triunfa sobre el pecado y la muerte misma, y abre las puertas a una nueva vida. Él detona una paz que sobrepasa toda comprensión; paz que nos ayuda a soportar el sufrimiento, paz que nos fortalece para perdonar,

paz que demanda justicia. Medite en los días recién pasados. ¿Percibe usted que la muerte y resurrección de Cristo ha roto algún cerrojo en su propia vida? ¿Hay algún aspecto de su persona que necesite la paz del Resucitado?

Llenos del Espíritu Santo, Cristo nos envía para ser su presencia en el mundo; presencia que encarna la paz en medio de la violencia, de la guerra y la enemistad. A cuantos encontrremos a nuestro paso, debemos decir: “La paz esté contigo”, para restaurar una relación lastimada y para experimentar el don maravilloso de la resurrección. ¿Cómo se hace presente la paz en su comunidad de fe y en su familia? Piense en cómo compartir el don de la paz de Cristo esta semana, en algún asilo o albergue para indigentes, o en algún refugio para víctimas de violencia doméstica.

Lunes, 4 de abril de 2016

### Solemnidad de la Anunciación

El refrán del salmo, “Aquí estoy, Señor, para hacer tu voluntad” nos desafía a reflexionar en las ocasiones de nuestra vida cuando nos hemos abierto al poder del Espíritu Santo. Como a María, quien dijo sí y fue vulnerable completamente a Dios, se nos pide darnos completamente y dar testimonio de Cristo. Al pensar en el evangelio, considere en las ocasiones en las que ha dicho no, o cuando ha tenido miedo de responder a la invitación de Dios para amar y anunciar la Buena Nueva. Dese un momento para rezar el Rosario o cantar el Ave María. *Lecturas del día: Isaías 7:10–14; 8:10; Salmo 40:7–8a, 8b–9, 10, 11; Hebreos 10:4–10; Lucas 1:26–38.*

Martes, 5 de abril de 2016

### Comunidad

Hechos hace un retrato idealizado de la vida comunitaria de la primera Iglesia. Leerlo me siembra esperanza y deseos de una experiencia más profunda de comunidad. Los principios retratados son fundamentales. ¿Cómo podemos hacer realidad en nuestras familias, parroquias y en la Iglesia entera esos principios? No es fácil tener un solo corazón y una sola mente. ¿Tiene la parroquia reparto de comida al que usted pueda colaborar con artículos no perecederos? ¿Puede usted llevar algunos libros a los niños de algún orfelinato o refugio? *Lecturas del día: Hechos 4:32–37; Salmo 93:1ab, 1cd–2, 5; Juan 3:7b–15.*

Miércoles, 6 de abril de 2016

### El amor de Dios

Jesús vino para mostrarnos la misericordia y el amor de Dios. Nos ha salvado por su misterio pascual. Estuvimos en la oscuridad, pero por el Bautismo, fuimos incorporados a Cristo e imbuidos del Espíritu Santo. Igual que los apóstoles, compartimos el Evangelio, sin detenernos en los riesgos. Busque un lugar de quietud para contemplar cómo Dios lo ama a usted. Si

se siente inquieto, respire profundamente y hable con Dios que siempre lo espera con amor. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 5:17–26; Salmo 34:2–3, 4–5, 6–7, 8–9; Juan 3:16–21.*

Jueves, 7 de abril de 2016

### San Juan Bautista de la Salle

El evangelio es preciso. Nos pide a asumir nuestra cruz y a hacer como Cristo: reaccionar al clamor del pobre. Como san Juan Bautista de la Salle, bendigamos el nombre del Señor y trabajemos para favorecer a los pobres y marginados de nuestra sociedad. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 5:27–33; Salmo 34:2 y 9, 17–18, 19–20; Juan 3:31–36.*

Viernes, abril 8 de 2016

### Gracias

Todo el capítulo sexto del Evangelio según san Juan trata del Pan de Vida. En el pasaje de hoy, Jesús alimenta a cinco mil. San Juan describe a Jesús dando gracias. Jesús es la fuente de todo alimento; cada vez que nos reunimos para la misa, celebramos este maravilloso don y recibimos el Pan de Vida y la Copa de la Salvación. En la comida de hoy, invite a que cada uno dé gracias por los dones del día o de la semana. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 5:34–42; Salmo 27:1, 4, 13–14; Juan 6:1–15.*

Sábado, 9 de abril de 2016

### Relegados

La primera lectura inicia con una disputa entre los cristianos de origen griego, los helenistas y los de origen palestino, los hebreos, porque las viudas de los primeros estaban siendo relegadas. Como solución, se escogieron siete varones que atendieran a las relegadas, en lo que comúnmente se asume como el inicio del diaconado. Sabemos que la Iglesia crecía y necesitaba apoyar a todos sus miembros, sin importar de dónde vinieran. Esto ayudaba a que la Buena Nueva se propagara más fácil y rápidamente. Piense usted si su familia podría cocinar para los residentes de algún asilo o albergue y compartir la comida con ellos. Quizá puedan sacarlos a pasear y escuchar sus historias. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 6:1–7; Salmo 33:1–2, 4–5, 18–19; Juan 6:16–21.*


