

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


Sunday, May 8, 2016
You Will Receive Power



Today's Readings: *Acts 1:1-11; Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9; Ephesians 1:17-23 or Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23; Luke 24:46-53.* Traditionally celebrated forty days after Easter, this feast has been transferred to Sunday in many dioceses so that more people have access to celebrate the mystery of the Ascension. It celebrates the exaltation of Christ, when he takes his place at the right hand of God. Since the Resurrection, the disciples have encountered Christ several times. Jesus continued to prepare them to carry out the mission. Today, we hear him commission his disciples (including us) to go out to the ends of the earth proclaiming salvation. This is a powerful image and message.

As members of the Body of Christ, we have been gifted

with the power from on high, the Holy Spirit, in order to preach the Gospel to all peoples. Though not all of us are called to ordained ministry, or even to be missionaries who travel to other countries, we are called to make known throughout the world all the things that Christ taught and promised. The Church, Christ's Body, becomes a sacrament of his presence for the entire world. Our common life proclaims this Good News. We, the baptized, make up the Body of Christ, a sign to witness, to the ends of the earth, the magnificent love and mercy of our God. Let us continue to shout "alleluia" and praise God for his marvelous deeds. Consider gathering a group from your parish to strategize new ways of evangelizing the community and your neighborhood.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 9, 2016 Take Courage

Even though the disciples have affirmed their faith in Jesus, he reminds them that the hour is coming when they will abandon him. Have you ever renounced Jesus because of fear or embarrassment? As disciples, we can trust that Christ will give us peace, no matter the mission. Spend some time examining the moments when you need courage. *Today's Readings: Acts 19:1–8; Psalm 68:2–3ab, 4–5acd, 6–7ab; John 16:29–33.*

Tuesday, May 10, 2016 Eternal Life

Jesus has glorified the Father in all the works he has performed. Jesus has revealed God, and those who have come to Jesus have come to know God. God's true nature will be manifest in Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross. Those who live in Christ intimately know God and will have eternal life. Do you recognize the divine presence? How do you reveal God's love? Take a moment to journal today about your life in Christ. *Today's Readings: Acts 20:17–27; Psalm 68:10–11, 20–21; John 17:1–11a.*

Wednesday, May 11, 2016 Protection

The Gospel continues the story from yesterday. Directly addressing his Father, Jesus asks that those who have come to believe in him will be protected from the evil one. In Baptism, we have been united to God through Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit. We are no longer of this world, but pilgrims united to the Trinity. We still know the struggles of this world and yet we trust in the power of God's love and continue to proclaim the Good News. Today, pray for those who do not know Christ. *Today's Readings: Acts 20:28–38; Psalm 68:29–30, 33–35a, 35bc–36ab; John 17:11b–19.*

Thursday, May 12, 2016

Belief

Jesus' prayer, which was begun yesterday, continues in today's Gospel. In this section, Jesus prays for those who will be future disciples. The Church must be a community of love for the mission to be effective; that is, so that the world come to believe wholly in Christ and be united to him. The Church is the sacrament of this love, the Body of Christ that proclaims salvation. The intention today is for the Church, may she be a beacon of God's love and sign of unity. *Today's Readings: Acts 22:30; 26:6–11; Psalm 16:1–2a and 5, 7–8, 9–10, 11; John 17:20–26.*

Friday, May 13, 2016 Profession of Faith

At the time of Jesus' arrest, Peter denied Jesus three times. In this post-Resurrection scene, Jesus offers Peter an opportunity to profess publicly his love for him as a sign of reconciliation. It is clear that Peter loves Jesus and is willing to care for the flock. But like Jesus, all shepherds have to make sacrifices. Peter's love of Christ leads him to death, a death that professes that living in God's love results in eternal life. As you meditate on today's Gospel, consider these questions: How do I profess my faith in Christ? How do I feed the flock of the Lord? *Today's Readings: Acts 25:13b–21; Psalm 103:1–2, 11–12, 19–20ab; John 21:15–19.*


Saturday, May 14, 2016

Like St. Matthias, we have a chance to respond to this invitation and live out our baptismal call. At the end of the Easter season, consider the joy and love with which God surrounds you. How will you be a herald of this Good News? *Today's Readings: Acts 1:15–17, 20–26; Psalm 113:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 7–8; John 15:9–17.*

Domingo, 8 de mayo de 2016 Recibirán la Fuerza

Lecturas del día: Hechos 1:1–11; Salmo 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Efesios 1:17–23, o bien Hebreos 9:24–28; 10:19–23; Lucas 24:46–53. Esta fiesta suele celebrarse a los cuarenta días después de la Pascua, pero en muchas diócesis se transfiere al domingo siguiente, para que más personas puedan celebrar el misterio de la Ascensión, es decir, la exaltación de Cristo, cuando asume su lugar a la derecha de Dios. Después de la resurrección, los discípulos se encontraron con Cristo varias veces. Él los fue preparando para que realizaran la misión. Hoy lo escuchamos comisionándolos (también a nosotros) para ir hasta los confines de la tierra a proclamar la salvación. Esto es muy importante.

Por ser miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo, hemos recibido

la fuerza de lo alto, el Espíritu Santo, para llevar el Evangelio a todas las personas. Aunque no todos estamos llamados al ministerio ordenado, o a ser misioneros en tierras lejanas, sí que lo estamos a proclamar lo que Cristo ha enseñado y prometido.

La Iglesia, Cuerpo de Cristo, es sacramento de su presencia para todo el mundo. Nuestra vida comunitaria proclama esta Buena Nueva. Todos los bautizados formamos el Cuerpo de Cristo, y somos testimonio del magnánimo amor y misericordia de nuestro Dios. Sigamos proclamando “*Aleluya!*” y alabemos a Dios por sus hazañas maravillosas. Piense usted en reunir a un grupo de su parroquia para diseñar una estrategia para evangelizar a su comunidad y al vecindario.

La oración de Jesús, iniciada ayer, continúa este día. En esta sección, Jesús ora por cuantos serán sus discípulos en el

La Iglesia es el sacramento de este amor, el Cuerpo de Cristo que proclama la salvación. 
PRAYER FOR THE YEAR OF MERCY
